The debut of innovative new products and loads of software for your Apple highlighted the 1985 Winter CES.

THE COMPUTER'S NEW CLOTHES

As a confirmed gadget freak, I was in heaven at the Winter Consumer Electronics Show (CES) in Las Vegas in January. This event showcases all the new electronic devices that are designed to thrill your senses and drain your pocketbook. Products exhibited at the CES run the gamut from televisions to videocassette recorders to computers. It was interesting this year to see trends in the personal-computer industry reflected in the new consumer electronic products.

One of the most spectacular examples of this crossover technology, the new digital televisions offer windowing capabilities that let you bring up windows of any size to view another channel. You can also enlarge part of the same program you are watching. Speaking as a football widow, I know how much football fans will love being able to watch two games at once on the same screen!

Typewriters have taken on new dimensions, too. Now you can get Macintosh-looking type fonts out of electronic typewriters. Even though it would have taken days to print anything longer than a sentence, the concept was captivating and an indication of what we can expect to see in the near future.

Computers were the real stars of the show, however, in spite of these attractions and a few others—such as cellular phones, flat-screen and stereo TVs, portable VCRs, 8mm videotape technology, and satellite dishes. The main attractions were Atari's new Macintosh look-alikes—the 130ST (128K RAM) and the 520ST (512K RAM)—dubbed the Jackintosh, and the numerous MSX machines from

Japan. MSX is an operating system for 8-bit computers that Microsoft developed, and many Japanese companies are adopting MSX as a standard operating system. I doubt that MSX machines will make a significant impact on the American marketplace. Based on 8-bit technology, MSX seems to be too little too late. We will, however, undoubtedly soon see television sets with MSX computers built into them, such as those Sony was demonstrating for interested show-goers.

A particularly large crop of educational software for the Apple family of computers was announced at CES. A noticeable trend showed that product pricing seems to be dropping below the \$25 level. Spinnaker Software's new line of products, published under the Fisher-Price label, was one example.

One of the more interesting product announcements described The Newsroom, from Springboard. The Newsroom lets you design, produce, and print your own mininewspaper, using an Apple II.

Space Tablet, a three-dimensional-input device, was the most innovative product I saw. Users just point the ultrasonic pointer at the screen and either click on the menu, draw a picture, or use it to play a game. It works with the Apple II series and all software that supports game paddles or joysticks, and it can operate within a six-foot area in front of the computer display. Space Tablet is the first product from a new company called Soniture, Inc., owned in part by one of the industry's pioneers, Paul Terrell.

"Pipeline" contains more information on the products I've mentioned and others that were announced at CES this year. +

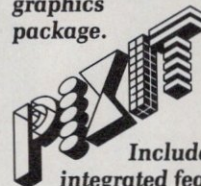

Steve Rosenthal's article on CAD systems for the Apple was excellent, but one CAD system was not included in the review because of its newness to the market.

The program is called CADDRAW and is published by Kitchen Sink Software. Since its release in September 1984, several hundred copies have been sold to school systems across the country to introduce students to CAD.

CADDRAW has the following features:

- Works on the Apple II Plus, IIe, or IIc
- Operates cursor from keyboard only or uses joystick, paddles, or mouse
- Includes line plotting at any angle
- Has shape tables, including architecture, electronics, plumbing, landscape, etc.
- Rotates shapes, lines, and text in four directions
- Automatically centers 2-D or 3-D drawings on any of four title blocks and borders

► CAD/CAM/CAE OMISSIONS

Dear A+,

We have just noticed the chart on CAD/CAM/CAE products by Huardo and Carman in the December 1984 issue of A+. We were disappointed that no mention of our products was made in this chart.

NLLSQ (Nonlinear Least Squares) is a data-analysis program that lets you perform both nonlinear- and linear-regression analysis of your data with your choice of model.

SEQS (Simultaneous Equation Solver) solves algebraic equations—it can solve a single linear, nonlinear, transcendental, or mixed equation for any real variable, or a family of simultaneous equations including up to 20 equations and 20 variables.

French Curve (Cubic Spline Smoothing) employs a running cubic spline to smooth tabular data containing up to 600 pairs of x, y values.

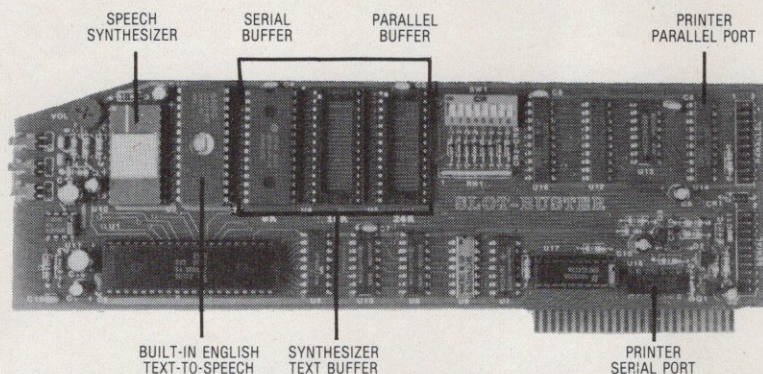

► CORRECTIONS

AppleWorks

Our review of three integrated-software packages, "Trying Out Integrated Software" (January 1985, pages 80-87) contained several inaccuracies. The following information should clear up any confusion:

1. AppleWorks works on the Apple IIe with 64K RAM or 128K RAM, but its capabilities are very limited with only 64K RAM.
2. To shortcut through the printer options when you want to boldface text, use the special command Control-B, as suggested on page 167 of the *AppleWorks Reference Manual*.
3. AppleWorks' Spreadsheet module has a function that changes the width of individual columns (page 214 of the *AppleWorks Reference Manual*).
4. The spreadsheet does not subdivide the text of long labels into multiple cells. What really happens is that when you enter a long label, the program automatically moves the cursor to the adjacent cell.

MacWrite Versions

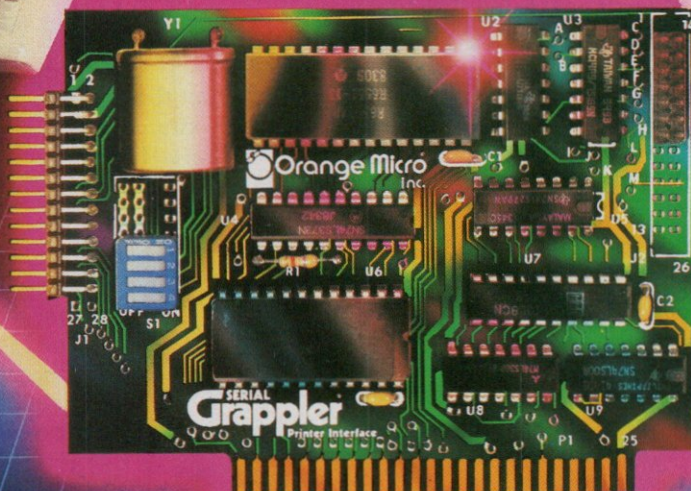

The final release will probably have a version number higher than 3.3. When you go to your dealer to upgrade your MacWrite disk, simply ask for the disk-based version.

► A SHOW FOR SHAREHOLDERS

Apple Computer's 1985 shareholders' meeting on January 23 had the usual Apple PR flair. John Sculley, president and CEO, and Apple cofounder Steve Jobs officially introduced the Macintosh Office strategy that we featured in last month's *A+*. Jobs and Sculley gave a lighthearted demonstration of the AppleTalk network and the LaserWriter, complete with science-fiction-style special effects.

Sculley gave a retrospective of 1984 and took a look into the future as well. As for 1984, Sculley said,



"... 1984 was a year of triumph for our company. It was a year when Apple reclaimed its role as the industry innovator. It was the year when Apple changed forever the ground rules for marketing in an entire industry. And it was the year when Apple established itself as the unquestioned challenger to IBM."

As for the future, Sculley said, "Nineteen eighty-five will be the year of

implementation. We want to strengthen our partnership with our dealers and begin the transition from just a few computers in grades K through 12 to the computerized classroom of the future [where] Apple IIs will be networked together.

"Nineteen eighty-six will be a year for new products [that] will continue to build on the product-line strategy that we implemented in 1984. With optical-disk-storage technology becoming available, we believe home learning will truly become interactive by the end of 1986.

"Nineteen eighty-seven, we believe, will be the beginning of the next boom years in the personal-computer industry. By that time, Apple will have all of the products, sales, and distribution infrastructure in place, and we will be extremely well positioned to be a powerful leader through the last years of the decade."

► ADAM BOMB

Coleco's Adam computer is the latest victim in the home-computer shakeout. When the Adam was first introduced, it received a lot of media attention because the entire system, including a letter-quality printer, was to retail for less than \$700.

The cabbage-patch computer never met Coleco's expectations, however. The remaining inventory of Adams was sold to Montgomery Ward, which is selling the systems for as low as \$300 each.



► DETENTE WITH IBM

Steve Jobs says that the Macintosh Office strategy calls for detente with IBM. According to Jobs, that is why Apple has planned for the use of IBM PCs and Macintoshes in the same work group. It also explains Apple's bold entry into the IBM PC peripheral market with the LaserWriter and a special AppleTalk board, both targeted at the IBM PC aftermarket.

But the battle still goes on, and Apple is making remarkable headway in some respects. According to a recent *Advertising Age* "Ad Watch" survey, 37.5% of the people surveyed thought of Apple first when they thought of personal computers; only 13.7% thought of IBM first.

► LISA NOW MAC XL

Apple Computer has renamed the Lisa. The Lisa 2/10 is now the Macintosh XL (the XL stands for either *extra large* or *ex-Lisa*, depending on whom you talk to). To avoid competition with the 512K Mac, the Lisa 2 and Lisa 2/5 are

being phased out.

According to Apple, many people have been asking when there would be an expandable Macintosh with more memory, a larger screen, and a built-in hard-disk drive. Apple already had such a machine, the Lisa 2/10, which has a ten-megabyte built-in hard disk and is expandable to two megabytes of RAM with a newly introduced memory-expansion unit from AST Research. Apple says it will offer a smooth migration path for current Lisa owners that will transfer files from Lisa 7/7 software to Macintosh software such as MacWrite, MacProject, MacDraw, and Jazz.

► FIRST-CLASS BARGAIN

You may have noticed the splashy ads in *A+* recently for a ten-megabyte hard disk for the Apple II called the Sider that costs a mere \$695. Quite a bargain, considering that Apple's ten-megabyte ProFile hard disk retails for around \$2000. The Sider is being offered only by mail order from a new company called First Class Peripherals, which is a division of Xebec, one of

the best-known hard-disk-drive manufacturers.

First Class Peripherals president C.B. Teegardin (who is also a vice president of Xebec) says he wants to make First Class Peripherals the L.L. Bean of computer peripherals by offering quality products at discount prices. The Sider is the first of several peripherals First Class Peripherals will offer this year.

Teegardin says the Sider can be offered at such a low price because the product is sold directly from the manufacturer to consumers without a lot of middlemen. Watch for an in-depth review of the Sider by our contributing editor Chris Albertson in an upcoming issue of *A+*.

► MACNOSY

Ever wonder what makes your Macintosh tick? Do you like delving into the inner secrets of Macintosh programs? If so, then you will find MacNosy to be an invaluable tool. MacNosy is a disassembler for the Macintosh that lets you sniff around inside Mac software.

The MacNosy disassembler was written by

Steve Jasik, a programming whiz with more than 17 years of experience writing compilers and other complex software tools. The program is designed for developers and other advanced Mac programmers and is quite powerful. MacNosy is definitely not for casual Mac users. MacNosy is available for \$70 from Free the Rom 64, 343 Trenton Way, Menlo Park, CA 94025.

► EXPANDABLE MAC

Several developers are working on ways to expand the Macintosh beyond its current configuration. One of the most interesting projects is that of Turbo Technologies of Glen Head, New York, which is planning to manufacture a one-megabyte RAM-expansion board that is wired directly to the 68000 CPU. The company says it will honor existing Apple warranties and will provide its own 90-day warranty and optional one-year service contract.

The modification also provides access to the 68000 bus structure and permits the connection of an expansion box that fits underneath the Mac and contains peripheral slots for add-on cards. Some of the add-on cards now under consideration are a card with up to four megabytes of additional RAM; coprocessor cards; a speedup card; and a color-monitor card. ► EYETYPER

EyeTyper is a special camera-equipped keyboard that can be controlled with eye movements. Developed by research engineers at Carnegie-Mellon University, this device allows physically handicapped people to use computers almost as easily

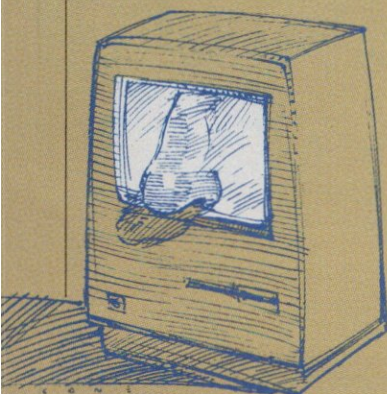

ently came from technology writer John Markoff, who showed Herzfeld a similar IBM PC program called Memory/Shift and inspired Herzfeld to create such a program for the Mac. According to the rumor, Apple was so anxious to announce Switcher at Apple's January stockholders' meeting that it offered Herzfeld \$100,000 if the program was ready by the meeting. Although Steve Jobs gave a brief Switcher demo at the meeting, Herzfeld apparently didn't quite meet the deadline. I'm sure Herzfeld will be well rewarded for his efforts, however. Watch for Switcher to appear soon.

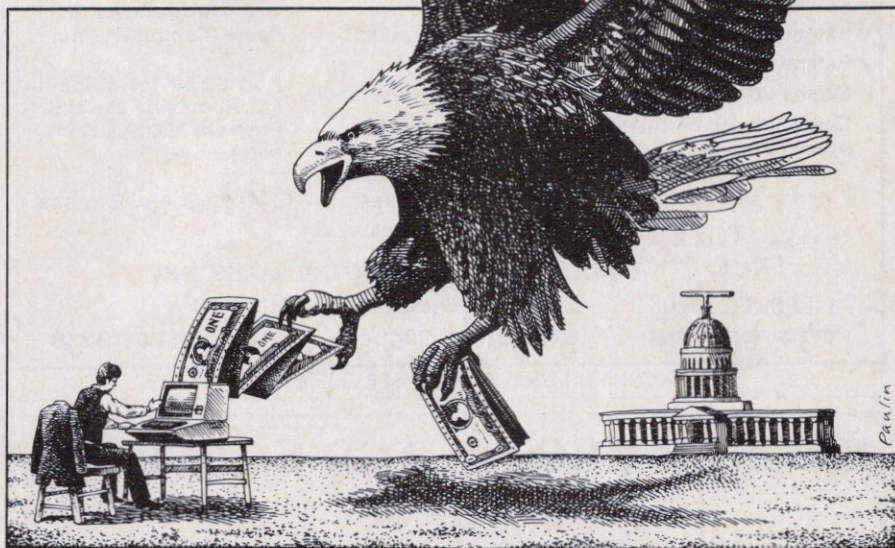
MAKING APRIL LESS TAXING

You definitely need a personal computer on *your* side when you compute your taxes—after all, the tax people have an unlimited supply of giant mainframes on theirs. Whether or not it's too late to do anything about this year's return, you may want to start thinking about how you can use your Apple to make annual tax accounting less painful.

A computer won't reduce the tax rates; insure your money is well spent; create new loopholes; or tell you what is moral, safe, or legal. What it will do is take care of the onerous arithmetic and clerical chores, letting you get your work done faster and more easily. If your financial situation is flexible enough to permit choices, computerizing your taxes may also give you the help you need to make choices and institute a deliberate tax strategy.

Widespread use of personal computers, moreover, may change the operation of the tax and financial system over the next decade. A system now designed for humans and mainframes will be visibly altered when microcomputers become as ubiquitous as toaster ovens. Already, the main Internal Revenue Service 1040EZ form is designed to be read by machine. In a few years, you may be able to select a 1040 Floppy as well.

You can find scores of programs that will help you use your Apple in your task. Along with tax-preparation programs, you may have occasion to use accounting, database, spreadsheet, graphing, calendar, and simulation programs. Tax record keeping, planning, and payment are so intertwined with every form of economic activity that you should view any program to help you make, spend, or keep track of mon-



ey as part of your overall tax effort.

In fact, the biggest chore in the whole tax process is not the tax preparation; it's the accounting. Before you can even think about filling out your tax forms, you have to have ready a whole string of figures for your income, expenses, deductions, and credits. In general, the tax code doesn't state the exact form your books should take, but it does require that they be complete and accurate enough to determine your true tax liability.

In the IRS's view, a computerized accounting system—or, as the IRS calls it, an automatic data-processing (ADP) system—must have a means to

print out your overall accounts system, as well as all the subsidiary accounts and transactions. It must allow the tracing of any particular transaction from its initial entry into the books through any subtotals and totals and, conversely, to find what elements went into any composite figure (an "audit trail"). You must have available "a complete description of the ACP part of the accounting system," as well.

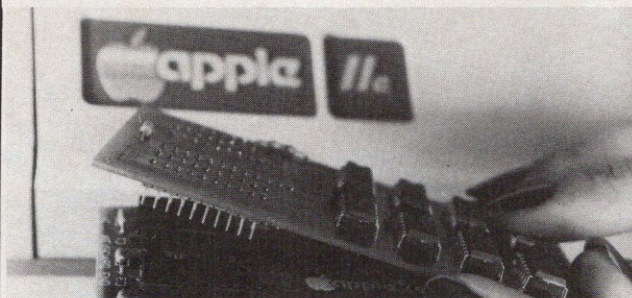
If you use a commercial accounting system such as Back to Basics or Home Accountant, it should meet all of these requirements (providing, of course, that you accurately enter all your transactions). If you write your own program, be sure to include the audit-trail capability and to document in detail the way your program works.

If your financial transactions are simple, you may not even need a complete accounting package. A database program that has arithmetic summation capability can take care of most smaller part-time businesses if you

have only simple expense and income entries. You'll need some kind of sorting and selection capability, because the tax forms want to know both your total expenses and the outlays broken down by category. If your only income is a salary, you won't need a computer to keep your books (although your employer probably uses a computer to process your paycheck and compute your W-2 forms).

If you have an Apple and a business, chances are you're going to deduct the machine, at least in part, as a business expense (or in accounting terms, expense it or depreciate it and thereby reduce your profit). Remember that the IRS can require you to show that you had a reasonable expectation of actually making a profit with your business, a test you are presumed to meet if you report taxable income from at least two of five years of operation. Furthermore, new rules for deducting the cost of machines used partially for work and partially for play require that you keep a

running log of the time spent on each application, with a minimum of 50% for business.

The Best-Laid Plans

Although Congress, in its wisdom, can change the tax laws at any point and is threatening a major shakeup this year, we know the operative tax at least for the current year and for the past. You don't have to wait until the following April to figure out what certain transactions will do to your taxes.

On the average, if you're someone with a lot of economic choices, you can use a tax-planning program (until, of course, you get into the echelon that has a tax-planning staff). These planning programs let you examine the tax effects of some of the more common types of economic transactions. For example, Personal Tax Planner (from Aardvark/McGraw-Hill) takes into account 46 different transaction classes and projects your tax forward for up to five years. If you sold your house, for example, what would be the tax consequences?

Most of these planning programs are, in reality, specialized spreadsheets, answering the same kind of "what if" questions that you might try out with VisiCalc or Multiplan. If you already

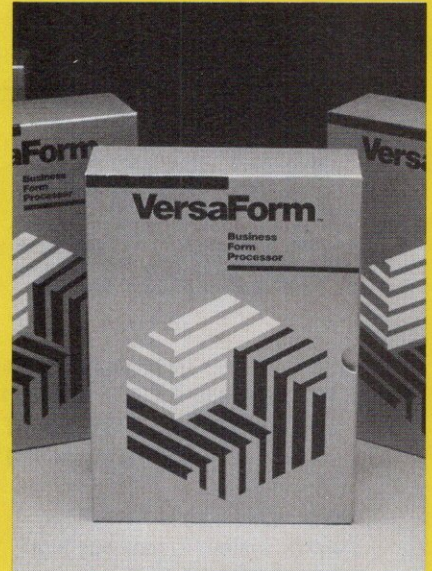

have a spreadsheet, you may be able to find a template set that does the kind of financial planning you need right on your existing software.

Many tax packages also provide some kind of planning capability. These include The Tax Manager program Ken Landis discussed in his three-part tax series in *A+* this past December through February, and TaxWizard for the Macintosh, one of the programs I tried out in preparing this column.

You might also want to use the graphing features of a spreadsheet or

accompanying charting package to help you in your decision making. Unless you're a practiced accountant, it's often hard to spot trends and patterns in long columns of figures. If you're considering a large number of alternatives, a computer's ability to draw you a picture may make grasping the information much easier.

From Summaries to Liabilities

No matter how you slice your income, at least once a year you do have to give the tax people their bite. At the higher income levels, or if you're self-

employed, you may even have to do your computations quarterly!

The first step is to make sure your accounting is all squared away. The IRS frowns on any last-minute adjustments, but it is hard to get every single bookkeeping transaction right the first time. You may have to spend some time getting your books to balance and to match figures in the external world (such as your checking balance or credit-card statements).

Once you have some numbers from your accounting system, you're ready to turn to the taxes. Ideally, your accounting and tax programs would be so well integrated that you could instruct the system to follow the accounting totals with your complete tax return, but in practice it's not as easy as simply reprocessing the same numbers. Nevertheless, a few firms that market both accounting and tax software (such as Continental Software with The Home Accountant and The Tax Advantage) do include a feature that lets you transfer your accounting records straight into your tax data.

The best tax programs, for the Apple and for any other personal computer, are interactive. Although your figures should not mysteriously change to fit the circumstances, at tax time you still have a large number of what tax people call "elections." You can, for example, choose to take an investment tax

credit for most equipment added for business use, but doing so reduces the allowable depreciation (the amount set aside to compensate for the equipment's wearing out). Certain added equipment can be expensed (deducted in a single year) or depreciated (deducted in parts over a series of years).

At least for this year, the tax code is still Byzantine in complexity, with a corresponding multitude of possible forms needed to cover all the variations. Tax programs for the Apple II family or Macintosh generally cover between half a dozen and two dozen different forms, but if you're deeply involved with international banking, oil production, liquor sales, or the dozens of industries with special tax-code provisions, you might have to grab a pencil or call in a service, nonetheless.

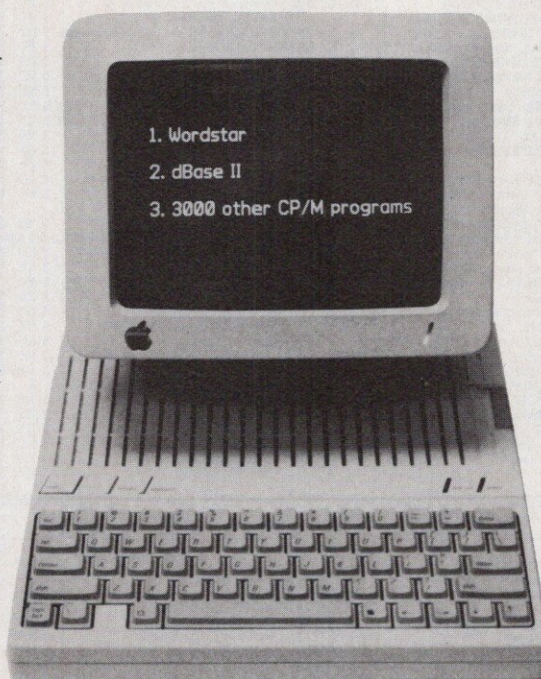

For example, TaxWizard (Gamma Productions) for the Mac can fill out the following forms: 1040, 1040A, 1040EZ (including Schedules 1, A, B, C, E, G, W, & SE), 2106, 2119, 2441, 3903, 3468, 4137, 4255, 4562, 5695, and 6251. It's a nice program, with full use of the Macintosh visual interface. If you need a 4835 (farm-rental income and expenses) or 4684 (casualties and thefts), you're out of luck, though.

Nor will any of the full-fledged programs I looked at for the Apple do your state returns. Because the cost of keeping up with 50 mercurial state legislatures is too high for most firms, the state-tax-program business is largely claimed by local companies that primarily sell templates for spreadsheet programs. Fortunately, most state returns are much simpler to do, because they're usually based on the figures you enter on the federal forms.

Some programs come in an individual-user model and a more complete "tax preparer" version. If you have a complex tax situation but still want to do your own return, you may sometimes find support for the forms you need in these more sophisticated packages. Soft-tax (Design Trends Ltd.), for example, contains ten more forms in the preparer version than in the standard package.

EZ Is in the Eyes of the Beholder

If you're in the market for a tax program, either for a last-minute finish for last year's returns or an early start on the coming year, let me point out two features I found particularly useful on some of the programs that I looked at. Look for a tax program that lets you put in data in the order you choose but prints out the data in the sequence the IRS sets.

Because tax preparation is still largely a paper-based industry, the tax forms' layouts assume that you'll work your way down the form 1040, branching off to the supporting forms and schedules as needed (it's almost like a program with subroutines). The best tax programs not only let you skip back and forth among forms as needed, but they also automatically duplicate any figures you change on one page on all the other affected schedules and forms. Some programs then proceed to recalculate all affected forms; others wait until you bring each form back up to give you any revised totals.

Although you want to be able to work in a branching order, you want the results printed out to approximate the actual forms. According to the IRS help line, the Feds prefer that you don't

actually use a computer to type out your forms and schedules, unless you're using a program that creates officially approved forms, but they apparently will take equivalents that include all the required information in the same order and general layout, if it's just for your own return and not one that you've prepared for someone else. To placate the tax people, you at least want the software to print out a simulated return with the numbers right where they would go on the form—it'll simplify your manual copying process.

If you get your books and then your taxes on your computer, someday you may have one of the moments we've all been waiting for. You get a letter or phone call from the revenueurs, and you can finally say, with a straight face, "Those numbers must be right; my computer says..." **+**

DISK TALK

A short glossary of terms for use with 'First Aid for Disk Drives,' page 159

13- AND 16-SECTOR DISKS

The first disk-operating systems for the Apple II (DOS 3, then 3.1 and 3.2) had 13 sectors (chunks of data) 256 bytes long on each track. The current DOS 3.3 and ProDOS systems use 16 sectors per track. You can convert many 13-sector disks to 16-sector form, using Apple's MUFFIN program.

16-SECTOR

DOS 3.3 and ProDOS use 16-sector disks, which have 16 chunks of 256 bytes on each track.

35 AND 40 TRACK

The 5¼-inch disk drives Apple sells store data in a pattern of 35 concentric magnetic tracks. Other similar drives put 40 tracks on each disk by using the area close to the center hole. Using more tracks makes more room, but Apple has chosen to stay with 35 tracks for greater reliability and compatibility.

ACCESS TIME

For disk drives, this term has two separate meanings: track-to-track access and average access time. Track-to-track access time is the interval it takes a drive to move the read/write head from a starting position to an adjacent track (for drives used on an Apple, normally a number between two and ten milliseconds). Average access time is the interval it takes, on the average, for the disk drive to read or write on any spot on the disk (normally a number between 20 and 100 milliseconds).

ALIGN

To set a disk drive so that it starts on the outside track (track 0) at the right position and keeps the head at the right distance and angle. A drive that is misaligned often can read its own disks but may not be able to read disks written on any other system.

ANSI DRIVE

A disk drive that conforms to the general industry standard for 5¼-inch drives, instead of being configured specially to work with the Apple II family. You can get kits to convert some brands of ANSI drives to Apple compatibility, and some disk-controller cards for the Apple can read or write with unmodified ANSI drives.

BAND POSITIONER

A type of mechanism that moves the disk read/write head back and forth across the disk surface, using a metal band looped over a pulley driven by a stepper motor. Band-positioner drives can change tracks faster than the screw-type ones but are more expensive and difficult to produce.

DIRECT-DRIVE MOTOR

A disk-drive motor built into the hub rather than driving the hub through a belt-and-pulley arrangement. With no belts to stretch or wear, these drives are more reliable and need less maintenance.

FULL- AND HALF-HEIGHT DRIVES

The original 5¼-inch disk-drive mechanisms were 3¼ inches high, so computers and cases were designed with openings this size. Advancing technology made the design of smaller drives possible; ones half as thick (half-height) are now the most popular.

GCR

An abbreviation for Group Code Recording. Apple chose this method to code

data stored on disks. Using GCR allowed Steve Wozniak to design an inexpensive disk controller.

HALF TRACK

Drives for the Apple II family can move their read/write heads to a position halfway between the normal track positions (standard drives cannot). Half-track movements are part of many copy-protection schemes.

LEAD SCREW

(Pronounced "lead screw.") A mechanism that moves the read/write head of the disk drive back and forth by twisting a spiral screw (the lead screw). This is the method the Apple Disk II uses, but newer drives often use the faster band-positioner technology.

QUAD DENSITY

In the Apple world, this term usually refers to drives that use both sides of each disk and pack twice as many tracks on each side (which doubles storage capacity and then redoubles it). Quad-density disks can store somewhere between 500 Kilobytes (500K) and 1 megabyte (1000K) per disk, compared to 143K for the standard Apple disk.

ROTATION SPEED

The number of times the disk turns around each minute. Apple drives are supposed to turn at 300 revolutions per second (RPM) but may need occasional adjustment to keep to this speed.

SECTOR

An arc-shaped section of the magnetic track pattern on a disk, or the data that is recorded in that section. Apple drives store 256 bytes in each sector.

SOFT-SECTORED

Disks on which each individual section of data within a track is marked by a magnetic address pattern, rather than by a physical

timing hole in the disk. A single hole marks the start of the track. All Apple products use soft-sectored disks.

Because locations are denoted by magnetic patterns, these patterns must first be written on the disk before it can be used, a process called initializing or formatting the disk.

STEPPER

The special motor in the disk drive that moves the read/write heads in and out to each track position, following the computer's instructions.

TRACK

An invisible magnetic circle pattern written onto a disk as a guide for storing and reading information. Standard Apple-II-family disks have 35 of these concentric circles, with track 0 being closest to the outside of the disk.

TRANSFER RATE

The amount of data that can be read from or written to a disk in one second. It is primarily a function of how fast the disk turns and how closely together the bits can be packed on the disk surface. On an Apple Disk II, the transfer rate is 125,000 bits per seconds and something more than three times as fast for the Macintosh (depending on which track), and ten times as fast for a hard disk.

WRITE-ENABLE NOTCH

A small region on the right edge of the floppy-disk jacket that must be left cut open or the disk drive will refuse to write on the disk (on 8-inch drives, the notch is called the write-protect notch, because leaving it open prevents the drive from writing on the disk). You can cover the cutout on disks you want to protect with opaque adhesive tabs. Some system disks do not have cutouts. +

Even though it's approaching its eighth birthday, the Apple II is still in many ways the same machine that Wozniak and Jobs pieced together back in the garage.

Certainly, it's seen a lot of changes since then, such as the substitution of Applesoft BASIC for Integer BASIC in the Apple II Plus and the redesign of the motherboard in the Apple IIe.

Apple has made every change in the Apple II carefully, however, with a real concern that each new system works with the systems that preceded it. This approach makes sense. The Apple II has always been Apple's bread-and-butter product. As long as it continues to sell well, any modification in the machine—even if it is a relatively small modification—represents a major move that will affect a lot of people, from developers to users.

So Apple's recent decision to replace four chips in the Apple IIe means a lot more than you may think. It means, for instance, that the Apple IIe will now work a lot more like an Apple IIc does.

The two computers were already pretty close, but developers weren't taking full advantage of the advanced capabilities built into the IIe, preferring instead to write programs for the more generic—and more established—IIe.

The new chips give both machines essentially the

same capabilities. As part of the enhancement, Apple is installing

- the same microprocessor that's in the Apple IIc—the 65C02—with 27 additional instructions that haven't been available in the brain of the Apple IIe
- a character - generator ROM that allows the Apple IIe to display Mouse-text characters (for additional information about Mousetext and mouse-driven software for the Apple II, see "Mouse-Driven Software for Apple II Computers," *A+*, March, pages 38-44)
- two new monitor ROMs that give the Apple IIe better interrupt support

and add a collection of advanced programming features

As of March, every new Apple IIe has these four chips in place of the old ones. Owners of earlier incarnations of the IIe can get them installed at a dealership for about \$70. (All installations are made by dealers. You *cannot* take the chips home and install them yourself.)

Should you get the upgrade? Most people will probably want it eventually, simply because most Apple owners like to keep their machines current. In fact, longtime Apple watchers will remember when Apple increased the capacity of the Disk II to 140K several years ago. Virtually everybody seemed to make the



switch overnight.

This time, in contrast, Apple isn't pushing its installed base too hard to upgrade machines right away. The immediate advantages of an enhanced IIe are really useful only for a small number of Apple owners. With the enhanced IIe, you can

- start up ProDOS programs from a ProFile or other hard-disk drive by putting the disk-controller card into slot 7
- type BASIC programs in uppercase and lowercase letters
- use a built-in 6502 mini-assembler to assemble machine-language programs. It is essentially the same miniassembler that came in the original Integer BASIC Apple II, but it's been out since the days of the Apple II Plus.

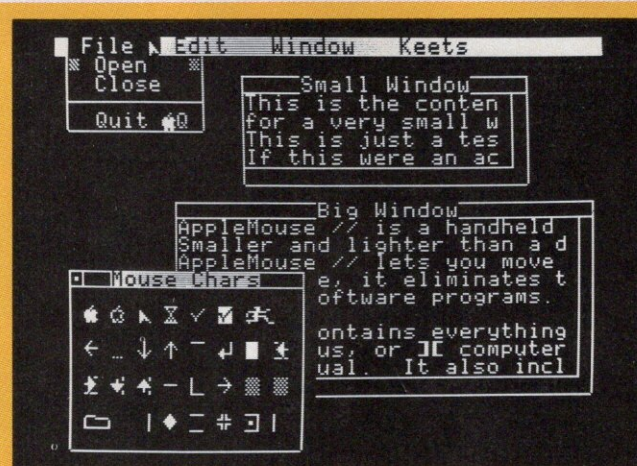
You won't have to keep your Caps Lock key down all the time, and scrolling 80-column text is smoother, but otherwise most of these features won't mean much to most Apple IIe owners. The only actual difference you'll definitely see is that the computer displays Apple IIe when you turn it on, instead of Apple II.

Over the long run, however, Apple expects sales of this enhanced machine—coupled with the growing base of Apple IIc owners—to inspire developers to create a new generation of programs, featuring windows, icons, and pull-down menus, which will allow Apple II software to look and work much like programs do on the Macintosh.

In many ways, however, Apple is admittedly selling futures with these features. None of them will be available until third-party developers or Apple itself writes new software that takes advantage of these tools.

Of Mice and Chickens

Now it's time to introduce that ageless question of the chicken and the egg.



MOUSETEXT

Look familiar? No, this isn't a Macintosh screen; it's an Apple II with Mac-like features. The Macintosh-style user interface, complete with windows and pull-down menus, is made possible by Mousertext characters. Mousertext is built into every IIc and can be added to the IIe with the upgrade chips described in this article.

Although the current generation of Apple II software does not make use of Mousertext, Apple has been showing developers how to give their Apple II programs some of the Mac's convenient features. Many future Apple II programs will utilize Mousertext to incorporate the mouse, windows, and pull-down menus. Developers hope this innovation will extend the already legendary life span of the Apple II series of computers.

In order to use this new generation of Mac-like software for the II series, you will need either an Apple IIc or an upgraded IIe. So if you have an Apple IIe and want to be ready for the new wave of mouse-driven software, you should seriously consider upgrading your IIe, even though it does mean losing a small amount of compatibility with the current generation of IIe software.

Which comes first? Do Apple owners run out and get the upgrade, inspiring developers to write programs that take advantage of these capabilities? Or do developers write new software right away, hoping to create products that inspire Apple IIe owners to have the upgrade done?

This chicken-and-egg scenario (or perhaps it would be more appropriate to call it a cat-and-mouse game) will probably go on for at least a few months, until the number of owners of the Apple IIc and enhanced Apple IIe increases enough to guarantee a large base for developers.

As one developer says, he won't necessarily use those features even then: "Whenever possible, I'll try to write for the largest number of computers that I can. Unless my idea for a program is so complex that

it requires these features, I'm not going to use them." **What Do You Give Up?**

The biggest concern for most current owners is about whether the software they have now will work on the enhanced machine.

Generally, the answer appears to be "yes." Apple says that more than 95% of the popular programs made for the Apple II work without modification on the enhanced Apple IIe, and many of those that don't work are being upgraded for the new machine. (Your dealer's compatibility list includes information about how to get upgraded versions of products.)

The biggest compatibility problem results from the addition of Mousertext in the new character-generator ROM. Mousertext is a set of graphic characters (see sidebar) that a programmer can use to aid in

emulating Macintosh software on the Apple II. A programmer can manipulate these characters just as easily as moving letters and numbers around on the screen.

Here's where the problem comes in: Mousertext replaces one of the existing character sets on the Apple II, a flashing set of letters and numbers. (You don't actually lose anything, because it is actually a duplicate character set that developers were discouraged from using all along.) If a program uses that flashing character set, it will display Mousertext characters on the screen instead of the original letters and numbers.

Actually, the program will work in just the same way, but the screen will look different. For instance, instead of seeing a flashing *H* on the screen, you'll see



And instead of seeing @, you'll see



Reading a screen with a bunch of Mousertext characters may seem a bit like translating hieroglyphics, but you should generally still be able to use the program, just as always.

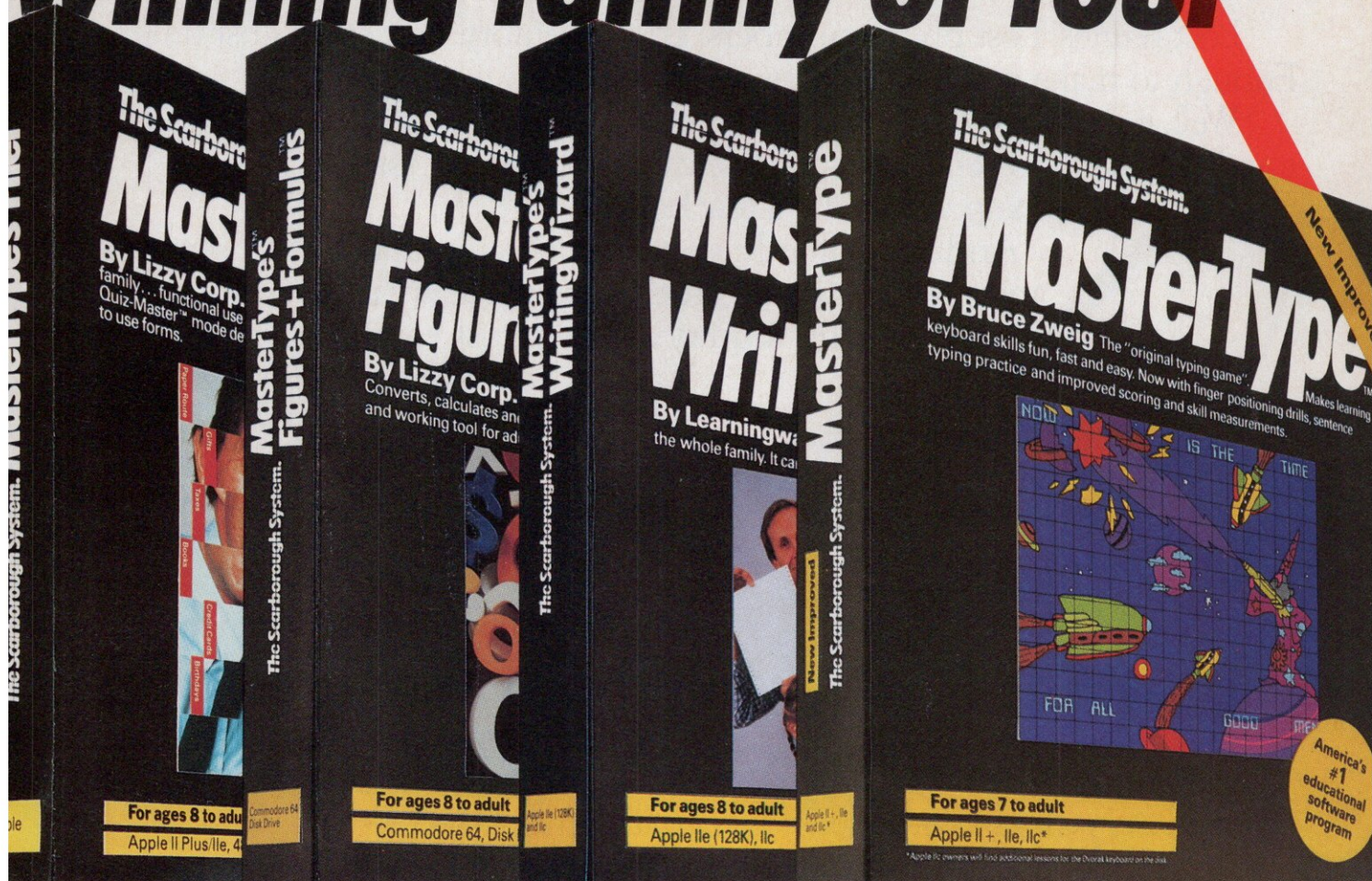
Only a few programs actually use the affected character set. Most of the commercial programs that have a Mousertext problem are detailed in Apple's compatibility guide.

If you're using custom software, however, you should try to check it out on an enhanced system at your dealer's before having your system enhanced. Dealers have agreed with Apple to get rid of the old chips, in order to ensure that they won't show up in bootleg Apples. So, once you have the upgrade done, you may not be able to turn back.

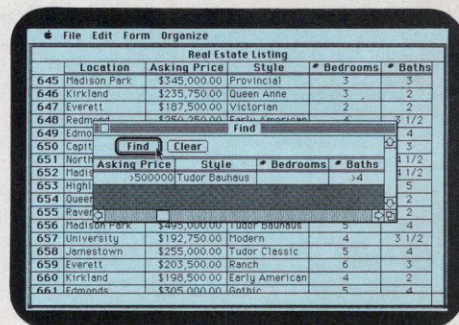

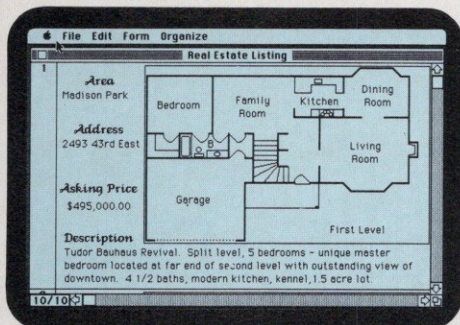

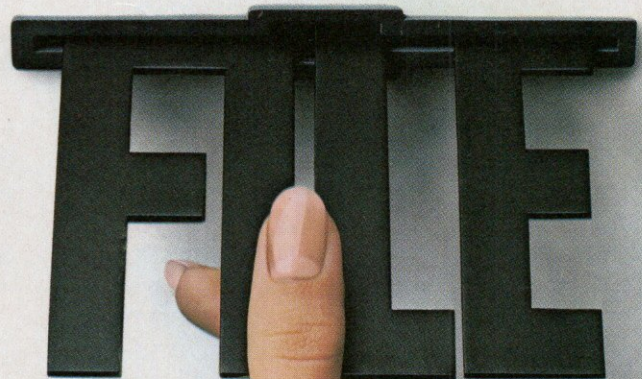

stalls the upgrade, you'll get a short manual describing some of its main features and detailing the differences between your old IIe and the enhanced version of the machine.

You'll also get a sticker that identifies your system as being "enhanced." It fits over the power light next to the open-apple key. Installing this sticker is especially important if your system will be used in a classroom or in another setting that may include both enhanced and unenhanced systems, so anybody can tell which is which.

A programmers' manual is also available at many dealerships, but it's not designed for the weak at heart or for anyone who's not fanatically serious about software. It's full of things such as instruction sets for the 65C02 and listings for the new monitor ROMs. If you don't already know half of that stuff, you probably do not even want to ask for it.

If you're buying a new system, you won't get the aforementioned upgrade, but you will get a new tutorial disk and owners' manual, both of which have as their model the excellent start-from-scratch tutorials that accompany the Apple IIc.

To Enhance or Not to Enhance

Apple is advising customers to have the enhancement done "when a program you want that requires it becomes available."

For most people, that advice is reasonable. The software that's coming may be pretty fantastic, using double-high-resolution graphics to create striking on-screen displays, as well as taking advantage of some of the easy-to-use features of Apple's newer systems.

It's probably safe to assume that this new software will also require 128K of memory and a mouse,

though. If your funds are limited, you may want to invest now in a memory or mouse upgrade (since you can start taking advantage of either of these improvements right away), and wait to get the system enhancement until the arrival of products that actually need it.

Don't get your hopes up too high. Even though these Mac-like programs may be impressive on an Apple II, they will almost definitely still lack the total integrated design of some software designed for one of Apple's 32-bit machines. You probably won't be able to cut and paste between a MacPaint-like program and a word-processing program, for instance—at least not right away.

What's to Come

There's no telling where developers might take this technology two or three years from now. Clearly, Apple has established a direction for the Apple II that follows the line the Lisa and Macintosh have established.

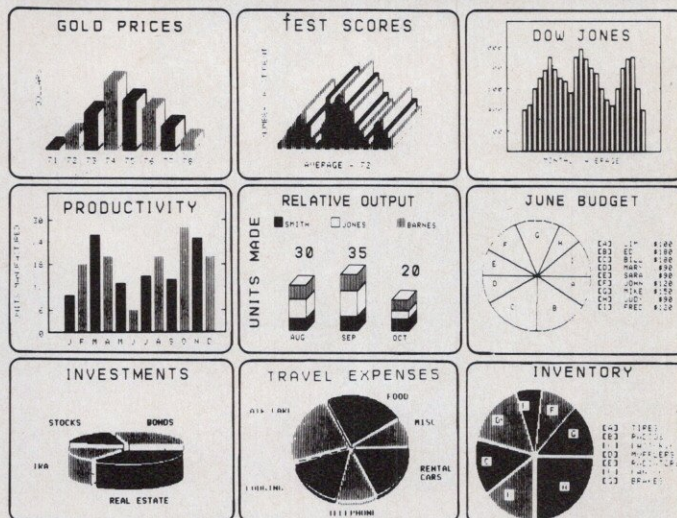
It's a compelling way to go, especially since Macintosh-style programs allow average people to dig right in, without having to plow through a manual.

Now Apple II owners can take advantage of that new-style software, as well as the who-knows-how-many thousands of regular-style programs that also work with the machine.

After eight years of growth, changes, and advances, the enhanced Apple IIe is still in many ways the same computer it's always been. A lot of developers are still fans of the machine, which bodes well for the success of the enhancement and for the continued success of the Apple II. +

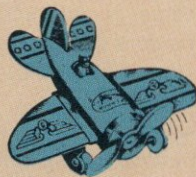

SOFTWARE FOR BUDDING YOUNG WRITERS

STORY MAKERS CAN HELP YOUNGSTERS BLOSSOM



Now that the software developers have become expert at designing educational programs for your Apple that hone such mechanical skills as mathematics and spelling proficiency, they've taken on a far tougher challenge: developing software that helps children write stories.

Creative thinking is a prerequisite for any good tale. Ideally, then, a first-class "story maker" should develop this ability in young writers. The hitch is that creativity, unlike multiplication, isn't something that's easily taught and measured. That's why it's a lot trickier to design an effective story maker than it is to create electronic flash cards and why, at this early stage, it's difficult to determine whether story makers will cause latent Hemingways to blossom any sooner.

FOUR DIFFERENT APPROACHES

Currently, at least four story makers are available for the Apple II family of computers, each embodying a different approach to using a computer for creative writing. In fact, the only feature the various story makers share is that they all include basic word-processing capabilities.

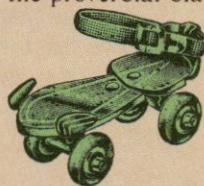
After you try out several story makers, some key parameters for evaluating

them emerge. At the most basic level, a story maker should be easy enough to use to prevent clammering for pad and paper, and fun enough to stave off a beeline for the television set. The other consideration—and one that is far more difficult to characterize—is whether the story maker triggers those unconscious, intuitive hunches that form the basis of creative thought.

It turns out that the two most straightforward story makers have the same straightforward name: Story Maker. One is published by Scholastic, Inc., the other by Sierra On-Line, Inc.

Words and Picture Gallery

Scholastic's Story Maker helps children create picture books. The screen is the proverbial blank page; the author's



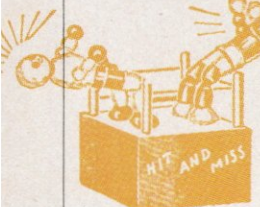
job is to fill it with words and pictures.

Authors create text using a simple word processor that lets them back up over

old text or write on top of existing text. They can illustrate their work either by creating pictures freehand—using mouse, joystick, or KoalaPad—or by selecting pictures from the Picture Gallery, a collection of more than 50 images that run the gamut from snakes to motorcyclists.

In addition to coming to the rescue of less artistically inclined authors, the

Picture Gallery is a great tool for piquing the imagination. Suppose, for example, that you're writing a story about a pig. You're vague about how the plot will unravel, but you plough in anyway—writing a sentence or two to introduce your hero and then drawing his portrait, using your mouse. Next, you decide to add some scenery to the opening page, so you select the Picture Gallery. Scanning the images, your eye is drawn to the cactus. Quite suddenly, your head is flooded with the tingling sensations that signal the birth of a new idea. At last, your story has a direction: the tale of a pig in a mudless world. And it all happened because of that cactus.



Story Maker is filled with fun features: 8 different type styles and 16 different pen colors to choose from, stamping capabilities that let authors display multiple images of the same graphic on a page, and an eraser controlled by the mouse or another input device that makes it easy to change direction in midpicture. The software's only real limitation is that the editor doesn't have word wrap, so it's easy to get caught with part of a word on one line and the other part on the next.

Words and Graphics Tools

Story Maker by Sierra On-Line also provides tools for budding authors. The basic idea is the same: creating stories, using words and pictures. Sierra's rendition doesn't let authors draw and write on the same screen, though. Rather, selecting one option invokes a drawing screen, and selecting another invokes a screen for writing. The software knows which picture to insert where because authors insert picture names in the appropriate spots in their text. When authors read their stories, pictures appear on the top portion of the screen and words on the bottom. This arrangement looks neat and tidy, but the implementation is cumbersome.

Sierra's Story Maker has nothing resembling a picture gallery, but it does provide a variety of graphics tools—including functions that draw lines, circles, and squares—and a selection of 14 colored patterns for filling in shapes. For drawing, users may either use an input device such as a mouse, joystick, or touch tablet, or they may use the I, J, K, and M keys, although these keys can only be used to draw lines, not circles and squares.

A major limitation of Sierra's Story

Maker is that it doesn't have printing capabilities. This drawback may not be a liability in a generation or two, but many children today are still hooked on the pleasure of reading their stories before bed or bringing their work to school to share with classmates—activities that aren't easy to pull off when printed copies aren't available.

Writing As Play

Woodbury's Play Writer Series takes quite a different approach to writing. First of all, it has nothing to do with writing plays. Rather, the title of the series is based on the idea that the software lets a child play at being a writer. Once you understand that, everything starts making a lot more sense. Four different Play Writer packages are available including Adventures in Space, Tales of Me, Mystery!, and Castles and Creatures.

Play Writer authors don't exactly write their own stories. Rather, they answer a series of questions. The Play Writer software then uses the responses to those questions to compose a story. For example, in Adventures in Space, the software begins by asking users questions such as the name, sex, and age of the hero and the hero's favorite planet and galaxy. Play Writer then responds with a story that starts something like this:

For Wanda Bradley, it was a very special day. While everyone else was getting up for school or work, she was preparing for something a little different, a journey through uncharted space... You see, Wanda had read in the newspaper that NASA was planning a mission to Lunar Lotus, which happened to be Wanda's favorite planet in the Lunar Kingdom galaxy...



Once the software has done its work, authors have the option of editing the computer-generated tale.

Each of the Play Writer packages includes all the supplies an author needs to produce a finished book: hardcover book jacket printed with the title of the Play Writer package, paper for pages of the book, and endpapers for attaching paper to the book jacket.

The Play Writer software has no graphics capabilities. Instead, the package includes stickers that are relevant to the subject—an assortment of space creatures for Adventures in Space, for

example. The idea is that after printing the final version of their tale, authors affix the stickers in appropriate places in the text.

Authors who have completed one book can purchase refill packs that include stickers, endpapers, printer paper, and hardcover book jacket.

Branching Out

Although Play Writer lets the computer take over much of the writing process, Story Tree—another story maker by Scholastic—takes the opposite tack. It asks authors not only to create original tales but also to design those tales with enough twists or branches to send Sherlock Holmes into a tailspin. The final outcome is interactive stories in which readers make choices about how the story will unfold.

Suppose, for example, that you wanted to write a story about a magic tunnel. Using Story Tree, you could construct the story so that when readers came to the portion of the story where the tunnel divides, they would be asked to choose either the left or right fork. Choosing the right fork would lead them to a Roman bath, and choosing the left would deliver them to the Leaning Tower of Pisa. Lest a story become predictable through repeat readings, the software lets authors invoke a Chance option that randomly chooses among different alternatives. In one reading, for example, the right fork might lead to the Roman bath; in another it would descend upon the Queen of Sheba's palace.

As you might suspect, Story Tree authors must keep careful track of where their stories are headed. To do this, the Story Tree manual suggests that authors create a story map—a diagram resembling a flowchart that includes each screen of information an author writes, the options a reader may select from each screen, and where each of those options goes.

The branching capabilities of Story Tree also let authors write nonfiction articles in which readers can select to read about the aspects of a subject they're most interested in.

THE STORY MAKER FOR YOU

Once you're familiar with how various story makers work, the obvious next step is deciding whether they'd enhance your software library. A good place for you to start is to determine if

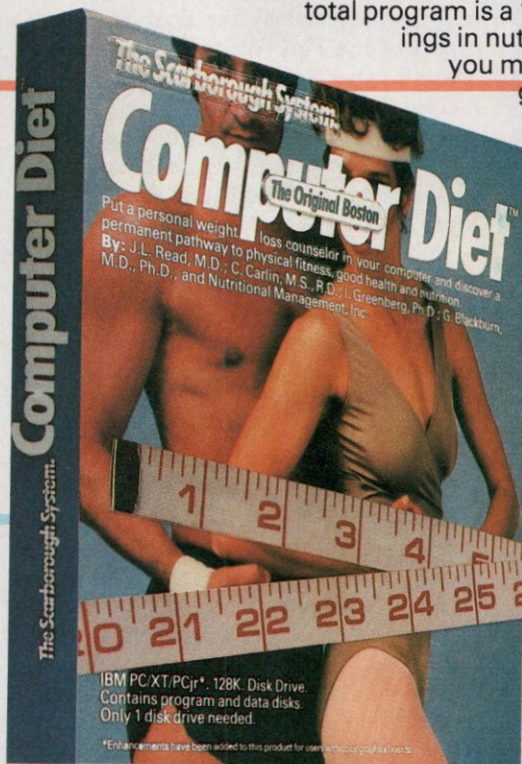

these packages facilitate the mechanical aspects of writing. If your child feels comfortable composing at a keyboard, the answer is probably yes, if only because each of the programs includes a word-processing function. Prospective buyers should know, however, that even simple word-processing programs such as Bank Street Writer include far more functions than the insert/delete variety of editor found in the story makers reviewed here.

Of all the packages discussed, Scholastic's Story Maker is definitely the easiest to use; and, consequently, it is most appropriate for children in the early elementary grades. This age group could also use Sierra's Story Maker, although the lack of integration of text and graphics makes it harder for small children to handle independently. Because Story Tree and Play Maker are word-oriented rather than picture-oriented, these programs are best suited for children who are at least in fourth or fifth grade.

The answer to another pertinent question—Are these packages fun?—depends on the personal likes and interests of individual children. Children who are crafts-oriented, for example, may be intrigued by the book-binding aspect of the Play Writer series; more analytic types are likely to become immersed in the intricacies of Story Tree; and children who enjoy drawing pictures via computer will be drawn to both Scholastic's and Sierra On-Line's Story Makers.

Whether story makers boost creativity is a tougher issue. Although fun to play with, the Play Writer series doesn't do a lot to loosen up cramped imaginations. What's more likely is that after watching a computer program spin an entertaining yarn, children will wonder why their teachers are so insistent that students write their own tales.

Sierra On-Line's Story Maker is just about neutral in the creativity realm. Basically it gives authors some drawing and writing tools and tells them to go for it. Active minds will jump at the chance, but lethargic ones still may not budge. Scholastic's Story Maker's Picture Gallery definitely helps shake up the creative juices.

Story Tree is an odd bird. It certainly encourages authors to come up with numerous twists and turns in their tales, an act that requires imagination aplenty. The process, however, demands such attention to logic and detail that it causes authors to forfeit the spontane-

ity that normally is a prerequisite to creative thinking.

No matter how you look at it, writing, especially creative writing, is a complex, almost mystical activity. Given our minimal knowledge of creativity and the relationship between language and creativity, it is naive to expect software developers to come up with sure-fire methods of making children more creative writers. The products reviewed here are a beginning. Whether, in the end, they do much more than ye olde pencil and paper is up to children, parents, and teachers to decide. **+**

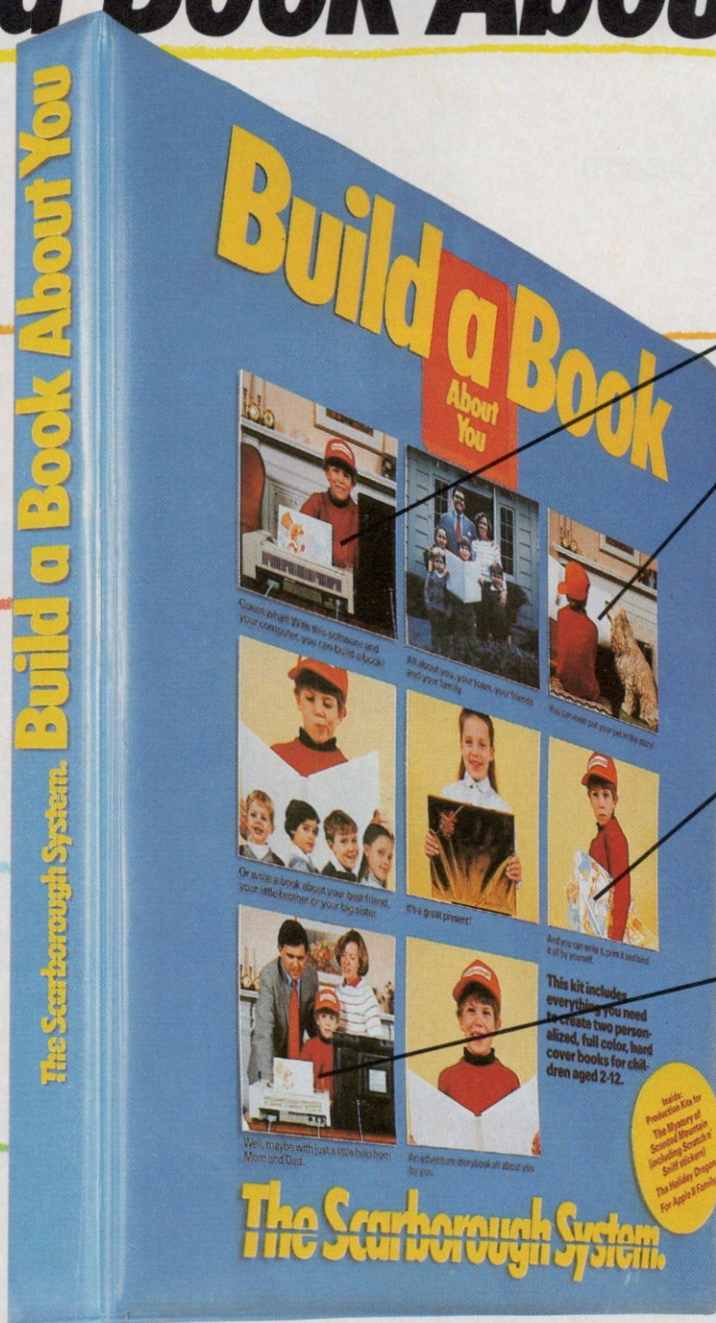

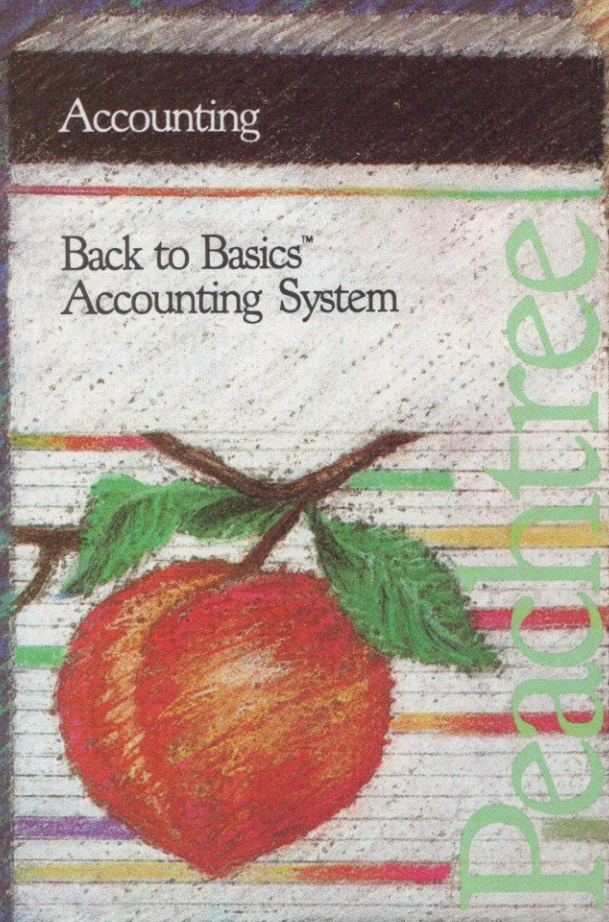

AST'S MULTI I/O CARD

**COMPACT, CAPABLE,
AND COST-EFFECTIVE**

Getting the most from your Apple IIe computer can be an expensive undertaking. Adding an accessory such as a printer or modem usually means installing an expansion card as well. With so many of these cards priced well above \$100, it isn't long before the costs start adding up.

The Multi I/O, from AST Research, Inc., is a single expansion card that does the job of three separate devices, yet costs much less. Placing several functions on one card keeps both cost and power consumption to a minimum. In addition, compatibility among the various functions is assured—something that cannot be taken for granted when you mix and match accessories. AST included three of the most popular options in its Multi I/O card—a serial-printer port, a serial-communications port, and a versatile clock/calendar.

With all of its abilities, the Multi I/O card is a compact device that measures just eight inches overall. It installs easily and is well made. The unit comes complete with two RS-232-style connectors that attach to openings at the rear of the computer's cabinet. Short lengths of ribbon cable lead from these connectors to plugs on the card itself, enabling it to communicate with the outside world.

Slot Mapping

A technique known as slot mapping allows the Multi I/O card to occupy just a single slot, yet perform as three separate cards. A set of programmable jumpers on the surface of the card allows you to select where you wish to "map" each of its functions. If you

move these jumpers from one location on the card to another, the corresponding functions move from slot to slot. For example, if you install the card in slot 1 (the most common location), you can program it to provide its printer output through either slot 1 or slot 2, send communications data through slot 2 or slot 3, and have the clock function behave as though it were in either slot 4 or slot 7.

When you assign a function to a slot, you can use no other card in that position. Since the slot assignments are easily changed, it is possible to use the Multi I/O card with almost any other accessory. You can install the Multi I/O card in any one of the slots to which its functions are assigned.

It's possible to disable any of the card's three functions if they are not needed or if their operations would conflict with another device. One problem could occur if you mapped the card's communications function to slot 3, since that slot is tied internally to the IIe's auxiliary slot (usually used with 80-column-video-display adapters).

Serial-Printer Output

Printer output from the Multi I/O card comes through a standard serial port, which works with a number of popular printers. The Apple Image-

writer, Brother HR-25 Serial, and Oki-data 82A are just a few of the machines that use this type of interface.

Transmission rate is set with the aid of switches mounted on the card. Any speed from 50 to 19,200 bps can be programmed in, but 9600 bps is the most common choice. The data length, stop bits, and parity are under software control and may be changed from within a BASIC or assembly-language program. The default setting is eight data bits with two stop bits and no parity.

I connected the Multi I/O card to an Apple Imagewriter printer, using the cable supplied in Apple's Imagewriter Accessory Kit. After I set the configuration switches on the Imagewriter to match the settings used by the Multi I/O card, the printer worked well and performed smoothly. A graphics print utility is included in the card's software package, allowing the Imagewriter (or compatible printer) to reproduce graphics screens as hard copy.

Communications Port

The RS-232 asynchronous serial communications port serves two functions. It allows you to connect your Apple to an external modem and also lets you use your computer with (or as) a remote terminal. As with the printer output, the communications port can operate at 50-19,200 bps and can use several different data settings.

On-board firmware permits you to switch the communications function into either Terminal or Nonterminal operating modes. When operating as a terminal, the computer behaves as though its CPU were disconnected.

This mode lets the Apple act like an ordinary, "dumb" terminal, which you can connect to a larger machine or to a timesharing network. This mode supports both Full- and Half-Duplex modes and recognizes the Break signal.

With a remote device connected to the Apple through the communications port, you can access all of the computer's functions. When the remote device sends commands, they are processed as if they had been entered on the Apple's keyboard, and the Multi I/O card routes output that would normally go to the Apple's screen back to the remote device.

Modems that operate with the Multi I/O card include the Hayes Smartmodem 300 and 1200 (external), Novation Smart-Cat, and Novation Auto-Cat. Most external modems that require a standard RS-232 interface will work with no modifications. Half- and Full-Duplex modes are available as well, and you can change them by sending control codes from the keyboard. Many of the popular communications-software packages operate with the Multi I/O card, including ASCII Express and Data Capture.

Clock/Calendar

The Multi I/O card keeps accurate

time with the aid of a quartz-controlled clock/calendar circuit. An on-board lithium battery maintains the correct time, even when the computer is shut

off, and should last for about a year in normal use. Changing the battery is an easy task; just lift a spring-loaded clip and drop a new one into place.

The clock is compatible with Apple's ProDOS operating system, and its calendar function works automatically with ProDOS-based programs, such as AppleWorks, helping you keep track of the last time you made changes to a file.

Four different formats for time and date are available: AM/PM 12-hour style, 24-hour "military" time, and two "numeric" formats for use within BASIC or assembly-language programs. The Multi I/O card provides month,

day-of-week, day-of-month, hour, minute, and second information. It is possible to access the clock and calendar from either DOS 3.3 or ProDOS. A jumper on the circuit board must be in place when you set the clock, but you can remove it once the time and date are correct—to prevent inadvertent changes.

The Multi I/O card's clock-output format is similar to that of the Thunderclock and the Mountain Computer Apple Clock, so most software that uses those cards will work with this device as well.

Software Utilities

The Multi I/O card comes with a menu-driven disk of utility programs designed to help you use it more effectively. The disk is ProDOS-based, but you can convert many of the programs to run under DOS 3.3.

One utility routine sets and reads the clock, and another displays the time on the screen in a digital-clock style, using graphic numbers 1½ inches tall. Other functions include a telephone dialer for use with a modem, a printing terminal program that captures information from the communications port and moves it to your printer, and a listing routine that automatically dates

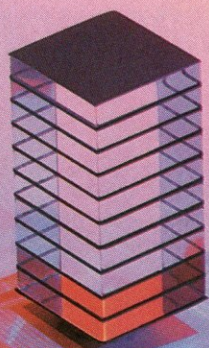

and prints text files. The disk also includes a tutorial section, which is nothing more than a few pages of text that the manual should have included.

Documentation

The sparse, 30-page booklet that comes with the Multi I/O card is a real disappointment. It describes most of the card's functions in the fewest possible words and provides very little information for serious programmers. The section devoted to installation and configuration is clear, but even a casual user will find the manual far from helpful when it comes to using the card and its software utilities effectively.

Nowhere does the manual even mention how to read the current year from the calendar, yet several of the utility programs display the year on-screen. The few times I consulted the manual for help in operation or setup, I was simply left in the dark.

AST also includes a listing of hardware and software that is known to be compatible with the Multi I/O card. The list that came with the evaluation unit bore the date October 22, 1984, and listed 15 hardware products and 25 software titles.

Cost-Effectiveness

Even though AST's Multi I/O card does the job of several different devices, it is not necessarily a better value than a single expansion device purchased separately. If you are planning to add only a serial printer, clock, or communications device (or if you plan to use a parallel printer in your system), the Multi I/O card may not be the most cost-effective approach.

If you have definite plans to add a serial printer as well as a clock, however, the Multi I/O card starts to make sense. Should you have all three devices in mind—printer, clock, and external modem—the \$229 retail price of the card makes it a clear value. +

Two light-pen systems

compared

Pen the light fantastic

In Walt Disney's *Fantasia* on the big screen, I saw Mickey Mouse realize one of my fondest dreams. Through the power of the Sorcerer's magic wand, he could make swirling patterns of brilliant color explode in the air with just a wave of his hand.

Computer graphics is the next best thing to sorcery. We can express our visual imagination on the monitor's screen and print out images to share with others. Diagrams, charts, and illustrations for business, educational, and technical applications are only some of the practical uses for this "electric ink."

Inside the Electronic Studio

Let's go from that famous mouse to the magic wand itself. Why, it's just like a light pen! Light pens are one of several control devices used in computer graphics. Others include touch screens, digitizing tablets, joysticks, keyboards, and mice. In combination with software, they provide the resources to draw, draft, write, paint, texture, move, modify, copy, and save pictures—in monochrome and in color—with vivid precision.

You hold a light pen just as a traditional artist grips a pencil or a brush, and the screen becomes a working surface like a painter's canvas. Light pens are more contact-oriented, and they appeal to people who want to confront the image directly with as little command language as possible.

The position of the light pen on the screen is sensed by a net of crisscrossing electrical signals that are part of the cathode-ray-tube system of the moni-

tor. A long wire connects the pen to a graphics card installed in one of the slots of the Apple's motherboard. The software translates the x,y coordinates of the pen's location and your commands to make the program go to work—or play—for you.

Gibson Light Pen System

Koala Technologies has bundled Steve Gibson's light pen as a low-cost package of four programs. One disk contains Penpainter, a color-graphics illustrator, and two stand-alone monochrome programs, Penanimator and Penmusician. Pendesigner, a more precise monochrome drawing program, is on the second disk. For experienced Applesoft programmers with an interest in graphics, the machine language Pen-trak is included as well. Installation of the card in an Apple IIe took me less than ten minutes, and the documentation was clear and well illustrated, although it had neither a Help section nor an index.

To calibrate the program, you point the pen at two lines on the title screen, and, with a couple of buzzes and beeps, you're in. Throughout the Gibson programs, on-screen dialogue accompanies every operation. It's like having R2-D2 kibitzing at your elbow. All of the programs are menu-driven, with some keyboard commands. Penpainter's response is immediate, and pressing the

space bar on the keyboard confirms commands. It can stop, start, stretch, or drag objects at which you point the pen. An options bar across the top of the screen lists the four main pull-down menus, which can hide after you've made your choice or remain open while you work. The cursor—that floating white square that is the "point" of your pen—can be enhanced with cross hairs. The Inertia option can adjust the rate at which the cursor follows the pen, for responsiveness in freehand drawing.

The Pens menu has all the drawing, text, and fill options in the form of icons. From this palette you can draw free-form lines and create hollow or filled rectangles, shadowed rectangles, triangles, parallelograms, and circles. There is only one line width, and the text is available in one font, uppercase only. The Colors menu lets you choose from the three basic colors of the high-resolution Apple system, plus white and black.

To erase, you can take out the whole screen by invoking the Clear option or delete details by making the line the same color as the element to be erased, going over it with the pen. But there is no Undo option, which always makes a budding artist more cautious. When making rectangles and other shapes, you can change your mind before confirming the final points. Shake the pen

until you hear a z-z-z-o-i-p-p sound, and away it goes.

The Mirror option can create bilateral symmetry on four axes, quickly creating strong abstractions. The Pattern and Filling options are effective, if sometimes tricky. You can fill only hollow, black-and-white objects. Since you can't "undo," you would be wise to save pictures before filling. To erase a file, you must bring in DOS. With the Print Pic option, the six printer-interface cards that the Gibson accepts appear in submenus with the choices for each. I used a Grappler+ from Orange Micro with fine results, printing black-and-white images with bold, 90° rotation and small-scale options.

Pendesigner

This program is more of an electronic drafting board than a paint box, trading color for more precision and control. The menu options are all on one panel, appearing and hiding at a tap of the space bar. Confirming points are commanded from the 1 and 2, or < and > keys. Press the Z key, and you zoom in on a chosen area where you can draw—and erase—pixel by pixel, with either the pen or the I, J, K, and M keys. While in the Zoom mode, you can pan across the image.


A handy subfile of "index cards" contains a series of scrapbook images that you can call up at any time in a window. You can use Koala's sample cards, such as Electronics and Floor Plan, or create your own. The frame is another windowing function that permits you to copy or move elements and to shrink or stretch part of an image, erase, or wipe clear a screen area. Pendesigner and Penpainter can interchange files. This ability enables you to paint a picture that was drawn in Pendesigner, but porting them back and forth is cumbersome and time-consuming, as they must be rebooted each time.

Penanimator and Penmusician

Penanimator packs an entire animation workshop within one small program. Its snappy Auto Demo illustrates the mechanics of movement through a 20-frame storyboard. The space-bar command brings you back and forth between the storyboard and the Full-Frame mode, where you can draw (slowly) with its large pixels. The forward and reverse commands encourage you to flip back and forth within a sequence just like movie cartoonists do.

Penmusician can help you learn to read music and compose. It displays three musical staves, with a string of

whole notes through each. The menu bar above provides note and rest options, with sharps, flats, and naturals. All these elements can be dragged into position by the pen and confirmed by the space bar, and they respond with the proper tones. As with Penanimator, you can choose where the playback ac-

tion begins and ends, and you can save your favorite hits. These programs do not interact with one another, but they are valuable bonuses in an already low-priced package.

The Magellan Light Pen System II

The Magellan is a CAD (computer-assisted-design) system targeted for use by architects, engineers, and designers. Because it was originally released as a game-port-controlled program, it was necessary for us to use this updated, interim version without the many options that were "yet to come." The experience was not unlike reviewing high-quality Swiss cheese. Documentation was adequate, and Magellan supports a generous user-update policy. Programmers will be interested in the system's powerful Amper-Pen language. Magellan's Quick-Draw is similar to Pendesigner, with these additional features: The light pen itself has a command button, as do most professional CAD systems. A Widen option thickens lines preparatory to filling. The cursor has three forms, with increasing transparency for accurate detailing. You can use the horizontal and vertical cursor locks—which support drafting modes—like an architect's parallel rule. Text is available from a catalog of fonts, cases, and sizes, including a font/shape editor.

Magellan's Rectangle option is close to a true graphics windowing system. You can draw a window quickly with the pen and then expand or contract it with pixel-by-pixel keyboard commands. Like Gibson's, the Magellan pen can erase the enclosed area, copy, stretch, stripe, and repeat an image. It

can also negate the area and perform flips and rotations. These options are important timesavers. Compared to many other CAD systems, the Magellan—once it is complete—will be a good value for the features it can provide.

Pen Pointers

Some of the trade-offs in consumer-priced light-pen systems are that they are much shakier and less precise than the professional CAD systems supported by mainframes, minis, and high-end PCs. I found both the Gibson and the Magellan creatively responsive, but far too “sticky” and “slippery.” Some functions would stick annoyingly, not releasing when commanded. The cursors would often slip, falling behind the motion of the pen. Options such as Gibson's Circle and Copy often shuddered and shimmied like a spook in *Ghostbusters*. More than ever, I appreciated the razor-sharp snap of MacPaint on the Macintosh.

Is a light pen the best computer-graphics choice for you? Sit down and test one out. Try drawing the kinds of pictures you think you'll spend most of your hours doing. A mouse or a digitizing tablet may be most comfortable for you. But there is nothing to match the one-on-one directness of the light pen, and the low-cost ones are getting better and better. Just imagine what Leonardo da Vinci would have done. . .

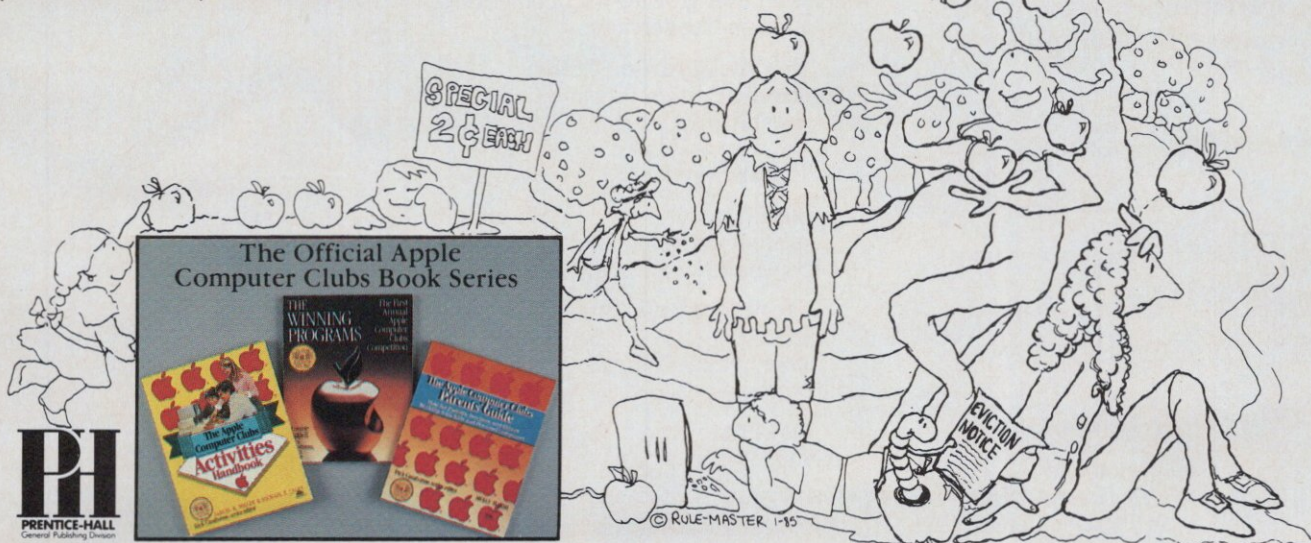
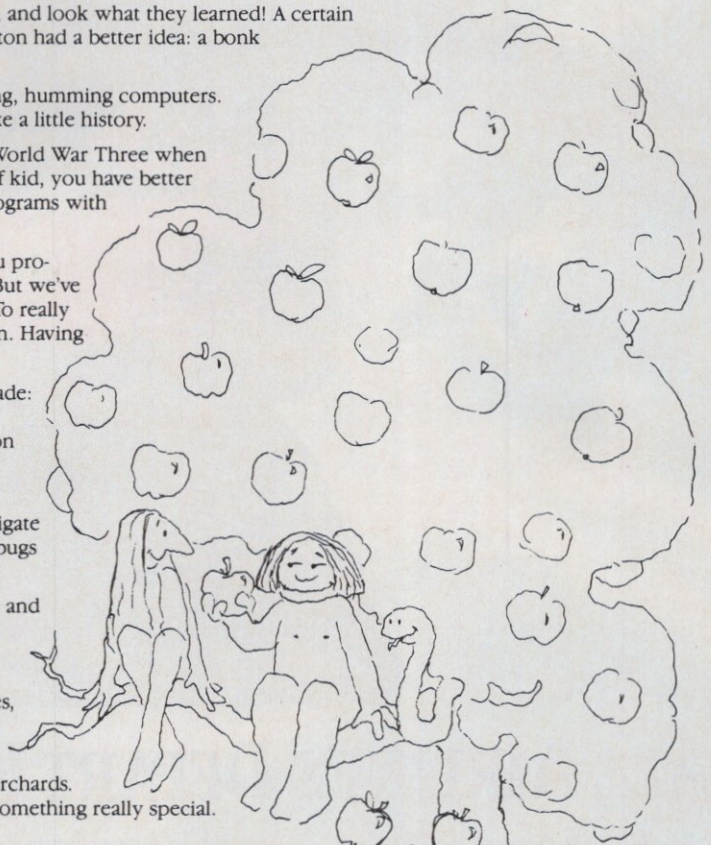

PlayNet and
telecommunications-
service update

TRACKING THE AFFORDABLE HOME SERVICE

A short time ago, representatives of a major modem manufacturer demonstrated the company's new 2400-bit-per-second (bps) modem, a marvel of telecommunications technology with special circuitry to keep your signal from being lost over Kansas. Well, at least strong enough so you didn't have to tap your modem three times and wish for a connect whine.

The highlight of their visit came when one of them mentioned that their company was a price leader in the industry and strove to undercut the competition. In fact, the representative remarked that a 1200-bps modem was fairly inexpensive to manufacture.

"Oh really? How inexpensive? Less than \$200?"

"Certainly," an assured reply came.

"Less than \$100?"

"Definitely."

"Ahem, I didn't just get off the space shuttle. Is this an April Fools' joke? No? Then, less than \$50?"

Again, an affirmative answer.

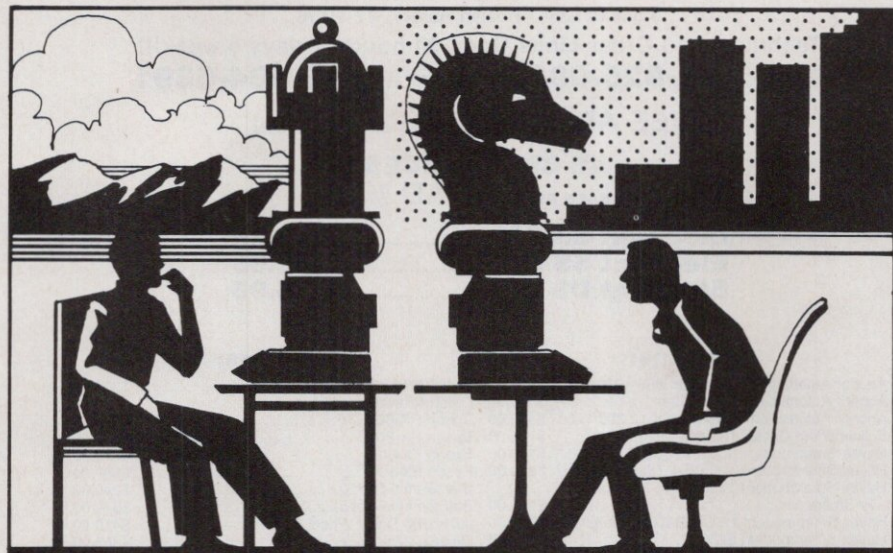
Alas, that was all they would say, and that figure probably did not include research and development, manufacturing start-up, advertising, salaries, and other necessities. Still, after I heard that figure, the retail price of a 1200-bps modem struck me as nothing less than incredible.

When I hear that a telecommunications service is going to charge \$2 per hour of connect time, on the other hand, that figure also strikes me as incredible, for the opposite reason. Is that an April Fools' joke, too?

No, it is not.

PlayNet

PlayNet, the brainchild of former General Electric research scientists Howard S. Goldberg and David Panzl, is a telecommunications service for the



home. It is just getting started, so its selection of services is a bit limited, but the potential is practically unlimited. At those prices, it should be able to bring in consumers previously put off by the high price of telecommunications.

Lest you think price is all that matters, look again. Instead of transmitting

only alphanumeric characters, PlayNet edges closer to sending full-color graphics over the phone lines. The key is your computer. Instead of functioning as a "dumb" terminal connected to a mainframe or minicomputer, your Apple acts as it should—as a smart computer.

PlayNet provides you with a system disk, which functions as communications software. You boot it and dial up PlayNet. Choosing Menu Selections whisks you to the features of the system.

The most useful feature, and the most addictive, is on-line communications. Like CB on CompuServe or Chat on The Source, Talk on PlayNet allows you to carry on live typed-in "conversations" with other subscribers. As at a big party, you can talk to all the people in the room or draw someone off to the side for a private chat. You meet the most interesting people on-line.

Electronic mail is also available. Those interesting people you meet using the Talk feature may not always be on-line at the same time you are. To keep in touch, you can send messages up to 45 lines long to their electronic mailboxes. You also own a personal mailbox. If you happen to have mail waiting for you, the word *mail* appears on your screen, and it remains there un-

til you have read your messages.

PlayNet also hosts several bulletin boards for posting public messages. Just as with electronic mail, you create a message (80 lines maximum), but the message goes up on the bulletin board and is intended for all who care to read it, instead of being addressed and sent to a particular person. You can respond to a bulletin-board message while looking at the board.

Electronic file transfers are also available. The sender uploads a file to PlayNet, and the receiver downloads it

from PlayNet. No offense meant, Federal Express, but even ZapMail is not this quick.

The other main section of PlayNet is for games. If you find an opponent via the Talk command or through electronic-mail messages, fine. Proceed to the game room. If you encounter problems finding an opponent, however, you can invoke the Locate Game Partners function. It asks you various questions about skill levels and game type and then asks other subscribers if they want to play you.

Once you've found an opponent, both of you plug a game disk into your computer. Your Apple displays full-color graphics on the screen, which is a definite improvement over alphanumeric characters. Best of all, you can send messages to the other player as you play the game. The combination of these two features makes PlayNet rather attractive.

Good graphics does not a game make, however. Quite frankly, I am a bit disappointed at the lineup of games. Don't get me wrong—I enjoy a good game of boxes or hangman, but I miss Adventure, multiplayer space-war games, and other standbys.

Let me list the games and let you decide: backgammon, Boxes (connect dots to form boxes), Capture the Flag

(i.e., Stratego), checkers, chess, Chinese checkers, contract bridge (for four), Four-In-A-Row (two-dimensional Score Four), Go, Hangman, Quad 64 (three-dimensional Score Four), Reversi (i.e., Othello), and Sea Strike (i.e., Battleship).

As you can see, all are good games, and certainly interactive enough, but rather bland. Fortunately, PlayNet is developing new games to satisfy other interests and picky reviewers.

Immediate Updates

Another unique feature of PlayNet is that you can receive updates from it as soon as they are available. Thus, when PlayNet introduces a magnificent new game, you can immediately download the program onto disk. It doesn't even have to be a formatted disk.

Cost

Finally, how much is it going to run you? I said \$2 per hour, and that is what it costs—including telecommunications charges via Telenet. Direct dialing also costs \$2 per hour, but AT&T's long-distance charges will bankrupt you. Incidentally, PlayNet bills in whole minutes and charges you for at least six minutes each time you sign on.

You must also pay a reasonable one-time membership fee of \$30 and a

monthly maintenance fee of \$6. Although I personally oppose minimum fees, PlayNet almost deserves forgiveness because of its economical \$2 hourly connect charge. Almost.

PlayNet is certainly a step in the right direction for telecommunications. It combines communications and entertainment at a price accessible to all home-computer users. It may even attract a few business users. For your non-Apple-using friends, the service is also available in Commodore 64 and IBM PCjr formats. PlayNet is worth a serious look.

Updates

Long-time *A+* readers know of the several telecommunications services I've reviewed in past issues. Many of the services I've covered have added new features lately.

NewsNet (see the April 1984 issue), which carries full-text versions of more than 200 business newsletters, has added several more.

New additions include Biotechnology Investment Opportunities, Mid-East Business Digest, Japan's Monthly Finance Review, Reports of Interest to Lawyers, Space Commerce Bulletin, International Videotex Teletext News, High Tech (West Germany), Tradevest

Ratings (stocks, bonds, and gold), and Religious News Service Daily News Reports.

CompuServe (see November 1983) expands its brokerage service and adds a portfolio-maintenance service. The 150,000 CompuServe subscribers can access stock and option quotes, place orders, and review their portfolios with Trade*Plus, providing they are also clients of one of the brokers affiliated with Trade*Plus.

CompuServe also offers video banking through VideoFinancial Services. Subscribers can conduct transactions electronically, 24 hours a day, with any bank in the United States that is connected to VideoFinancial Service's computer-gateway facilities. VideoFinancial Services is owned by a consortium of seven major banking organizations.

The Source (see November 1983) has reduced its \$100 membership fee to \$49.95. It also has added Official Airline Guide, Accu-Weather, and a membership directory.

The Source is also introducing financial-investment services through Spear Securities, an independent brokerage firm specializing in electronic-security transactions. You can receive market-

price changes automatically and place orders electronically. You can even create a "paper portfolio" and test investment strategies without risking a penny, except for the connect-time charges, of course.

ITT Dialcom (see June 1984) has announced XMAIL service, which links its electronic-mail system to the worldwide telex and telegram network. Notebook computers can replace dedicated telex terminals, thus allowing traveling executives to send messages from any phone. A single message can be delivered to as many as 500 addresses simultaneously.

TeleLearning Systems (see August 1984) is offering a complete telecommunications package for Apple II computers.

The package includes a 300-bps auto-dial/auto-answer modem, ASCII Pro software, and registration and access to more than 60 databases. The suggested retail price is \$175.

GameMaster (see December 1983) has added Cosmic Cartels, a multi-player space game of conquest. Up to 150 players vie for 800 planets. Turns are due daily. GameMaster estimates that each game should take two to three months to complete and awards one

Accounting With Back to basics

The most important factor determining the success of Peachtree's Back to Basics Accounting System may have little to do with the product itself.

It's the first—and, so far, the only—complete accounting package available for the Macintosh, with General Ledger, Accounts Receivable, and Accounts Payable modules.

Getting to market first in the personal-computer industry means a lot. It means, among other things, that most dealers will carry your product, virtually sight unseen.

There's a simple and fairly obvious reason. When a business customer walks in the door and asks, "Is there an accounting program for the Macintosh?" the dealer wants to be able to reach up on the shelf and sell a solution right away.

In addition to being first, Peachtree is also offering its accounting modules at a highly competitive price—suggested retail of \$95 each—compared with typical prices of \$400–600 per module for accounting packages on other computers. Thus, you can purchase a Macintosh *plus* an accounting system for less money than you'll spend if you buy an IBM computer alone. (Back to Basics

works with either a 512K Macintosh or a 128K system equipped with a second disk drive.)

Clearly, Peachtree has taken an aggressive marketing tack for Back to Basics, but even well-marketed software can survive only if the product itself works well. Here, Peachtree has done its homework, too.

Back to Basics is *not* the be-all and end-all of accounting programs, but it is an easy-to-learn, easy-to-use package that's well suited to small businesses. We like this product. In fact, we're already running our own books on it.

The program does, however, occasionally bend standard accounting conventions just a bit—not so far that an IRS auditor will pitch a fit, but enough that a practiced accountant may find it less than ideal.

It really isn't made for accountants, though. The General Ledger manual opens with a 56-page discussion of accounting principles. It's a good, short introduction to accounting for the neophyte, but it glosses over some of the fundamental issues that an account keeper might have to face head-on, such as determining what to treat as an expense and what to treat as a capital asset.

Once you finish that intro, you're ready to plow into the actual program—or, rather, just about ready. Although the manual is meant to stand on its own—independent of Apple's own manuals—it's easier to understand how to use the program on your Macintosh if you go through Apple's documentation first.

Back to Basics does use standard Macintosh point, click, cut, and paste procedures. You can't cut and paste from one of its reports into MacWrite, though.

The General Ledger program (which we'll focus on for the rest of the review) is designed well enough that it can also handle accounts receivable and accounts payable for a

very small business, at least until that business gets large enough to need the extra tracking information it can obtain with the additional modules.

When you start with the General Ledger, the program asks you to supply some fundamental information about your current accounting status.

At this stage, it gives you the option of protecting your data files with a password. Once you enter a password, you can't change it, which could be a problem if an unauthorized person got access to your password or if you forgot it. Therefore, you're probably better off just locking up your data disks, the same way you'd lock up paper files in a file drawer.

The program also asks you to enter a six-character identification code for your business. Count 'em—six. It won't take five (so Apple won't work), and it won't accept trailing spaces as characters. (The manual, incidentally, conveniently uses the six-character example of *Scotts*, but not all of us can be so lucky.)

An Open and Shut Case

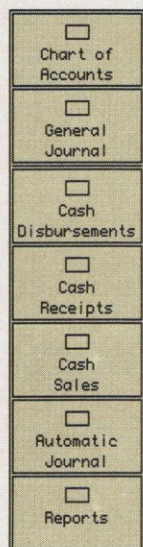


Figure 1: File drawers offer an easy way to get around in Back to Basics. Just select the one you want by pointing at it, click, and the file drawer will open.

Moving around within the program is as simple as opening and closing file drawers. On the left side of the screen, a display (see figure 1) gives you the basic options. To select one, just click on the drawer you want, and it will open to that part of the program.

Now you're ready to define your accounts and to transfer current information into them. Back to Basics starts you off with 75 standard accounts that you can add to (up to 254 in all), modify, or replace. Realistically, you'll probably need to change at least a few of these accounts to meet

your specific needs, especially if you do any kind of manufacturing. (The list omits manufacturing-specific categories such as Raw Materials and Finished Goods.)

You enter information into these accounts through the General Journal. Back to Basics requires you always to balance entries before

recording them—reminiscent of the accounting professor who said, "Why do the books balance? Because we make them balance."

This methodical entry-by-entry approach helps prevent mistakes, but here's one place where the program wavers from standard conventions: You enter all that information into a single column, rather than into separate "debit" and "credit" columns.

If you forget the number of an account, you can call it up through the Reference option on the main menu bar, which brings up a window of accounts like the one shown in figure 2.

Peachtree claims that you can make up to 4500 entries a month, but if you push it that far, the program will suffer from the one and only problem that most people encounter with the Macintosh: relatively slow disk access. Half that number of entries (or fewer) is probably a more realistic expectation, unless you have a hard disk.

Cash-based businesses such as retail operations can best utilize the next three file-drawer options: cash disbursements, cash receipts, and cash sales. Through these, you can use your Macintosh to print and track checks, as well as to track deposits and cash-register sales.

The cash-sales journal, for instance, allows you to track revenue for each of your product lines and (if you've set up the Cost of Goods account correctly) keep records on inventory for each type of product.

Whenever you make an error in

this or any other part of the program, you can void the transaction by using the pull-down edit menu. Voiding involves reversing the entry—a good feature, since it allows you to maintain a trail for an audit later.



In addition to making day-by-day entries, you can also instruct Back to Basics to make automatic adjusting entries every month for prepaid expenses such as rent, insurance, interest, and depreciation.

If you're currently maintaining records by hand, you probably realize that this kind of entry can often be a source of mistakes, simply because it's tedious to enter month after month. With Back to Basics, you need only enter the repetitive information once and let your Macintosh automatically add it each month to the ledger.

Even though it's an excellent feature, don't be overzealous in its use. You should still maintain manual depreciation schedules. Also, when you fully expense or depreciate any asset, you must remove it manually from the automatic journal. If not, the journal will continue to take out depreciation dollars on it, even though—on paper—it's worth nothing.

Closing the Books

At the end of each month, you can close the books and post your results. Once you've posted them, you can



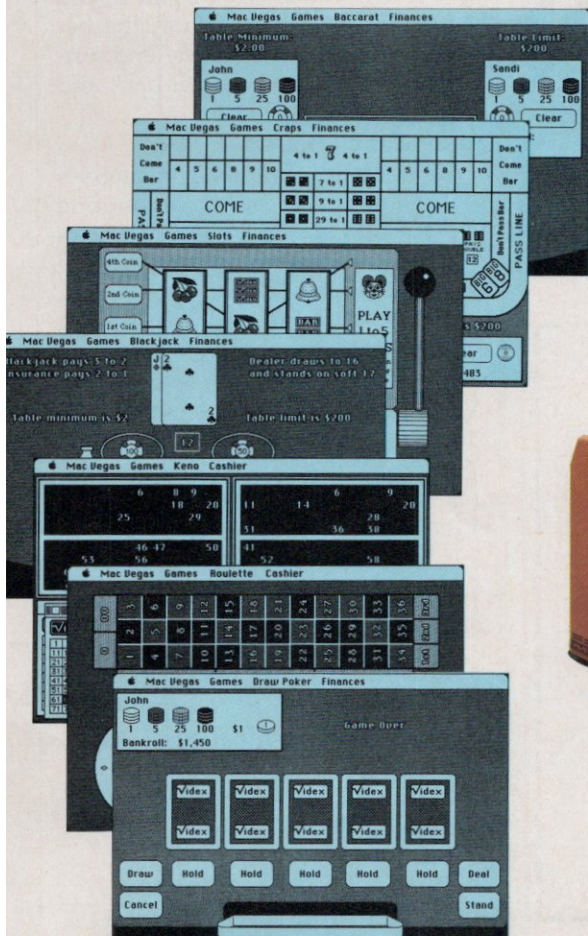

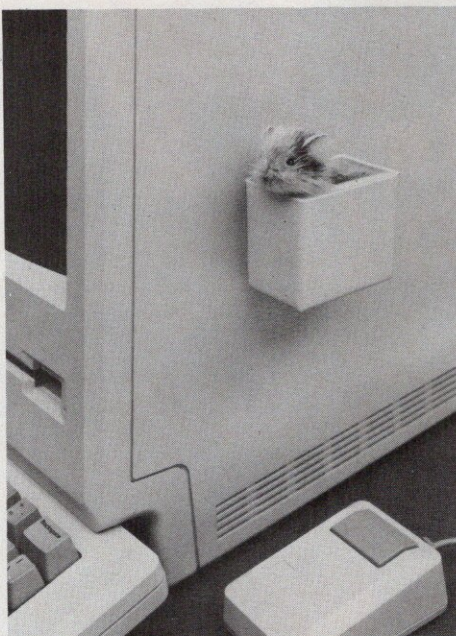

make no further changes or additions to the records. There's no reason for alarm, though, because you can create any of eight reports to review the month's transactions before closing. They include the following:

- General Journal
- Cash Disbursements Journal
- Cash Receipts Journal
- Cash Sales Journal
- Detailed General Ledger
- Departmental Income Statement
- Consolidated Income Statement
- Balance Sheet

Because these records are maintained throughout the month, you can check them any time you want to review your current status—if you need information to ask for a loan, for instance.

You'll notice one small problem with the way the reports are set up, however. You can choose either to print a report or to display it on the screen. If you choose to display it, you can only view forward from the beginning of the report to the end; unfortunately, you can't scroll back and forth through it.

Among the Winners

In summary, for small businesses that want an excellent accounting package at a fair price, Back to Basics is going to be tough to beat. It's the first, and there will be more—but, when the dust has settled, it should certainly rank among the winners. +

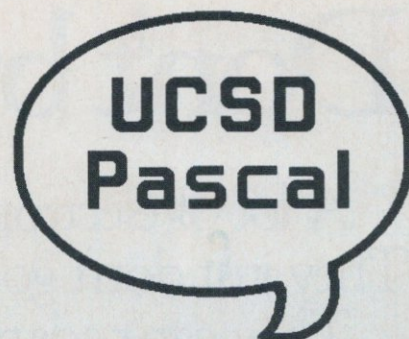



The new Mac Turbo Touch from Assimilation Process is a high-speed direct-input device that replaces a Macintosh's mouse. Measuring about 4 × 6 inches, the Turbo Touch has a smooth round ball that sits in a housing that also contains a "mouse" button to the left and right of the ball. You use it to position the pointer on your screen by spinning the ball, much as you would with a trackball on an arcade video game.

The two buttons each perform the same function as that of the regular mouse button. Because you don't have to move a mouse around on your desk, you'll save desk space and wrist and arm energy when you use the Turbo Touch, and, because of its state-of-the-art design, you'll save time when you do work that involves lots of mousing around.

The Mac Turbo Touch comes with an installation guide and two self-adhesive velcro attachment strips that you can use to secure the Turbo Touch to your Macintosh. The designers of the Turbo Touch kept left-handers in mind; you can attach it to either side of your keyboard, and the two buttons are functionally equivalent. Personally, I'd prefer not to attach it, because I sometimes like to use my Mac keyboard in my lap

(while sitting in an armchair).

If you've ever tried running a Macintosh mouse around on the arm of an overstuffed chair, you'll be grateful that the Turbo Touch doesn't move; only the ball does.

Installing the Turbo Touch involves unplugging your Macintosh mouse and plugging the Turbo Touch into the mouse port. If you want to keep your mouse available for use, you can plug it into a port on the back of the Turbo Touch.

The Turbo Touch takes a bit of getting used to. Think back to the first time you used a mouse. You probably found it awkward, but using the mouse quickly became second nature, and if you returned to using a non-mouse program, you found yourself automatically reaching for the mouse without even thinking about it.

The time you'll need to adapt to a Turbo Touch depends on your previous mouse experience. With a regular mouse, you click with your fingers and move your wrist or arm to manipulate the pointer. With the Turbo Touch, you control the ball with your fingers rather than by moving your wrist. Previous mousing involved clicking with those fingers, so you have to unlearn that motion.

I don't mean to belabor the point,

however. Adapting to a Turbo Touch is easier than learning to use chopsticks, and in about two hours I'd gotten over any awkwardness. I suspect that if you've never used a regular mouse, adapting to the Turbo Touch will be even faster.

I tried out the Turbo Touch for about three weeks with a variety of Macintosh applications. Once I'd gotten used to it, I didn't want to give it up. Personally, I liked using my thumb to do the clicking, especially when dragging through menus—it's a breeze to hold down the button and flip the ball to the item of your choice.

Although you still have to move your hand away from the keyboard to point and click, I particularly noticed the Turbo Touch's advantages when I was almost exclusively mousing: when I had written a draft of an article and was mostly editing or when I was working with graphics. The Turbo Touch literature says that you can reduce editing time considerably, and it does seem to be perceptibly faster.

If you've played with trackballs in



video games, you may be wondering about the precision of pointer movement. Does the pointer go flying across the screen and land beyond where you wanted it? I didn't have any such problems. Pointer positioning is equally effective if you want to move all the way across the screen or just a hair.

Using the Turbo Touch with Fatbits, for example, was great. Generally you want precision here, rather than a wide range of motion, and it's more efficient to move a finger than an arm. I also liked using it for entering numbers into Multiplan. I am an inveterate keyboarder, but with the Turbo Touch I found myself using it instead of some of the optional keyboard commands I've grown so attached to.

The one thing I didn't like about the Turbo Touch was the "feel" of the buttons. I had to push them harder than I did on a regular Mac, and they didn't click to tell me when I'd pushed hard enough. Assimilation Process has informed me that it is already dealing with that problem. Future production runs of the Turbo Touch will include contoured buttons, as well as a click (so the turbo

will be identical in audio feedback to the Macintosh mouse).

Inside the Turbo Touch

So what does it take to build a better cursor controller? A brand-new PIC 1652 chip developed by General Instruments; a smooth, seamless, heavy ball (made in Belgium) with a glossy surface; and eight optical sensors, among other things. I was curious to see how the motion of a hand was translated to pointer motion, so I took the bottom off my Turbo Touch to see what it looked like inside. The ball is heavier than you'd think (I'm told it would hold up for years on a pool table) and "floats" on three free-wheeling gears. Two plastic "encoder" wheels are positioned at right angles to turn as the ball turns. If you move the ball left or right, one wheel moves; if you move it up and down, the other one moves; and if you move diagonally, both move.

Each encoder wheel has holes in its rim, and its four optical sensors keep track of how many times light flashes through the holes as the wheel turns. Thus, the displacement your hand causes by moving the ball is transferred into a measurement of light that controls the cursor. The

combination of the chip and the optical sensors makes the Turbo Touch function faster and more efficiently than other mice.

Assimilation Process is currently working on versions of the Turbo Touch for the Apple IIe and IIc, and company personnel use the current Turbo Touch with their own Macintoshes. Whether the world beats a path to their doorstep remains to be seen, but I think they have managed to improve on the mouse. **+**

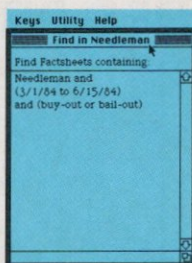

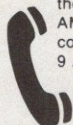

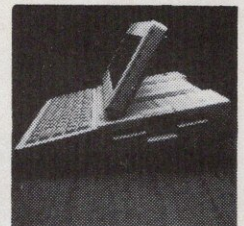

Making It All Add Up

Accounting firms won't take a shaky bet. That's why it meant so much when the international accounting firm of Peat, Marwick, Mitchell & Co. took a chance on an unknown computer such as the Macintosh, a computer that wasn't completed, wasn't even officially announced to the public. The Macintosh actually won out over industry giants such as IBM and Hewlett-Packard.

Now, a little more than a year after Peat Marwick threw its support behind the Macintosh, the computer has become an integral part of all of Peat Marwick's auditing operations. The company plans eventually to use the Macintosh in each of the 18,000 audits it performs each year. The bottom line: The Macintosh has given the auditors speedier number-crunching and clearer data analysis than their previous equipment did. The Mac has also given them the freedom to think about important points, rather than laboriously check addition—and although it doesn't show up on the bottom line, the easy-to-use Macintosh has made Peat Marwick auditors computer-eager.

SeaCas

The Macintosh entered Peat Marwick under the auspices of the company's program called Systems Evaluation Approach—Computerized Audit Support, or SeaCas, instituted in late 1982. Two years earlier, Peat Marwick's board of directors had urged all the firm's groups, which include management-consulting and tax-advisory services along with the audit and accounting group, to figure out how to computerize their work efficiently. The firm's decision makers didn't leap into computerization without first looking at the matter with ex-

treme care. First, says Richard D. Webb, partner in charge of SeaCas, they divided up their auditing method into 40-odd steps, examining all the tasks an auditor had to do and deciding whether and how well the tasks could be automated. "In some cases it might have been as simple as writing a memo; in other cases it might have been some statistical analysis. We categorized them into areas for which we thought we could develop a computer program or buy a program," says Webb.

The requirements of these tasks in priority order formed the foundation for a hardware search. Peat Marwick already used IBM mainframes and Datapoint terminals, and the Consulting Group decided the IBM PC would be its primary microcomputer. The Audit Group, empowered to make an independent selection, narrowed its choice down first to Apple, Hewlett-Packard, Xerox, IBM, and Direct—and then to only Apple and Hewlett-Packard.

John D. Collins, a partner in charge of auditing, long-range planning, and research, says the Audit Group decided to go with Apple after visiting the Macintosh "in utero" in the spring of 1982. Collins told *Management Technology* magazine that Apple "plopped a styrofoam box down on the table and announced, 'This is a Mac.'" A slightly unprepossessing beginning, perhaps, but after learning about the Macintosh's capabilities, user interface, and technological advances, Peat Marwick signed

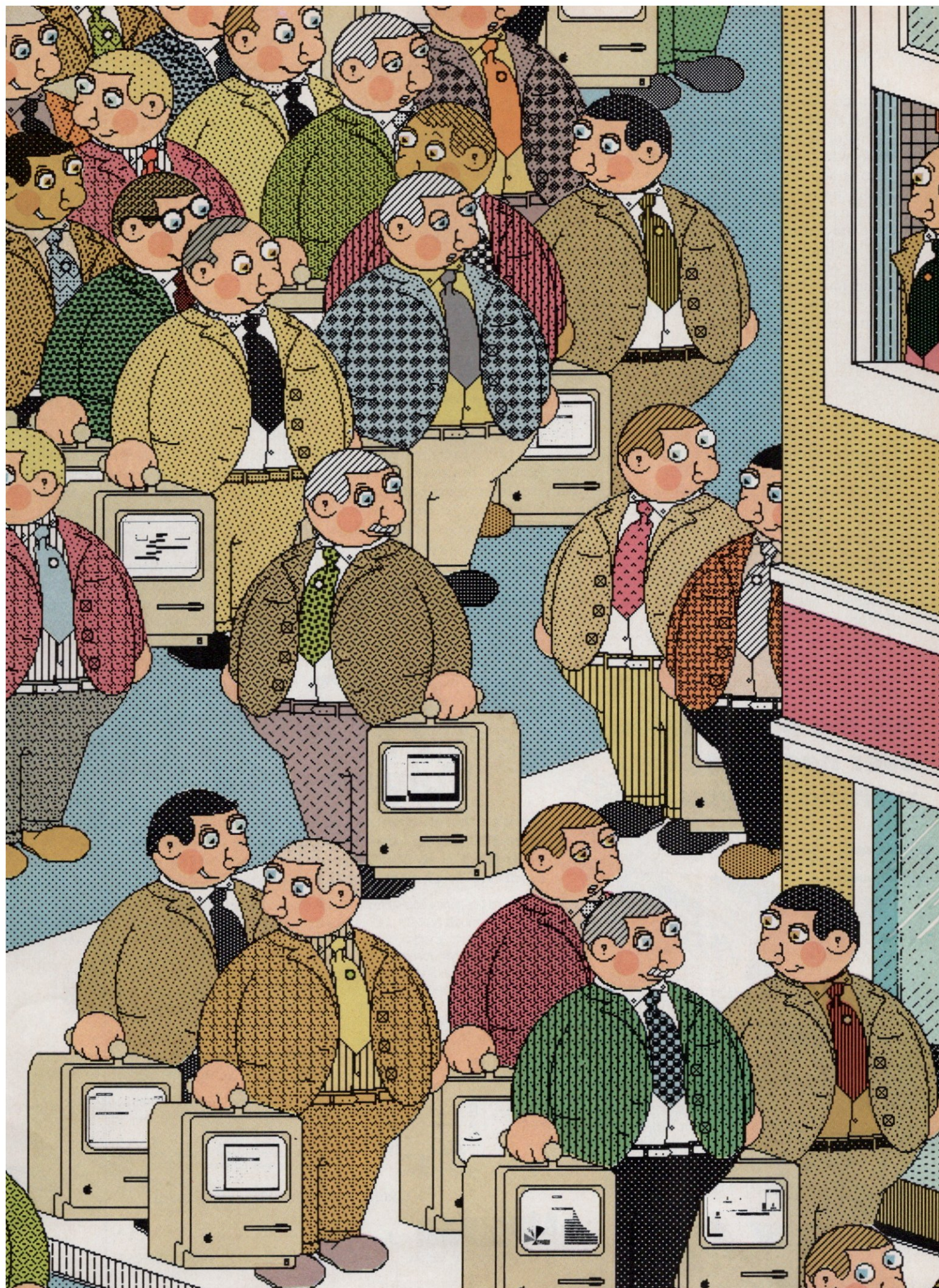
up with Apple in May 1982. SeaCas, too, wouldn't be announced for several more months. Peat Marwick secretly took the delivery of several Macintoshes to prepare in-house software and training materials.

In November 1982, the firm introduced the SeaCas program, not with the Macintosh, but with the Apple III. Peat Marwick purchased about 400 Apple IIIs as a kind of opening wedge into the microcomputer world. Every office received at least one III, one-third of the IIIs going to offices outside the United States.

With the IIIs, the auditors stuck their toes into the water. Webb explains that the firm encouraged people to use the III and supported it with in-house software and commercial packages such as Word Juggler and Quick File III. Each office was reminded, however, that the III would have to justify its cost within 12 to 18 months, "because there would be something else coming down the road—we couldn't tell them what, but there would be something."

Deciding how many Macintoshes to order once the machine hit the market took some figuring. Peat Marwick knew it wanted every senior, or in-charge, accountant to have a Macintosh—naturally, the audits were their first priority, and the in-charge accountants accompanied every audit.

Then, says Webb, "we also said that if these machines were in the field all the time, there ought to be some machines in the office for management. The estimate we ended up with was one machine for every in-charge accountant and one for every audit partner. That worked up to 2400 machines."

The Macintosh Arrives

Peat Marwick made the announcement on January 24, 1983, that henceforth it planned to use a portable microcomputer—the Macintosh—on every client audit.

By the time the

company submitted its actual Macintosh order in March 1984, the number requested had leapt up to 3456.

"That told us that there was a high level of enthusiasm," Webb remembers. The number of orders has continued to increase. "I keep signing orders for more machines, and that's how it's been for weeks!" exclaims Webb. At this writing, the ratio of Macintoshes to Audit Group employ-

ees is about 4000 machines for more than 7000 employees.

Where the Macintosh Fits In

Peat Marwick has 97 offices in the United States alone. Each office runs its own show as far as the Macintosh goes. Some went hog-wild over the machine; others merely appreciate its presence.

The company assigned one partner in each office to be the local Sea-Cas coordinator, the general factotum in charge of training staff and answering questions. Larger offices in such cities as Los Angeles or New York may have several coordinators, to accommodate more personnel.

SeaCas serves as an umbrella for several types of computer support. First, it includes proprietary software, such as System 2190 and its Financial

Statement Subsystem, with Basic Financial Statement and Consolidated Financial Statement (BFS and CFS)—the audit-retrieval package the group chiefly uses on IBM and Burroughs mainframes. Second, the Audit Group supports six commercial personal-computer packages: Microsoft's Multiplan, Chart, and File; and MacWrite, MacPaint, and MacTerminal.

Finally, the

Audit Group uses various template programs that mix and match with the other two types of software. For example, a template might allow an auditor to take a client's financial statement, transfer it out of BFS into Multiplan, calculate some ratios there, cut and paste those ratios with Microsoft Chart, cut and paste the charts into MacWrite, and then prepare a report. Templates in use include packages for community banks, statistical analyses, deferred taxes, and "standard letters" for standard documents prepared during an audit.

The Macintosh is used in all three sections of SeaCas. At the mainframe level, the Macintosh works with System 2190. The auditor loads the 2190 software onto the client's mainframe and writes a short program to carry out necessary calculations, after which the machine produces a report.

Before the Macintosh arrived, this process had to wait until long after working hours, to prevent the audit from interrupting the normal stream of data processing. Now the Macintosh can take care of these calculations

whenever the computer is free, however, and auditors can find the information waiting for them in the morning, stored in the Mac's disks.

Martha Marcon, audit partner in charge of SeaCas at the firm's Los Angeles office, notes that "the Macintosh works really well with the Financial Statement Subsystem." The auditors don't always use it that way, she adds, because some clients give them the information from FSS themselves. Peat Marwick trains many large or frequent clients to use FSS

and then audits the information received.

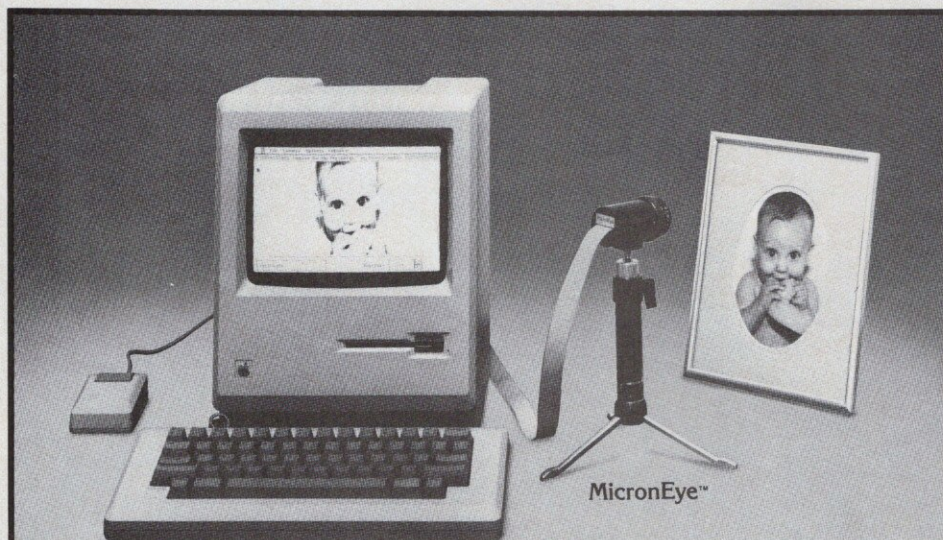
In general, the auditors use the Macintosh in every phase and facet of a field audit. It can prepare a budget, post and list the time spent on the several phases of an audit, and transmit data over phone lines.

A Day in the Field

Webb unreels a long list of functions the Macintosh might perform in a day's work:

"The Mac goes out, along with its printer, in its custom-made bag to the engagement site. We hook the modem up. You can check the electronic-mail system for messages. You can check what's happening with a job in Frankfurt because it's related to what you're doing in Chicago. You can work with MacWrite to give instructions to other auditors on the engagement.

"You can prepare a long memo for someone's electronic mailbox or use Multiplan spreadsheets for various kinds of analyses for which you might have used pencil and paper before. Or you might use the proprietary software to get data ready to prepare financial statements or to consolidate company subsidiaries into the consolidated financial statement. If you're doing a referral engagement, for example, for a parent company in Frankfurt, you can prepare data to send by electronic mail so they can download it into their financial statements there. Or you can put together a graphics presentation for the board of directors, using MacPaint. You can even teach the client how to use the machine or software so they can prepare some of the schedules for you."

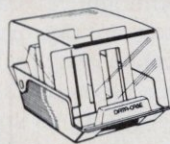
How the Mac Changes an Audit

Jody Lindell, partner in charge of SeaCas in Peat Marwick's San Francisco office, says, "I was skeptical at first, but the Mac really changed the way we do things. It's one of the most

powerful tools we've been given in a long time—it could easily have been abused.

"Maybe 10% of our audit engagements were touched by an Apple III," she adds, "but now 50 to 70% of our engagements in this initial year are in some way using the Macintosh."

Lindell worried at first that people would begin to computerize things that didn't need to be computerized, wasting time and using the machine as a toy. But, she says, "they're really using the computers in a positive way."

Marcon says that the Macintoshes help a great deal in data analysis—auditors can do more as-if analyses, modifying and changing numbers in a budgeting or forecasting approach, rather than spending most of their time mechanically checking columns of figures.

"We see a marked improvement in people's ability to interpret, analyze, and understand what we're doing, rather than spending so much of their time preparing the data," she says.

Most Peat Marwick offices use the Macintosh to prepare the multitudes of reports, letters, and memos necessary to complete an audit properly. The graphics capabilities of the Mac haven't come into play much yet, probably because of the timing of the release of Microsoft Chart, says Marcon. It arrived right at the start of the firm's "busy season," which runs from September to March, and auditors didn't have time to learn its ins and outs.

Webb predicts that the graphics work with the Mac "will be a real sleeper for us. It's not one of the areas that we've pressed this year, but in the coming years, people will see that it will have some real benefits, in terms of being able to visualize and analyze what's behaving how with a particular client."

"The Apple III was too complex. It was for the power user," Marcon asserts. "The Mac is for the casual user. The only frustration I've heard is that one staff develops the expertise, they think it's too slow—they don't remember that they used to have to sit there with a calculator."

All the members of the audit group at Peat Marwick have received some kind of training on the Macintosh. Most of the training is what Webb calls "implemented self-study training." The first 15 to 16 hours of training usually takes place in a class-

room, not necessarily as lectures, but as videotapes. Individuals pace themselves through the process, rather than being led by an instructor. "We have the classroom set up so you can turn to the person next to you, or to the instructor, and ask a question."

The first 13 hours familiarize the students with Basic Financial Statement software; the next three hours introduce them to Multiplan. After that, they spend 16 to 20 hours more on Multiplan and then perhaps a one- to two-hour group session of brainstorming and discussion, says Webb: 33 hours of required training in all.

Senior accountants receive even more training, including more intensive Multiplan work or ventures into the various Peat Marwick templates.

B

ecause of the SeaCas program, Peat Marwick inadvertently got into the business of evaluating Macintosh financial software. As a result, says Webb, he's developed a good perspective on current financial packages for the Macintosh, and he's developed a few pet peeves.

According to Webb, a lot of companies aren't following the Macintosh user-interface guidelines. "They're trying to make their product unique at the exact wrong level—using their own editing conventions or not making use of the pull-down menus." Webb grimaces that he is still smarting from the effort Peat Marwick had to make so that its own software would conform to those guidelines.

Peat Marwick is working on additional templates and constantly evaluating software that comes across its desks from outside sources.

The reaction at Peat Marwick to the introduction of the Macintosh has been overwhelmingly favorable. Everyone seems to want one or access to one. "I'd expected a reaction like 'Oh, you ivory-tower types at the executive office are sending us something else we can't use,'" says Webb, "but I haven't heard that from anybody. In our firm, people don't use things if they don't pay off."

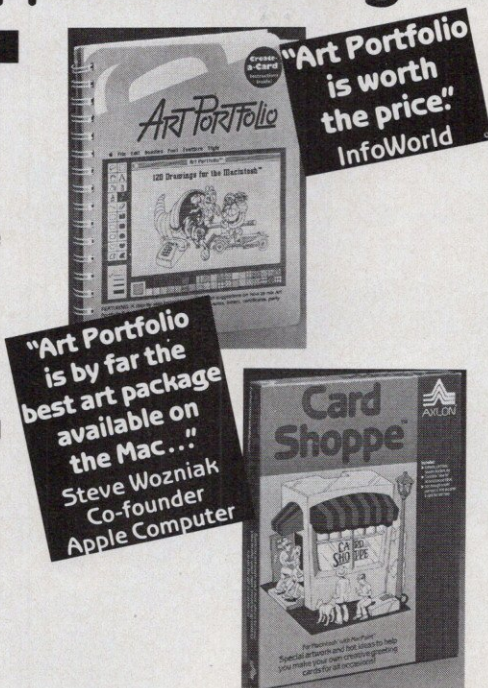

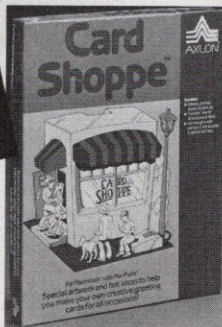

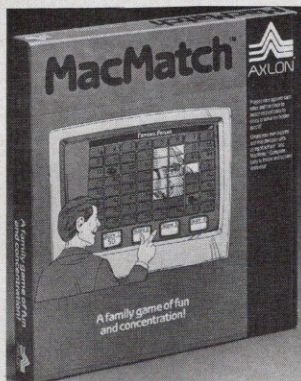

TO C OR NOT TO C

*Two C compilers
for the Mac*

Since we've looked at Macintosh assembly-language programming for the last few months, I think it's best to give equal time to some other languages that are appearing on the Mac scene. This month we'll look at two C compilers.

C is a language usually associated with the UNIX operating system developed by Bell Labs. Indeed, UNIX was written in C.

To the uninitiated, C looks remarkably like an abbreviated Pascal, but it is much more. C is better suited to low-level programming (e.g., operating systems and other programs that are usually written in assembly language) than is Pascal.

More to the point, C is much better suited to the Macintosh environment than is Pascal. I say this because you have to perform minor feats of magic in Pascal to address the pointers and pointers to pointers—*handles*, in Apple jargon—that the Macintosh ROM routines use. In C, however, manipulation of pointers is straightforward. Referencing a Macintosh handle in C is as simple as declaring a pointer to a pointer.

C gives you the same programming structures as Pascal does—do loops, for loops, while structures, and begin/end notation (written as curly

brackets—{ }—instead of BEGIN and END). C also has a versatile battery of variable types, many of them similar to Pascal variable types. And, as in Pascal, C allows you to write your own functions and maintain a library of them for incorporation into your programs.

Many software developers have recently switched to the C language for program development. Microsoft's programmers, for example, do most of their programming on a mini-computer in C and then fine-tune the results when they port the code to a particular microcomputer. Ashton-Tate recently rewrote dBASE II in C, the result being dBASE III. MicroPro rewrote WordStar in C and released it as WordStar 2000. Other software creators working in C include Digital Research (of CP/M fame), Lotus Development Corporation (1-2-3), and Software Publishing Corporation.

Why are so many major software firms switching to C? Mostly because it gives them a structured language whose resultant code is almost as fast as assembly-language code. Almost as important, C code has a reputation for versatility—you can easily rewrite programs you wrote for one machine for use with another, without having to start from scratch. C is also known

for small, fast programs.

With this background in mind, let's take a closer look at two Cs for the Macintosh.

A Hippo of a C

My personal favorite of the two Cs currently available for the Macintosh comes from a company with a rather intimidating name: Hippopotamus Software.

For your money you get a 5×7-inch binder packed with documentation and a single copy-protected Macintosh disk.

The manual reads easily; gives a simple, if not eloquent, explanation of Hippo-C; and includes documentation on how to use many of the Macintosh ROM routines from Hippo-C. The second half of the manual is a listing of the on-line tutorial available in Hippo-C.

A good C compiler consists of the full implementation discussed by Kernighan and Ritchie in their book *The C Programming Language* (Prentice-Hall, 1978). Hippo-C seems to be a full K&R implementation. The C library included with Hippo-C con-

tains the usual file routines (fread and so on); fprintf; scanf; string-manipulation functions (strcpy and so on); the usual is_ functions; and even the memory functions malloc, calloc, and free. In my short experience with Hippo-C, I've yet to find any deviations from K&R's definition of C, other than the extensions the Macintosh requires.

The Macintosh ROM functions that come with Hippo-C work as expected, although the documentation needs better information about what types of variables each function expects (the manual suggests you consult *Inside Macintosh*, but remember that Pascal and C data types are not necessarily always treated the same way).

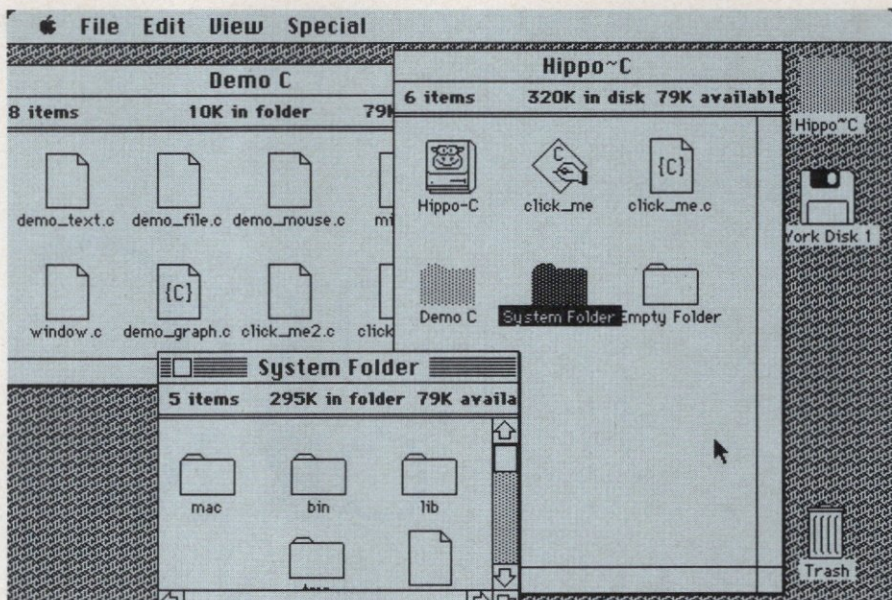


Figure 1: This is how the Macintosh desktop looks with the Hippo-C compiler active.

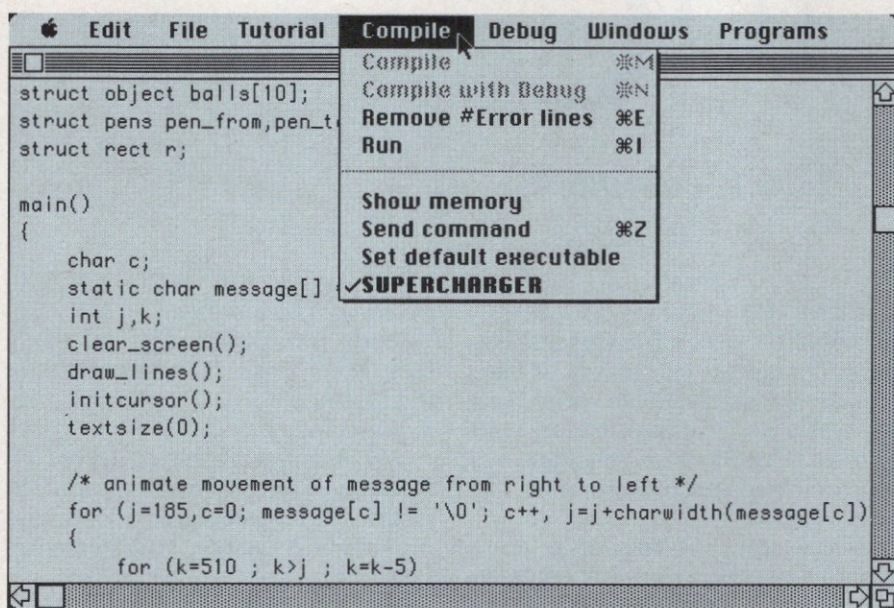


Figure 2: Hippo-C with the Compile menu pulled down

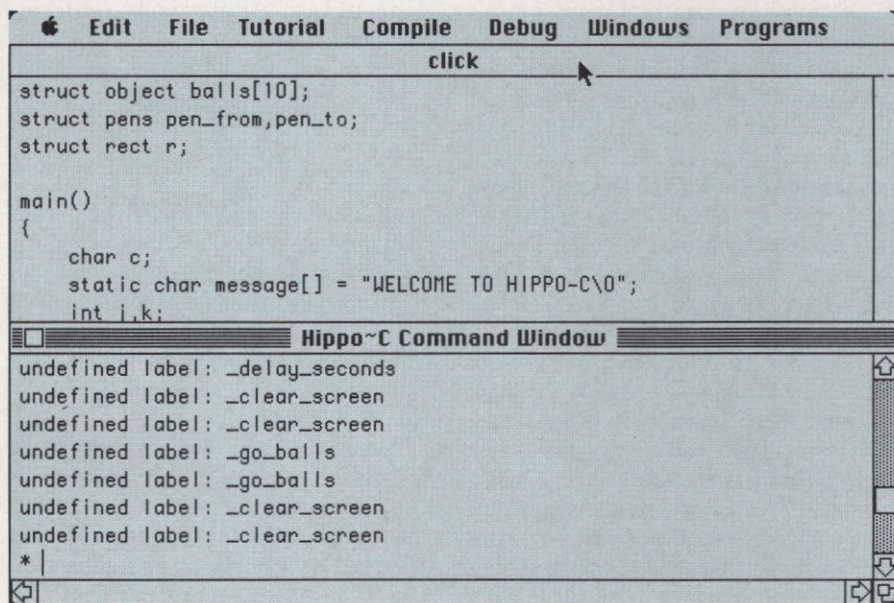


Figure 3: The Hippo-C compiler gives you messages.

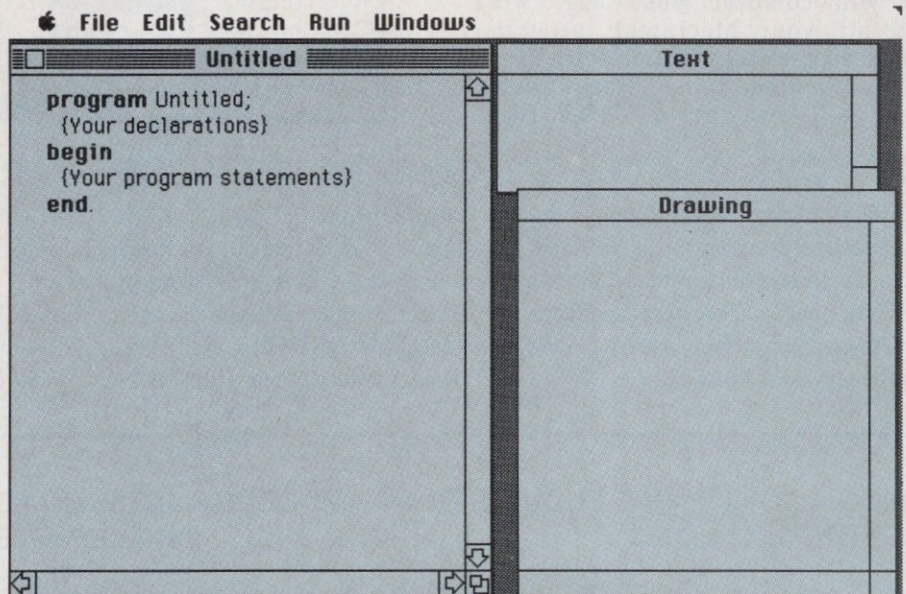


Figure 1: You'll see the Macintosh Pascal desktop when you get started.

Figure 1 shows the Macintosh desktop with Hippo-C active. It looks reasonably Maclike, but looks can be deceiving.

Apparently Hippo-C is written in an operating system known as—you guessed it—Hippo Operating System, or HOS. HOS looks like a scaled-down UNIX for the Macintosh. You edit your program using a MacWrite-like editor and then save it, just as you'd expect. Next, you pull down the Compile menu and select the Compile option (see figure 2).

A

ll this time you've actually been working in a "shell" around HOS, which you'll discover when you begin compiling and get messages from the compiler (see figure 3).

The Hippo-C icon on the Macintosh desktop turns out to be a 2K file that starts up that shell. So, although your programs in Hippo-C Level 1 look like Macintosh applications, they're actually not. No problem, I suppose, but a bit disconcerting to Macintosh users at first.

Level 2 to Come

Hippopotamus has announced a Level 2 C compiler for early 1985. It will create stand-alone, double-clickable application programs much larger than what the Level 1 compiler allows (Hippo suggests that Level 1 programs be limited to 200 lines of

Pages may be stored on disk as full documents (layout plus contents) or as "shells" (layout only). The latter facility allows the reuse of page designs or the building of an inventory of layouts for future projects.

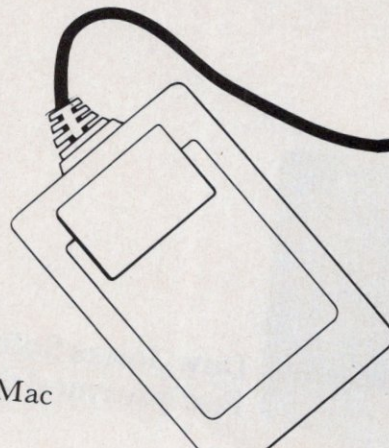

code in each linkable module). Also included in Level 2 are floating-point functions, an assembler, and an optimizing compiler.

Softworks C

Another C compiler available for the Macintosh is Softworks C.

Softworks C is an adaptation of Whitesmith's 68000 C, a well-known and respected implementation, albeit not necessarily the fastest C compiler around.

T

he Software C version that I tested was a preliminary version, and it showed. Softworks Limited is selling this "prerelease" version at the same price as it will ask for the eventual release version. Early buyers get one free update, plus low-cost updates later on. Included with the prerelease version of Softworks C that I received was a beta-test copy of the Apple assembler.

The package I received consisted of three unprotected, unlabeled disks and mimeographed documentation in a three-ring binder. The documentation consists primarily of a reprint of Whitesmith's C manual, but not all of this manual is appropriate to the Macintosh version of the language (Softworks includes documentation on portions of the language appropriate only to UNIX).

All of this doesn't sound overly professional, but the compiler itself certainly is. You create your C source code with the editor that comes with the Apple assembler (Edit). Next, you run the compiler, whose icon looks like a factory. The compiler makes three passes at the code (the Hippo-C compiler seems to be a two-pass compiler), creating an assembly-language file. You then use the Apple assembler and linker to create an executable program.

I rearranged the files Softworks provides to create four disks that were more compatible with the way I work, but you can get by with the three that Softworks provides.

Because Softworks C uses the Apple assembler, using the resource compiler to combine C program code and your resource file—a problem with the Hippo-C Level 1 compiler—is easy.

A nice touch is that Softworks sup-

plies as much source code as it can with the package (the firm is prohibited from providing any of Whitesmith's source code). The ROM interface routines are supplied in source code, as are some of the other library routines. Since Softworks C also creates true assembly-language code, you'll also be able to do some fine-tuning on the program code that you create.

Whitesmith's requires that you pay a one-time fee of \$25 for any program you create with Softworks C that you sell or distribute to others. Hippo-C has no licensing fee, however.

Softworks C would be great with better and more thorough documentation. As it stands, it is usable, although you'll have to discover many of its nuances by experimentation.

C What I Mean?

Of all the languages I've examined so far for the Macintosh, both the implementations of C discussed above come right at the top of the list. At present, here's how I rank the different ways to program a Macintosh:

1. MacForth
2. Hippo-C/Softworks C
3. Apple assembler
4. MacPascal
5. MacBASIC
6. Microsoft BASIC
7. Lisa Pascal

If you're a beginning programmer, look to MacPascal, MacBASIC, or Microsoft BASIC, but if you're an experienced programmer, take a close look at these C compilers. +

Part II

Pascal Primer

for the Macintosh

This month we are bringing you the second part of our two-part excerpt from the Waite Group's Pascal Primer for the Macintosh by Dan Shafer, which is being published by New American Library under the Plume/Waite imprint in 1985. Last month's excerpt, "Your First Pascal Program," showed you how to write a simple Pascal program on the Macintosh. This month's excerpt, chapter 3 of the book, delves further into the Pascal language and explains important elements of Pascal programming.

This chapter introduces two crucial Pascal programming concepts: structure and variables. Mastering these concepts will make learning the rest of the language easier. Structure and variables are used very differently in Pascal than they are in BASIC. Thus, non-programmers sometimes have an advantage over BASIC programmers when it comes to learning Pascal—they have nothing to unlearn.

SOME ELEMENTS OF PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Any Pascal program has a defined structure or format that contains a number of elements. To begin with, we'll focus on the three simplest and most obvious elements of Mac Pascal program structure.

Now, fire up your Mac, get Pascal running, and let's get started! Make sure your screen looks like figure 1.

Before we do anything else, take a quick look at your Macintosh Pascal desktop. Notice that three components are already provided in the Program window. One line says *Program* and is now followed by the word *Untitled*, which calls our attention to the first element of Pascal program structure, which involves the necessity of

naming things such as programs.

The second thing you may notice is a line in the window suggesting that you're going to give the program some *declarations*. These are the second basic components of program structure that we'll look at in this chapter.

Finally, there are two Pascal keywords shown in boldface type: *Begin* and *End*. These two words are separated in the Program window by this line:

Your program statements

This line suggests that between the *Begin* and the *End*, you're going to be typing one or more program *statements*. This pair of statements—*Begin* and *End*—is the final major component of Pascal program struc-

ture we'll be looking at during this discussion.

Now let's move to the first program-structure component: naming things in Macintosh Pascal.

GIVING YOUR CREATION A NAME

When you create a program in the window labeled *Untitled*, get rid of the unceremonious name *Untitled* by naming your program.

What's in a Name?

A program name is actually a Pascal *identifier*. Macintosh Pascal uses identifiers throughout programs to identify things such as constants, types, variables, procedures, functions, programs, and fields within records.

There are three simple rules for identifiers in Pascal. They apply to program names and to all other identifiers.

Start with a Letter

First, identifiers must begin with a letter. That rules out the use of numbers and all special symbols as the first character in a Macintosh Pascal

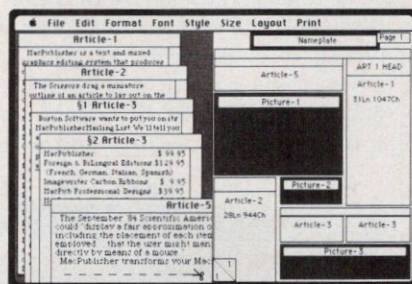
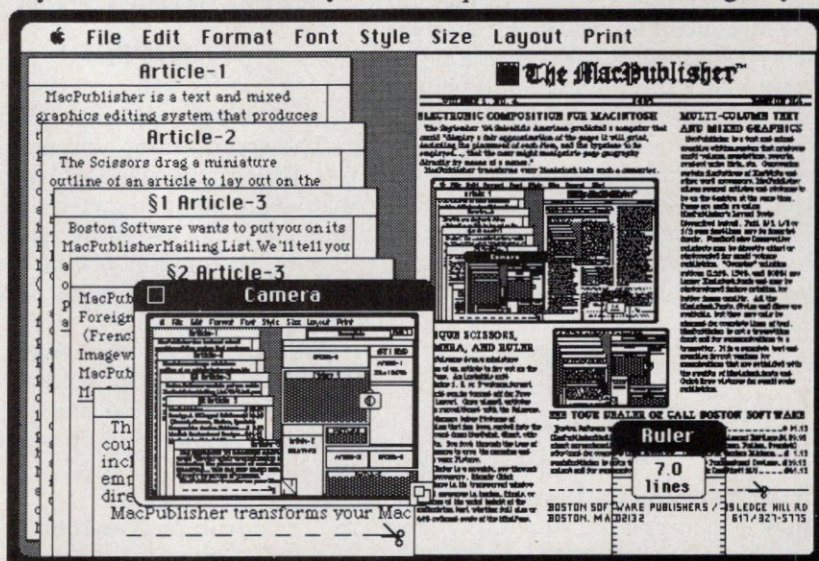

identifier. Special symbols are characters such as @, %, and &, which cannot be called either letters or numbers; there are many such special symbols on the Mac. Numbers may be used in identifiers, but they may not be the first character. Special symbols should not be used at all.

No More than 255 Characters

Second, an identifier may contain up to 255 characters. Macintosh Pascal is far more generous in this regard than most implementations of BASIC and Pascal on home computers, which place severe restrictions on names. In fact, early versions of BASIC for personal computers would permit identifiers in a program to be only *one letter* long! Even today, many versions of Pascal allow identifiers with no more than eight characters. Some versions of BASIC have two-character limits.

So what? Well, it's hard to remember, six months after we wrote a program, that the identifier called N1 meant *first name* and the one called N2 meant *last name*. For all we know, they might have meant *nest*, *nerd*, or even something entirely unrelated to the letter N. But we would have a hard time being confused by a program named First Name or Last Name.

Mac Pascal shows its generosity about names in another way, too. Each character of the 255 is significant or meaningful to Macintosh Pascal. This is a contrast to some other systems, which allow a long string of characters in identifiers but count only, say, the first two as significant. Such systems will read the identifiers Mycat and Mydog as the same thing. Mac Pascal won't. In Macintosh Pascal, even the two identifiers in figure 2 would be differentiated from one another.

Macintosh Pascal's design allows us to use meaningful words and terms as identifiers. Take advantage of its generosity and give meaningful names to all the things in your programs that need identifiers. Doing so will permit easy understanding and modification of the programs in later weeks or months.

No Spaces Allowed!

The third rule about Macintosh Pascal names is that each one must

look like a single word. Notice that in the two very long names in figure 2, *no spaces* were left between the parts. Instead, underlines connected them. All the words could have been run together, as in AnIdentifierNamingajojobidlastmonth, but that would have been far less readable. It's better to break up long names with underlines, or with capital letters as we do in this book (AnIdentifierNaming...). In any case, never use spaces. Mac Pascal will break an identifier with a space in it into two names at the space. Strange things will then happen as the Mac tries to do something with the second "name."

COMMENTS: WHAT THOSE FUNNY BRACKETS ARE FOR

The next part of the program skeleton contains the words *Your declarations* between two funny-looking curly brackets. We can put anything we want between two curly brackets in a Pascal program, and the program will simply ignore it all. "But, wait!" you may be saying. "What good does it do to put something into a program that the program is going to ignore?" Good question!

The brackets permit us to include, inside the program, notes to ourselves and to others who may want to know how the program works. These notes, called "comments," describe what is going on in the program. Get accustomed to using them frequently and liberally in programs you intend

to save for later use. Use them especially in longer programs, where they can describe what the various sections do and how they do it.

For reasons that will become clearer in a few moments, we're going to save our discussion of the section of the program hinted at by the phrase "Your declarations" until *after* we've discussed the third major program-structure element: the Begin-End pair. **Begin at the Begin**

The Begin-End pair is an important structure in Pascal programming. All the parts of a Pascal program that *do* things must appear between a Begin statement and an End statement.

In the program on the Pascal desktop you see two Begin-End pairs. Most Pascal programs contain several Begin-End pairs. You can recognize where each part of a program begins and ends by looking down the program listing and finding the pairs. The Begin-End pair structure is intuitive (that is, it feels "natural" to talk about program sections that begin and end) and also quite useful. It is one of the features that has made Pascal such a popular language.

What if You Break the Rule?

Let's take a look at what will happen if we forget this Begin-End-pair rule in writing a Pascal program. The result will be instructive.

First, go back to the desktop that looks like figure 1. The easy way to do this is simply to quit Pascal from the File menu and then reselect the Mac Pascal icon from the main Macintosh desktop.

Now press Return seven times so the whole Pascal program skeleton

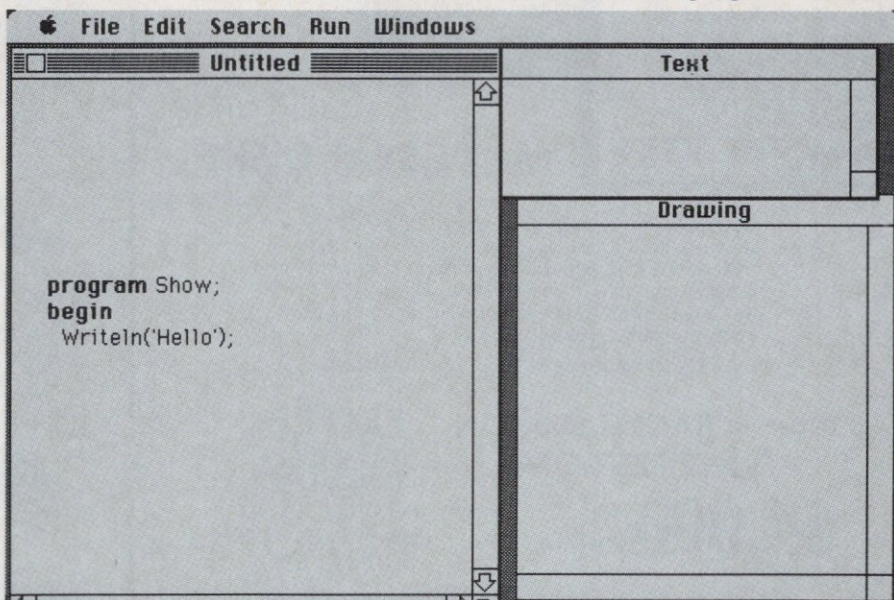


Figure 3: The desktop with the Show program typed in

moves down in the Untitled window. You're doing this because we're going to cause a Bug box to cover up part of the top of the screen, but we still want to be able to see the program.

Now type the following program, inserting it in the appropriate place in the program skeleton. It's a good idea to delete the comment lines contained between the curly brackets (although leaving them in place doesn't harm anything).

```
program Show;
begin
  Writeln('Hello');
```

Be sure the desktop looks like figure 3. Find the Begin. Notice that there is no End in sight.

OK, are you ready for our first bold, revolutionary attempt at breaking the laws of Pascal? Run that program, using the Go option from the Run menu. (From now on, any time we say "Run the program," we mean use the Go option from the Run menu.)

If all failed as expected, the Mac beeped, and a new box appeared at the top of the desktop, saying

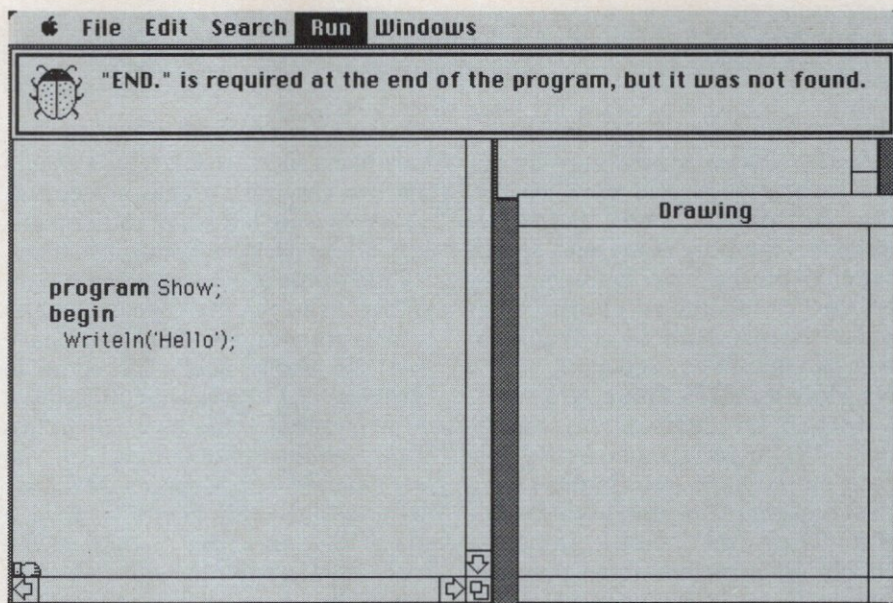


Figure 4: Macintosh Pascal's way of showing you that the program had a bug

Figure 4 shows two strong hints that Pascal didn't understand something.

The Dreaded Bug Box

The new box at the top of your desktop is called a Bug box; it even has a little bug in it. Make the Bug box go away (by clicking anywhere

inside the box) so we can fix the bug. The "thumbs down" sign will stay in place until you begin editing the program.

Go into the Program window and add the word *End.* to the program. (Be sure to include the period, or you'll get another Bug box.) Now run the program, and everything should be fine. You should end up with a screen

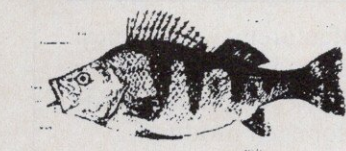

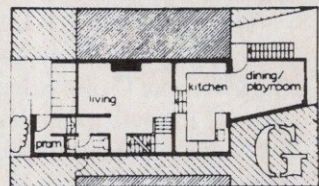

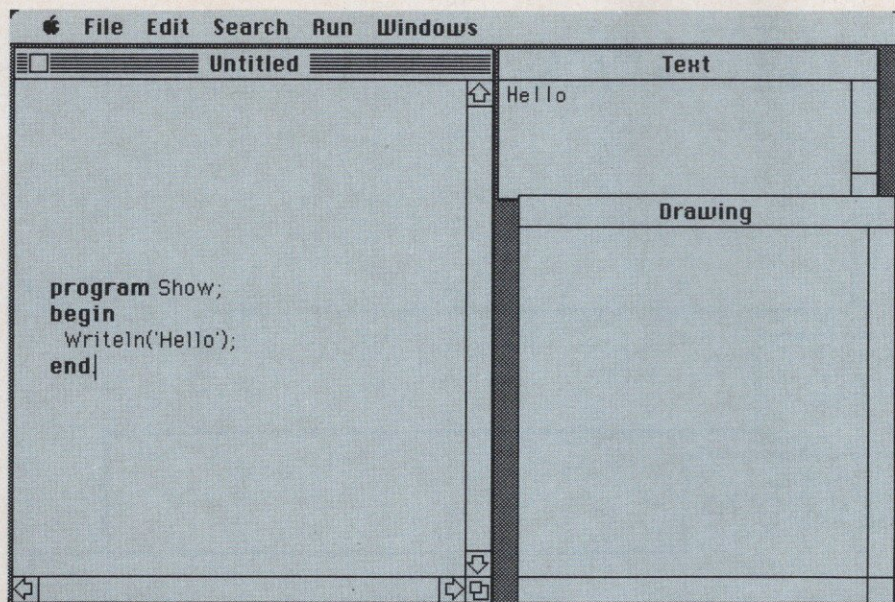


Figure 5: After you add End., your screen should look like this.

that looks like figure 5, above.

The Rules, Then, Are . . .

Every Pascal program will have a minimum of one Begin-End pair. Most programs will have several or even a great many such pairs, marking the starting and stopping points of various groups of Pascal statements. Anywhere a Begin is needed, an End must also be present.

Now we're ready to move on to a discussion of the last major component of Macintosh Pascal program structure: declarations.

Anything to Declare?

Let's return now to the section of the Macintosh Pascal program that begins with the comment line about "declarations." What are we supposed to declare here?

We must "tell" Macintosh Pascal about any names we're going to use during the running of a program *before* we use them. The process of informing Pascal about names before they are used is called declaration. As we move through our Mac Pascal adventure, we'll see that we can—and, in fact, *must*—declare things of many different types before we can use them.

Variables

The most common kind of name we'll be defining in our Pascal programs is an item called a variable. We warn Pascal that we're about to declare a variable (or several variables) by typing in the keyword *Var*. In this case, we'd type *Var* right after the statement that names the program.

Before you can declare any variable, though, you need to understand what a variable is. The idea of variables is simple, though it is often made unnecessarily complicated. In fact, we've all used variables hundreds of times, perhaps without being aware of them.

Let's explore variables briefly before we get involved in an explanation of them. To begin, use the File menu to close the program at which

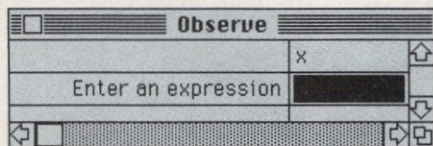


Figure 6: The Observe window with an x

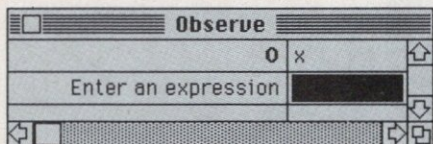


Figure 8: Observe while you single-step

we've been looking. Discard the changes, since you won't be working with this program again. Now open the program from chapter 2 (see *A+*, March 1985, page 97, figure 2) called First. (If you didn't save it, or if you've figured out how to delete files and have deleted this program, retype it into the Program window.)

Once the program is shown in the Program window, pull down the Windows menu and select the Observe option. A new window will appear on the display. The window is divided into a small grid pattern, one section of which contains the message Enter an expression. The pointer is now in the small box to the right of

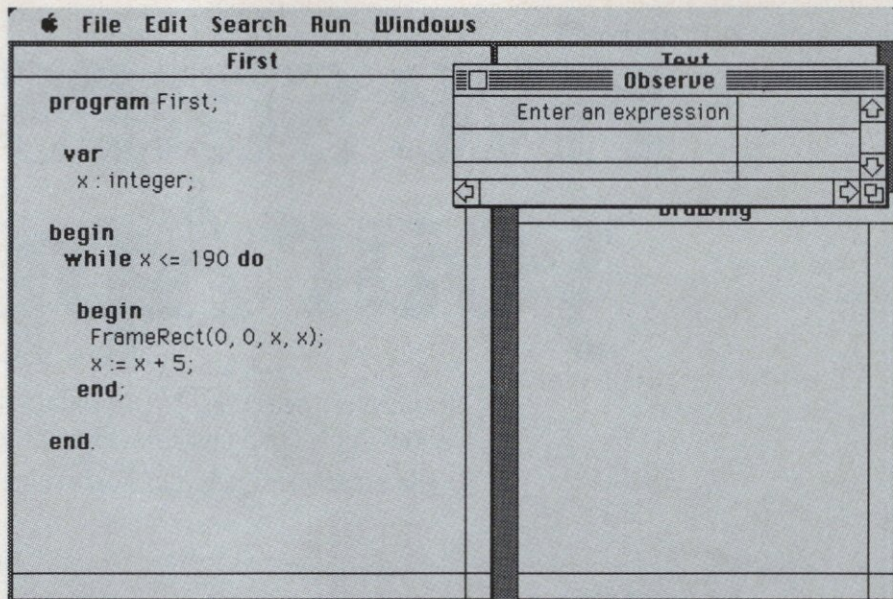


Figure 7: The First program—note the variable declaration under var.

that message. Type a lowercase *x* and press Return. The Observe window should look like figure 6.

Don't worry right now about what an expression is or why you entered *x*. Just notice the letter *x* on the line below Var in the program listing (just like the *x* you just typed in), followed by a colon, the word *integer*, and the inevitable semicolon. This line is the

first variable declaration we did together, though we didn't call it that at the time (see figure 7).

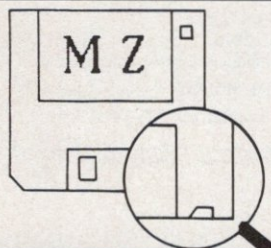
Use the Run menu Single Step option or the ⌘S combination to single-step through the program. When you begin, the pointing finger will show up at the line that says Begin, and the Observe window will change so it looks like figure 8.

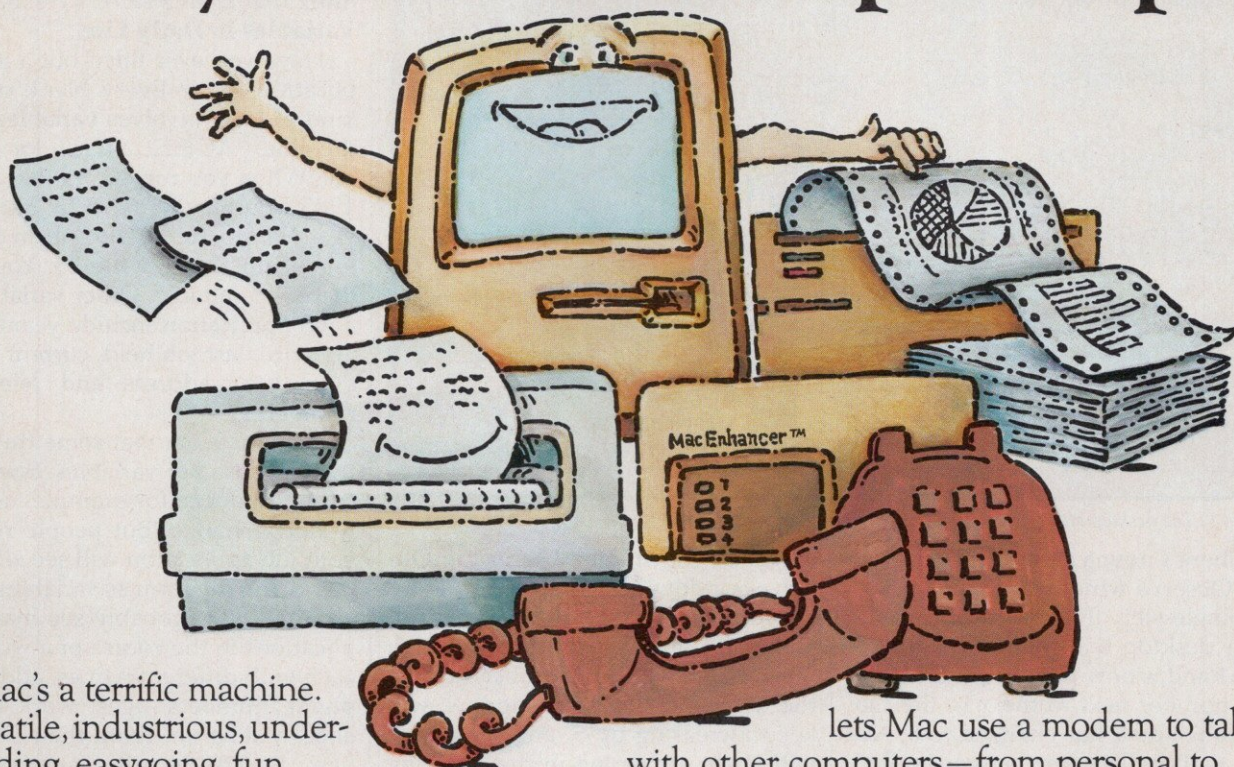

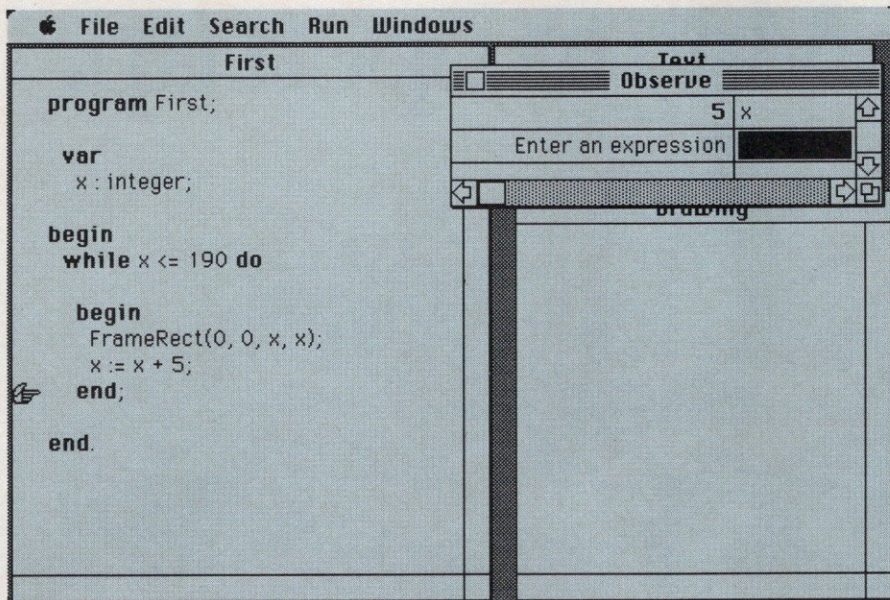


Figure 9: The desktop after you've single-stepped through the First program

There's now a zero next to the x in the Observe window.

Single-step five more times, and your desktop will look like figure 9. The hand is now pointing at End; and the number next to the x in the Observe window has changed to 5. Notice that the line just before the End; statement says $x := x + 5$. This means we're adding the value 5 to x , which

explains why its number in the Observe window has gone from 0 to 5.

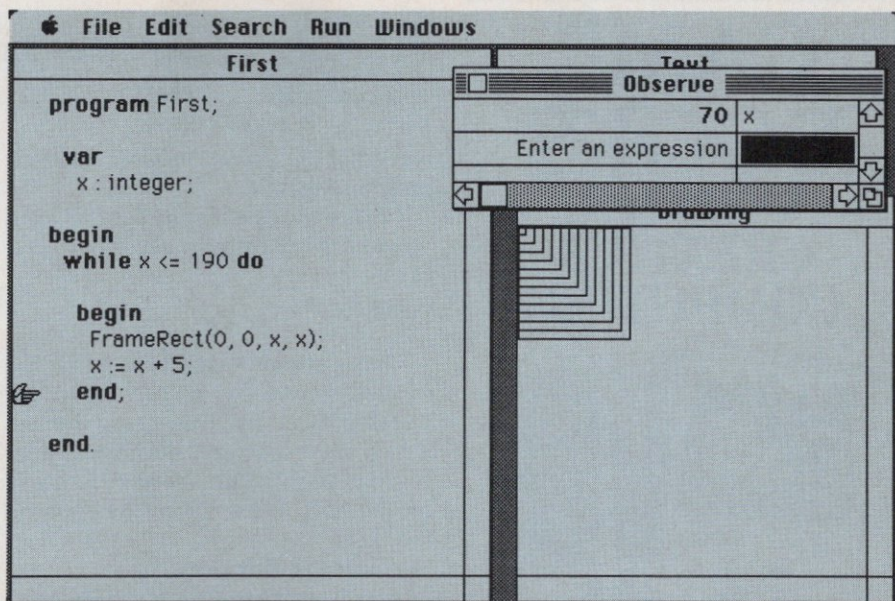


Figure 10: The screen looks like this after you hold down the ⌘ and S keys.

Hold down the \mathbb{H} and S keys together for a few seconds and watch what happens. The number next to the x in the Observe window will keep increasing by 5, and rectangles will begin appearing in the Drawing window. Pretty soon the screen will look like figure 10.

Are you beginning to understand variables from the way x is behaving in this program? A variable is something that changes.

Variables in Daily Life

Have you ever filled out a job-application form? Every blank on that kind of form involves variables. Take the line "AGE:____yrs.," for example. When you run across that line in 1985, you may write in 23, but if two years later you have to fill in such a line again, you'd write 25. Your age, then, is a variable. Other variables on a job application include years of experience, last job held, current salary, even your address and telephone number.

It might seem that some things on the form are not variables. Social Security numbers, for example, normally don't change. But people reading your job application will see *all* information on the form as variables. After all, they will probably see many applications in the course of a workday, each with different names, addresses, phone numbers, ages, work experience, and so on. From their perspective, Social Security numbers are variables.

Basically, we can say that a vari-

able is anything that can change. For computers, we can refine the definition by saying that a variable is anything that changes *from the program's viewpoint*.

Variables are one of the things we must tell Pascal about (that is, declare) before we begin a program. If we use a variable we haven't declared, the program containing the variable simply will not run. Some people think this requirement is good for programmers' souls in that it forces a measure of discipline and planning into the programming process that is not always required by other languages.

Sorry, You're Not My Type

Pascal also requires us to decide in advance the kind or *type* of variable we want. We must declare the variable type as well as the variables themselves near the beginning of the program. Letters and numbers are different variable types. To see why, you need to understand what letters and numbers mean to a computer.

All higher-level computer languages deal with information as either numbers or letters (individual letters or groups of letters in the form of words and phrases). Computers

must be able to tell the two kinds of information apart, because they can't process letters in the same way they do numbers. Suppose a computer tried to add *two* (a word) to 5 (a number). Would it get two5 or 7 or 25? Adding the two just doesn't make sense, and even your cooperative Mac will refuse to try it.

How Do You Declare a Variable?

Declaring a variable in Macintosh Pascal is easy. Simply determine the type of the variable you want to define (we'll tell you how to do that later in this chapter), give the variable a name, and put the name and type declaration together in the variable-declaration section of the program. To

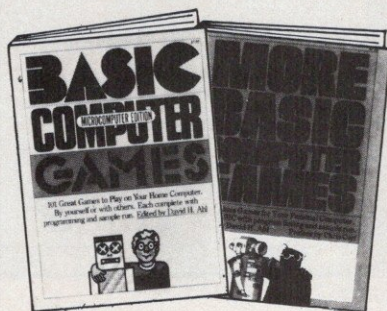

see what we mean, look at the First program again.

Notice the line just under the word Var in the program. It says

x: Integer;

This statement has three parts: the variable name (x), a colon, and the variable type (in this case, integer, which means whole number—more on that soon). The variable name is on the left of the colon, the type on the right.

Variables in Bunches

It is possible to use a single statement to define the type of more than one variable. For example, to define three whole numbers, just type

x, y, z: Integer;

This statement defines three variables, which are separated by commas. It declares them all to be of the Integer type. It is the same as typing

x: Integer;

y: Integer;

z: Integer;

Combining several variable declarations on a single line makes typing and reading easier. It's good practice to group variables by type.

Meaningful Names—A Reminder

Variable names need not be limited to a single character. In fact, they

shouldn't be. The names in our example would be much better if they referred to things the variables stood for in the program. For instance, we might write the line like this

Rectangles, Ovals, Lines: Integer;

Let's look at another example. Suppose you want to write a program that requires variables to store a name, a pay rate, a number of hours, a one-character code that tells what kind of job the person is doing, and the name of the department in which he or she works.

If we tell you that name is a variable with the type String, pay rate is of type Real, number of hours is Real, the code is of type Char, and the department name is of type String, what do you think that the variable-declaration statements would look like? Try figuring it out on your own before you read on.

Figure 11 shows how we would handle the variable declarations we just gave.

The order in which variables are defined and the names they are assigned are arbitrary.

Did you notice the number 125 in brackets after the word *String* in the first variable-declaration statement? A number in this position tells Pascal the maximum number of characters to be assigned to the variable named on that line. The largest string vari-

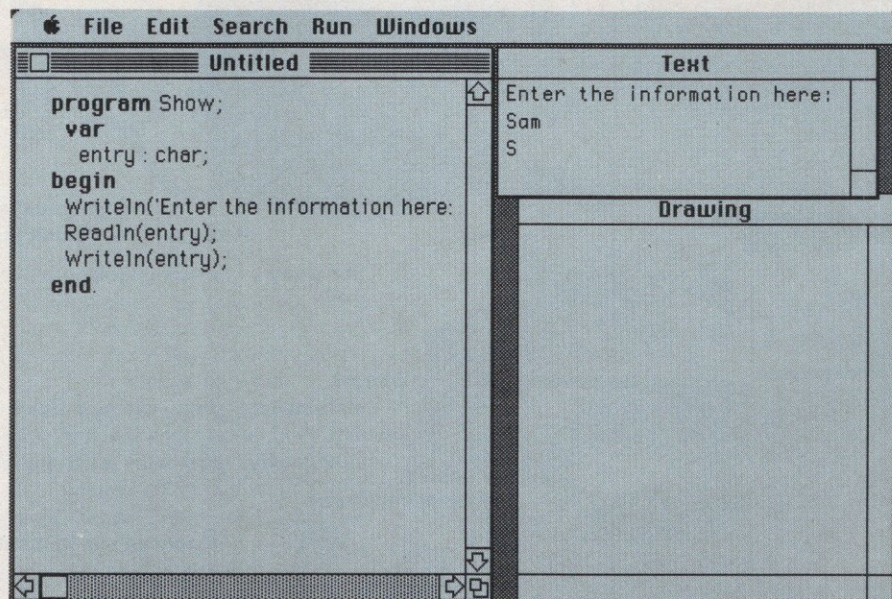


Figure 13: The screen after you've checked the program and typed Sam

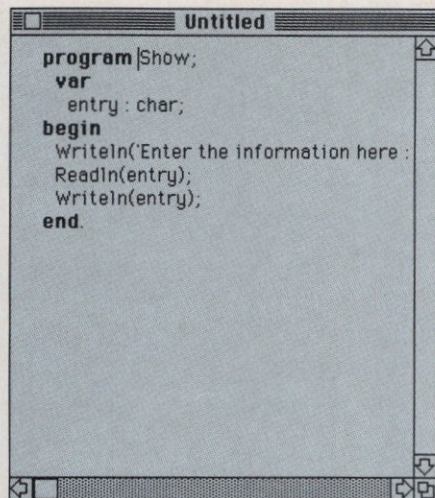


Figure 12: First program before checking

able allowed in Macintosh Pascal is 255 characters long, just like the largest identifier.

Types of Variables

One of the most powerful features of Macintosh Pascal is the richness of the types of variables we can use when we write programs in it. Check the *Macintosh Pascal Reference Manual* for a description of all the variable types available. Here we'll discuss only the four most useful ones: Char and String for letters, words, phrases, and sentences; and Integer and Real for numbers.

Quite a CHARACTER

At the main Macintosh Pascal Desktop (see figure 1) type the program in figure 12.

When you've entered the program, use the ⌘K combination (which is a shortcut way of invoking the Check option from the Run menu) to check it for acceptability to Macintosh Pascal. Be sure the cursor is at the end of the word *program*, as shown in the figure.

Save the program if you wish; then run it. The Text window will display the message Enter the information here:. The pointer will then appear on the next line, and the program will wait for you to type something. Type the word *Sam* and press Return. The screen should look like figure 13.

Notice that only the first letter of what you typed is displayed by the program in the Text window, even though the whole word appears where you typed it.

Is there a limit to the *kinds* of characters Char will hold? Try typing a single number, such as 9. Does that work? What about a special symbol, such as an exclamation point? Or a *really* special symbol like the filled-in

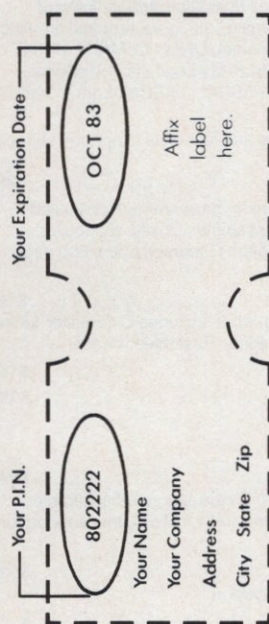

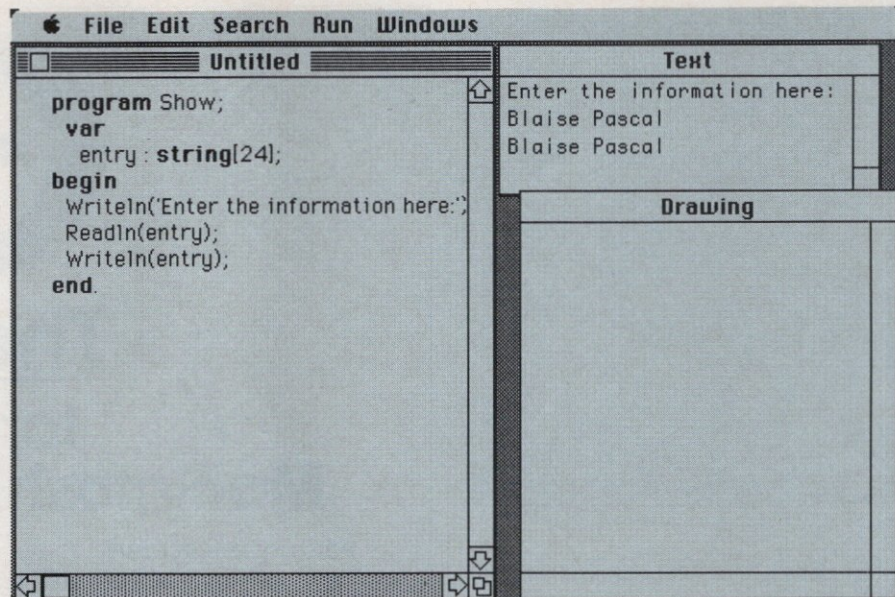


Figure 14: The screen after entry of a first and last name—the entire name must have 24 or fewer characters.

circle called a bullet (made by holding down the Option key and the B key together)?

Longer Groups of Letters and Numbers

The Char type of variable has a limited value. Programs often need information in the form of words, sentences, and phrases. In those situations, you'll want to define a variable or variables as the type called String.

As you've seen, a declaration for a variable of type String may specify a length limit in number of characters. If we don't tell Pascal anything about the length of a String variable, it will assign the maximum 255 characters as the limit.

Go back to the program now and change the line that says

```
entry:Char;
```

to read:

```
entry:String[24];
```

Now run the program again, typing in your first and last name (if they comprise 24 or fewer characters), with a space between them, just as you would on a typewriter.

The screen should look something like figure 14 (although if your name is *really* Blaise Pascal, it would probably be a good idea to use an alias!). The program will accept anything you type, up to 24 characters (since that was the specified limit of the string), and will display it in the Text window.

What if you type something longer than 24 characters? Try it and see.

If you tried it, you got a Bug box that said, String too small for assignment. Now that you know what happens, get rid of the Bug box, reset the program, and move on to the next topic.

Integers: Numbers of the Simplest Variety

Now let's turn to the world of numbers. Of the many types of numbers recognized by Macintosh Pascal, the most common is the type known as an integer. An integer is commonly called a "whole number"—that is, any number, positive or negative, that has no decimal points or fractions. The number 13 is an integer; the number 3.1416 is not.

The Biggest Number Is ...

Change the program line in our test program from String[24] to Integer. Be sure to delete the brackets and the number 24. Now run the program and try putting numbers in. Try some big ones and some small ones, some positive ones and some negative ones. See if you can answer this question without looking ahead or in the *Reference Manual*: What is the biggest number than can be represented with an Integer variable?

While doing this, you may discover that including commas in numbers causes problems—which brings up an important point about numbers in computer programs: Commas inside of numbers are nothing but troublemakers. Leave them out.

As it turns out, Macintosh Pascal recognizes as an integer any number between -32,767 and 32,767 (without the commas). Any number smaller

than -32,767 or larger than 32,767 will be represented by another variable type.

If you got rebellious and tried to type a number such as 3.1416 into the variable entry with type Integer, you found it was impossible to do. The Mac simply beeps when the decimal point (or period, for us nonmath types) key is pressed. Numbers with decimal points don't fit into the Integer variable type.

All numbers fit into the variable type called Real numbers. The word *Real* is obscure in this context, but it is true that numbers in the real world are Real, for the most part. Money values (dollars and cents), food measures (half-gallons, quarts, 2.5-pound boxes of things), and interest rates (10.5%) are all examples of real-life Real numbers. Notice that they can all have decimal points or fractional parts.

Change the variable type in the test program to Real and then run the program again. Experiment with it a little. Can you come up with a number too big for it to handle (or too small, for that matter)?

It was probably difficult to find numbers the program wouldn't handle with the variable type Real. That's because the smallest number that Macintosh Pascal will allow in a variable of this type is the number 15 preceded by a decimal point and 46 zeros! Now, *that's* a small number! And the largest number Mac Pascal can put into a Real variable is 34 followed by 39 zeros. That number's so big it can represent the national debt—with a lot of zeros left over!

SUMMARY

This chapter has introduced quite a bit of new information. We've examined the structure of a Pascal program and found, among other things, that it has

1. A specific place to declare variables
2. A strict rule about Begin-End pairs
3. Rules about how long names can be and what they can and cannot contain
4. A need for semicolons at the end of most program lines

You also learned about including comments in programs, using the principle that the computer ignores anything that appears between two curly brackets. You learned what variables are, why we have to declare them in Pascal, and how four different types of variables are declared and used in programs. +

Suggestions from our readers

MACDEVELOPER TIPS

During several months of presenting MacTips, we have collected the following tips that assembly-language-software developers will find useful. If while developing software, you have discovered a tip or technique and would like to pass it along, please send it to A+. We will periodically present them in this column.

Modifier-Key Status

These procedures allow a programmer to check the status of a particular modifier key on the Macintosh keyboard. You may wish to use them if you want to "hide" a command or feature, or if you want to maintain continued selection in text editing—referred to as Shift-Click in the MacWrite manual (see figure 1, below).

Tips Gathered the Hard Way: Writing Fastfinder

1. In the PBSetVol call to the Mac operating system, if you supply a volume name, you must follow the name with a colon. This requirement is not documented. In some calls you don't have to follow the volume name with a colon, such as PBEject, where a colon is not allowed.
2. The PBDelete call to the Mac operating system will delete a locked file!
3. When the Apple Finder reports sizes such as 342K in disk or 100K in folder, those Ks are 1000s, not 1024s. Apple should have used a small k (342k in disk...).
4. For all desk accessories to work, an application must perform a call to TELnit. Again, this requirement is not documented anywhere.
5. The "lnited" bit in the file flags specifies that the file's icon has a place on the screen. Don't set this bit.

has some memory called "parameter RAM." This RAM consists of 20 bytes and stores parameters when the machine is turned off. The parameters that are stored here are

- Validity status
- Modem-port configuration
- Printer-port configuration
- Alarm setting
- Default application font
- Auto-key threshold
- Printer connection
- Speaker volume
- Double-click time
- Caret-blink time
- Mouse scaling
- Preferred system start-up disk
- Menu blink

In the midst of programming, I managed to clobber the printer-port configuration. I assumed that the parameters would be reinitialized if I turned the machine on and off. But no, you must unplug the Mac, remove the batteries, count to 10 (to appease the God of RAM latency), and then replace the batteries. On reboot, the Mac will discover that it has no parameters and supply the defaults. It took me a while to discover this one.

2. Inevitable problems occur in the Finder that can make your files unreadable or otherwise unusable (manifested by various I/O errors). The recovery technique requires the Resource Mover that Apple supplies to developers. Here's the procedure:

- Using the Resource Mover, choose the Desktop Resource and cut everything out of it.
- Close the Desktop file and the Resource Mover itself. (I have had it hang if I quit without closing.)
- When the Finder discovers that its Desktop has been cleaned off, it graciously asks if it can reconstruct it. Say yes, and it will rebuild the Desktop, removing a lot of sins.
- This procedure is also the way to get rid of unwanted file references and the like on the Desktop. If you don't have the Resource Mover, don't worry. Eventually someone who has the time will write a routine for this function. I plan to include something like this in my application.

Optimizing Data-Structure Space

Macintosh applications can occupy a significant amount of memory. This suggestion explains a method of acquiring 256 bytes of memory whenever a window that contains a scroll bar is in existence.

Inside the scroll-bar data structure is a string of 255 characters reserved for the ContrlTitle, which is not used. You can use this space if you overlay the ControlHandle data structure with your own data structure.

See figure 2 (above) for the format of the required data structures.

In order to access this data structure, follow these steps:

1. Be certain that the program has made a call to the control-manager function GetNewControl or NewControl.
2. Overlay the ControlHandle with your data structure.
3. Access any applicable fields.
4. Be certain that the ControlHandle is not disposed of when your data structure is being used. The handle must not have its memory space taken away.

See figure 3 for an example of the execution of this code.

Analyzing
the stock market

WHAT MOVING AVERAGES REVEAL

Two kinds of people analyze the stock market—fundamentalists and technicians. Fundamentalists believe that strict adherence to rules—in this case, security analysis—is good for the soul and the bank balance.

Technicians, on the other hand, believe in the “black art” of technical forecasting, or “market alchemy.” They use spells and techniques with names such as oscillators, chanelizers, and filters.

As you might expect, technicians—sometimes referred to as gnomes—are a misunderstood lot (soothsayers usually are). To modify this situation, let's examine one of their most popular tools—the moving average—and use the Apple to harness its power.

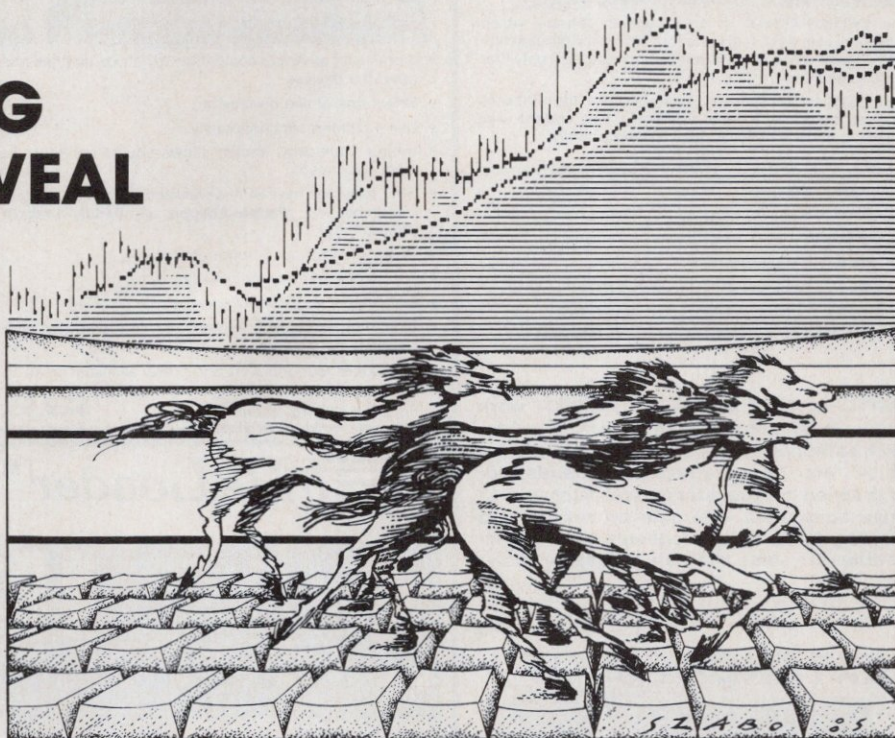
Moving Averages

Transport yourself back to the fifth grade—to the one-piece desk, civics, and math. Remember the lesson on finding simple averages: take a series of numbers, add them together, and then divide by the number of numbers in the series.

Now move ahead a few years to junior high school—boy-girl parties, your first dance, and more math. This time, let's take that simple average and change it a little. By taking out the older numbers in the series and adding in new numbers, we get an average that “moves.” The number of numbers (or observations) that we keep in the calculation determines the length, or range of the average. So, when your math teacher Mrs. Macgillicuddy told you to use the last ten observations, and drop off the eleventh one, she was teaching you about moving averages.

Pictures from Your Checkbook

Moving averages are no more complicated than that. But what gives them



their power? Envision your bank balance. It goes up and down every time you write a check or make a deposit. If you tried to analyze the deposit and payment patterns from the numbers in your register, you would probably go slightly bonkers. Using numbers or tab-

basis, but the pattern—if there was one—would remain obscured.

A moving average, though, would show a pattern, averaging out the changes in the numbers and creating a smooth, flowing line.

What often happens—but should be avoided if possible—is that people who concern themselves with securities and use moving averages use a range (or length) that is incorrect for the security they are interested in. The moving average must be constructed to magnify—not conceal—data in the numbers. A way to choose the correct range is to look at the history of the security and experiment with different ranges to see which one fits best so that the range does not product a flowing line that obscures the information you are seeking.

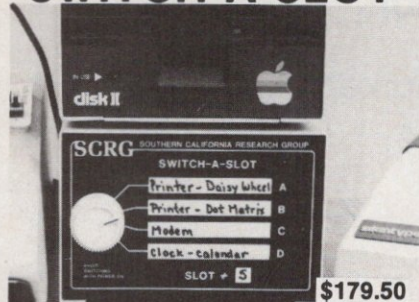
ular information doesn't help you see a pattern, but a graph does.

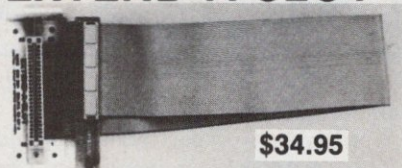

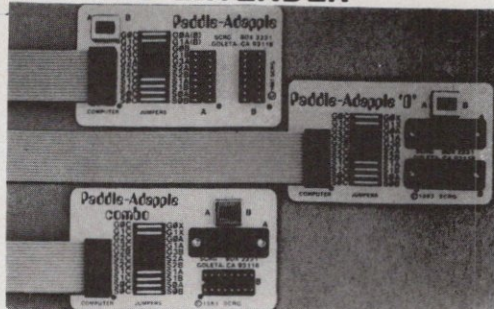

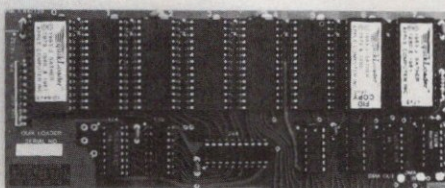

We'll use the Trader's Forecaster, one of three packages in the Winning on Wall Street series, from Summa Software of Beaverton, Oregon.

Trader's Forecaster is a combination forecasting/technical-analysis charting program. Besides doing moving averages, it also does exponential smoothing, adaptive filtering, Least Square Fit method (linear regression), $\frac{1}{3}$ - $\frac{2}{3}$ speed resistance lines, trading bands, mid-channel support/resistance lines, volume indicators, and point and figure charting. The information it uses is stored in Winning on Wall Street's librarian, the Trader's Data Manager.

The Trader's Data Manager collects and stores a variety of data. We will be using high, low, close, open, and volume information, which you can enter from the financial pages of your newspaper via your fingertips, or through an automatic connection to the Dow Jones News/Retrieval Service. In either case, the end result is that the program stores on a diskette the information on the stocks you're interested in, where the Trader's Forecaster can find it.

To construct the moving average, you retrieve the data on the stock that you're interested in and tell the Trader's Forecaster the range of the average. Within seconds, the Trader's

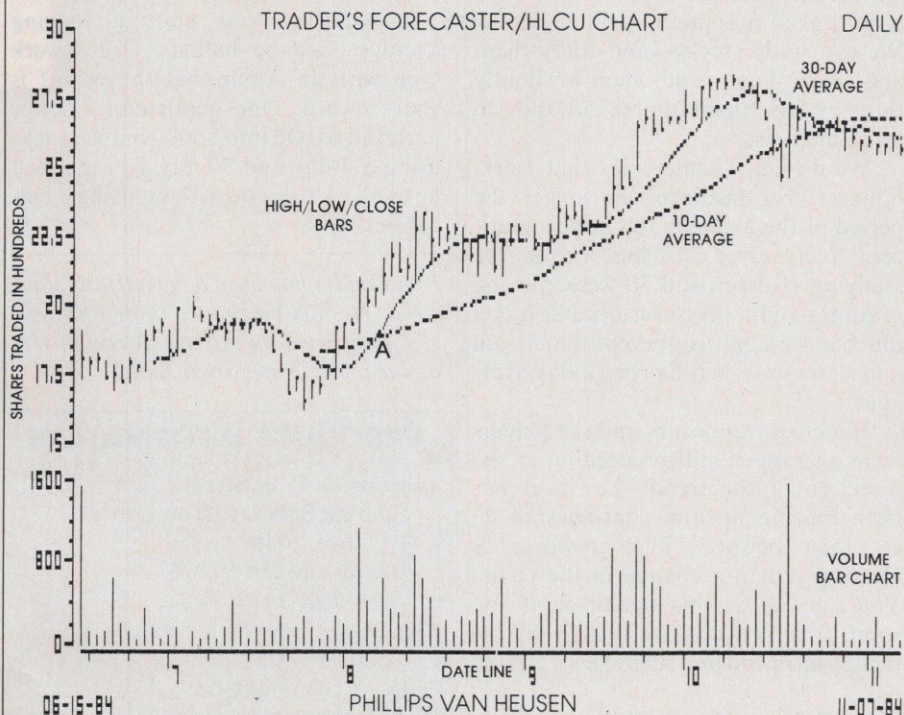
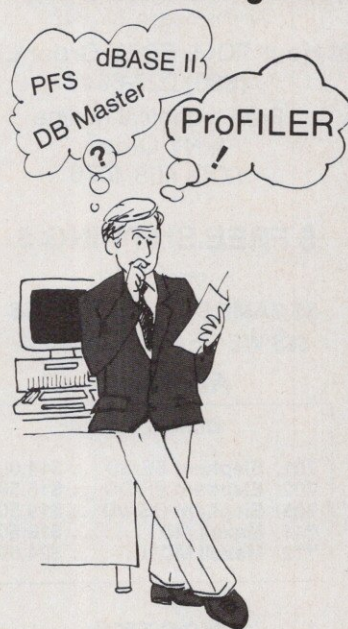


Figure 1: This High/Low/Close/Volume chart, generated with Trader's Forecaster, displays both a 10-day and a 30-day moving average of the Phillips Van Heusen stock. A "buy" signal is indicated on 8-8-84 at 21 1/8 when the short term moving average crosses above the longer-term average. A "sell" is indicated on 10-26-84 at 26 3/8 when the 10-day moving average falls below the 30-day average. The result is a 25% gain in less than 80 days.

Forecaster calculates and displays the average over, and in relation to, the "raw" high, low, close, and volume information (see figure 1). But what does it mean?

Place Your Bets

Reading moving averages is a lot like handicapping racehorses. It takes years of skill, continuing refinement, and luck. The numbers can say one thing, but the stock—like a racehorse—often does something else.

There is a method in this madness, though. It's called the crossover point.

The crossover point is not a Robert Ludlum novel. It is the point at which two moving averages of different lengths cross one another, as they do at point A on figure 1. (Some analysts consider that a crossover occurs when a single moving average crosses its own low or high, but we are using multiple moving averages.)

To illustrate, let's consider a 10-day and a 30-day moving average.

Mathematically speaking, the 10-day average responds more rapidly to changes in the price of the underlying stock. Thus, it tracks the stock's price fluctuations more closely than the 30-day average does. This speed is both a help and a hindrance. The market moves quickly, so the faster the average responds, the better. The problem is that the average, like the market, can

fluctuate, change quickly, and then reverse. The result could be money lost.

The 30-day average graphs the stock's longer-term trend. It shows the areas of support (price lows) and resistance (price highs) that the stock is moving within. If a stock breaks through one of these barriers, especially on a term average even longer than 30 days, it is a clear sign that something is happening.

If the breakthrough occurs at the resistance point, odds are that the stock will go up. If it occurs at the support point, watch out—the stock is looking for a new low, and you don't want to be there when it finds it (unless you sold short or speculated that the stock would go down). Now consider together the 10-day, fast-responding average and the 30-day, longer-term, trend-setting average.

The Payoff

When the shorter-term average crosses over the longer-term average, pay attention. Should the 10-day average cross the 30-day average, going up, it might be a signal that the price of the stock will be rising, and thus it is a good time to buy. If the opposite occurs (the 10-day crosses the 30-day going down) it probably means the stock is going to fall, and you better be wearing your parachute.

Why do I say *might* and *probably*? Unlike the tides, the behavior of a stock is not linked to something quantifiable. We can study stocks—and study them and study them—and when we finally think we have them figured out, they do something else.

We do know some rules that work, however. For instance, the longer the period of the average, the more significant a crossover is. Thus, if you are studying 10-week and 30-week moving averages and a crossover occurs, it is a much more significant event than if you had a crossover in 5-day or 10-day averages.

If a crossover occurs and the longer-term average is still proceeding in the direction of the trend—i.e., if it has been moving up and continues to do so—then beware. The crossover is alerting you to a change in the trend. You can act on this signal; or, if you want to be conservative, watch for the longer-term moving average to flatten out.

Other Rules and Suggestions

Finally, moving averages do not an analysis make. Although many traders react only to moving averages, the safest bet is to use them in conjunction

with other indicators—especially volume. Here are two quick rules of thumb to tide you over until we discuss volume in an upcoming issue: Beware of new highs on low volume or contracting volume, and watch for opportunities price lows with expanding volume.

Worth the Reward

Moving averages are the most popular technical-analysis technique. They are easy to construct, simple to use, and valuable. Different ranges, lengths, work for different stocks. You can't do the same analysis for every stock in the market and make money. You have to find which combination

averages works best for each stock. A new enhancement called strategy analysis in *Winning on Wall Street* does just this for single moving averages. Used by itself, it helps you improve your timing—and thus your profits.

Calculating and plotting moving averages can be tedious, tiring work, even with an Apple, but the payoff is your reward. One gentleman I know parlayed \$1000 into \$6000 in two weeks using a 4-day and 30-day average, and he can't even divide without using a calculator. **+**

TO APPLE ANIMATION

MAKING IT MOVE

There's something special about animation. Whether it is a ball bouncing around the screen or a Disney classic, animation fascinates young and old.

Animation can educate or just entertain. How about an animated clock to teach your child how to tell time? Would letters dancing across a screen inspire someone to learn the alphabet? Why not send an animated greeting to a friend or colleague?

Animation can also enliven a business presentation. Imagine a dynamic pie chart with the wedges expanding to demonstrate how your company's market share increases over the years—or a bar chart with bars stretching up to reach your latest business goals.

Look no further than your Apple.

On Animation

Animation is illusion. An animator can take any object, real or drawn, and give it life by making it move. The illusion is in the movement—animations consist of still frames, rapidly displayed. Our eyes and brain transform subtle differences between frames into movement.

Animation is also an art. An animator must be able to visualize how the individual frames of the animation will fit together and how to maximize the illusion of movement. Computer animators must be especially creative, for every frame added to an animation uses memory.

Computer animation involves a simple animation cycle:

1. DRAW
2. ERASE
3. MOVE
4. GOTO 1

You can create effective animation on any of the Apple's screens: text, low resolution, high resolution, or double hi-res.

Describing animation is difficult if

you don't illustrate it with animation, so find an Apple II computer and enter and run the simple program called TEXT.ANIMATE on page 156. Use Shift-M to type] on the Apple II and II Plus.

Use Control-C to stop this program.

Most of the program lines set up the animation: Lines 10–90 define array variables, lines 100–130 fill the screen with semicolons, and line 140 initializes a variable (H) and sets up a constant (V). Finally, the animation: Lines 150 and 160 represent the draw cycle, and lines 170 and 180 are the erase cycle.

Because the program is printing on the standard text screen, you use VTAB and HTAB for positioning. The horizontal position of the fish is stored in the variable H. Line 190 is the move component of the animation cycle. The program increments H and then checks to see if it's greater than the screen width. If it is, H is restored to the starting value. The constant V positions the pieces of the fish or the erase block.

Take a closer look at the animation cycle by slowing the program down. Then add this line to the program: 145 SPEED=150. (Afterwards, restore normal printing speed with the instruction SPEED=255 and delete line 145.)

My Friend Flicker

By slowing down the speed of the program, you can see why the animation flickers. There are moments when the screen is all background—no images other than semicolons appear.

To eliminate the flicker, make a small modification to the program. Don't forget to save the first version if you want a record of your work. Add an extra semicolon on the left side of each string by inserting the following program line:

Delete the erase cycle, lines 170-180.

Run this version, and you'll find that the flicker is gone. Even though you've deleted the erase cycle, you still have an erase function—the extra column of semicolons allows the animation to erase itself. The screen is never blank, and the flicker is eliminated.

You have just learned one of the secrets of high-quality, professional animation: Use the animation block itself to do the erasing. To do so, you have to increase the size of the block by the size of the maximum move on the side that is opposite that of the move. In TEXT.ANIMATE, the fish moves one character to the right; therefore, we need a column of one extra character on the left side of the character block.

For low-res or hi-res animation, you must add an extra column or row of pixels. Remember that the additional pixels or characters must be the same color as the background of the animation.

A Graphic Surprise

Add the following lines to TEXT.ANIMATE and run the pro-

gram again. This variant does not work properly on the 80-column screen.

These lines turn on the full-page low-res graphics mode and clear the screen. The same animation looks quite different now. The text and low-res screens share one area of memory in the Apple. The same information is displayed as text on the text screen and as pixels on the low-res screen.

If you wondered why we chose the combination of a bracket fish swimming in a sea of semicolons, try the program with other characters. The left square bracket and semicolon are two of the 16 text characters that produce stacked, same-color low-res pixels; most other text characters create a multicolored fish or ocean.

You can also animate the low-res page with the low-res commands PLOT, VLIN, and HLIN. To erase a plotted figure, plot it again in the same place, using the background color:

If you'd like to explore low-res animation, check the graphics library of your local Apple users' group. Many good, instructive, low-res animation programs are in the public domain.

Hi-Res Animation

The hi-res screens are useful for more detailed graphics and animation. Hi-res animation divides into two types, vector and block or raster animation. These types are differentiated by their display technology.

A vector is a line, an object with direction and magnitude (length), and vector-graphic systems draw lines. The most common vector-graphic display is an oscilloscope, and the arcade versions of Asteroids and Battle Zone have vector-graphic displays. In vector-graphic displays, the electron gun at the rear of the video tube draws the graphic—only the graphic. It never draws on the blank areas of the screen.

The Apple has a raster display, how-

ever; the electron gun scans across each line on the screen, turning on pixels where necessary for the graphic. Because our TEXT.ANIMATE fish was designed in a block, with all pixels defined as being on or off, the animation is a block or raster animation.

You can create hi-res block animations similar in concept to the fish animation with a hi-res character generator such as HRCG in the DOS Toolkit from Apple or with a dedicated animation system. If you use standard Applesoft shape tables, you can simulate vector animations.

Shape Animation

You design Apple shapes as if they were going to be shown on a vector display, and Applesoft takes care of translating your vector data into the Apple raster screen image. Apple shapes can be remarkably effective if you use them correctly. You can manipulate Apple shapes more flexibly than raster, block objects. You can rotate, scale (or transform), and translate them (move them on an x and/or y axis)—all from Applesoft. Here's a simple shape-animation program that uses shape rotation; we call it THREE.TWO.ONE:

Lines 10-30 initialize the shape table described in the DATA statements of line 1000. It's not a complex shape—a one-pixel vector to the left—but some of the most interesting effects involve simple shapes. Lines 40 and 50 set up the hi-res screen and set the scale of the shape to 50, enlarging our one-pixel shape to 50 pixels. The animation loop is in lines 60-90. This particular loop doesn't have an erase cycle. To add one, insert the following line:

Applesoft offers another method of erasing that also works with raster animation. Modify THREE.TWO.ONE so that lines 80 and 85 read 80 XDRAW 1 AT 140,100 and 85 XDRAW 1 AT

140,100. The XDRAW instruction does not require a color command, as color is irrelevant. The *X* in XDRAW stands for eXclusive OR (XOR). In XOR animation, the screen pixels are inverted. Where a pixel is lit, XOR darkens it; where a pixel is dark, XOR lights it. The first XDRAW, then, draws by inverting the black screen to white, and the second XDRAW erases by inverting all the pixels in the shape to black. There's no simple way to demonstrate XOR animation with a block shape, but many commercial animation packages offer XOR as an option.

XOR animation is not without its problems. The XOR of violet is orange or green, and the XOR of green is violet or blue, depending upon whether you used a whole byte or just one pixel with the exclusive-OR drawing method. Color animation with XDRAW is difficult but possible with creative shape design. Second, XDRAW animation flickers because the erase cycle is visible. To solve this problem, you must use both graphics pages with page flipping to make the erase cycle invisible. Finally, unless you use simple backgrounds, XDRAW animation doesn't look good.

A few simple modifications to THREE.TWO.ONE will demonstrate translation, or movement, along an x and/or y axis. Delete line 70, modify line 60 to read `FOR I=60 TO 250`, and change the XDRAW commands in lines 80 and 85 to read `XDRAW 1 AT I,100`. Changing the x coordinate with the FOR/NEXT loop causes the line to be translated across the screen.

By substituting the appropriate shape, you can now use this program to animate a car driving across the screen. Complex shapes are difficult to create without a shape utility, however. (See "Shaping Up" in the August and September 1984 issues of *A+*).

Tools for Animation

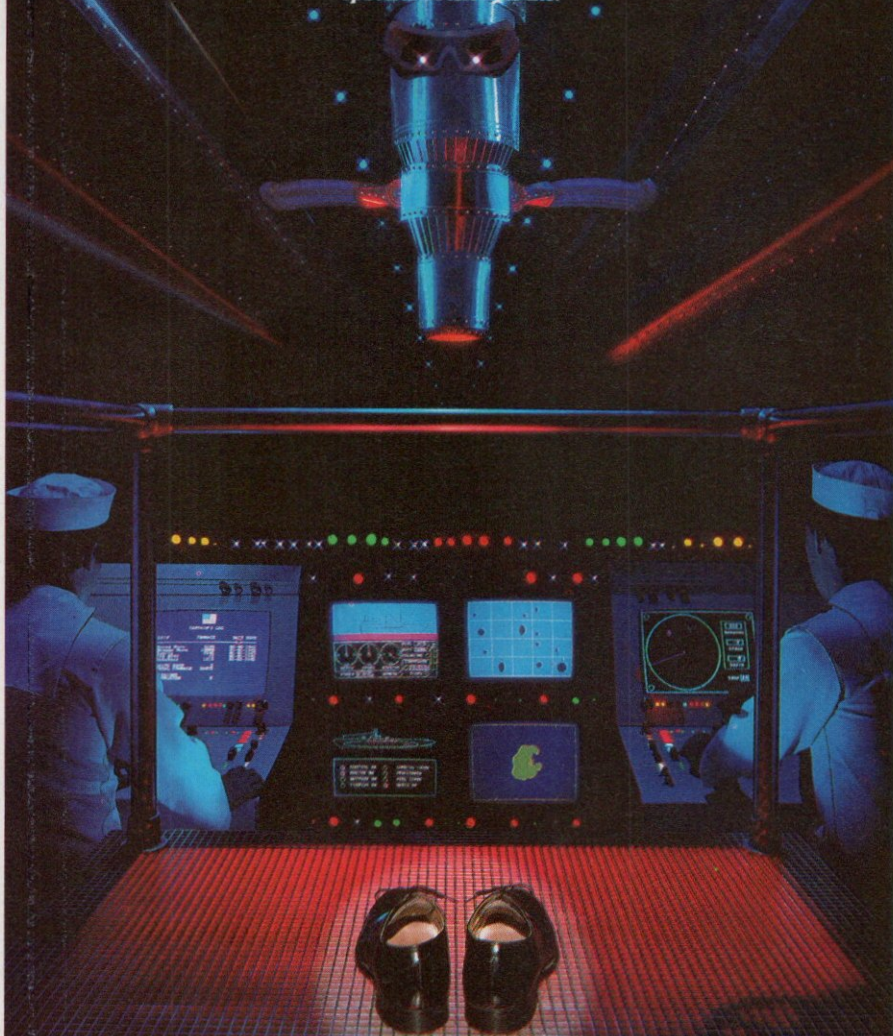
The program examples we've presented here are simple. To incorporate more sophisticated animations in your graphic presentations, treat yourself to a commercial animation package. These utilities allow you to create impressive animation without expertise in programming. Next month, we'll look at the latest of these packages. **+**

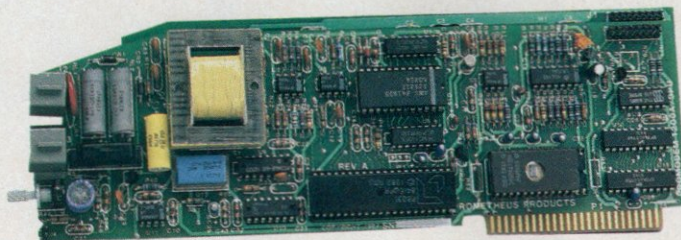

Last month we introduced the topic of disk-drive repair by describing ways to isolate problems with the major disk-drive components. We suggested precautions and techniques for handling chips, told you how to check cables, and mentioned the chips that fail most frequently on the controller card. Now let's continue by examining problems with the DOS version and the actual disk-drive mechanism.

A common problem comes up when you use the wrong disk-operating system. The DOS tells the system hardware what kind of disk formatting and mapping to use. The older DOS version 3.2 uses a 13-sector format, and the newer version 3.3 uses a 16-sector format, which is Pascal- and ProDOS-compatible. The disk-controller card needs P5 and P6 PROMs to read DOS 3.2, 13-sector diskettes. Likewise, it

needs P5A and P6A PROMs to read DOS 3.3, 16-sector diskettes.

Some manufacturers of Apple-compatible disk-controller cards offer controllers that read both formats.

COMMON DISK-DRIVE PROBLEMS

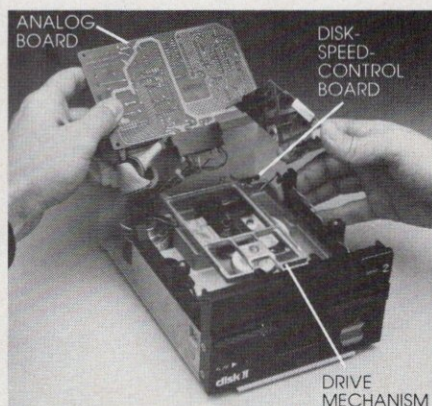
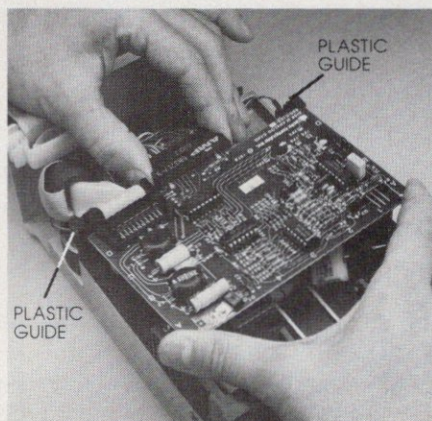
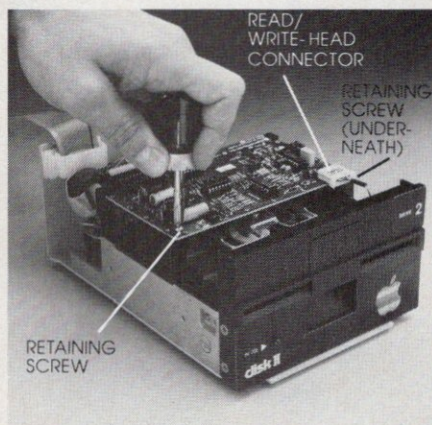


Figure 1: The main interior components of the disk drive

You can remove the disk-drive cover by unscrewing the four Phillips head screws from the bottom and sliding the metal cover away from the front of the drive. The main interior components are the drive mechanism, and the analog board on the top (see figure 1).

Apple uses both Shugart and Alps drive mechanisms in its disk drives. The Shugart mechanism has a smooth metal casing and a long stepper-drive motor. The Alps mechanism has a dull-metal magnesium casing and a lower-profile stepper motor. Both have a disk-speed-control board and a speed-control-adjustment potentiometer on the rear of the drive mechanism.

The drive mechanism itself is mounted on the bottom cover plate with four additional screws. You don't have to remove this bottom plate unless you have a bad mechanical assembly. To remove the analog board, unplug the read/write-head connector, unscrew the front retaining screws, and slide the board forward until it clears the plastic guides in the back (see figures 2 and 3). Note the location of pin 1 on your cable and card for reference.

Burned Components

If you have smelled any smoke, you need to examine the analog card for burned components.

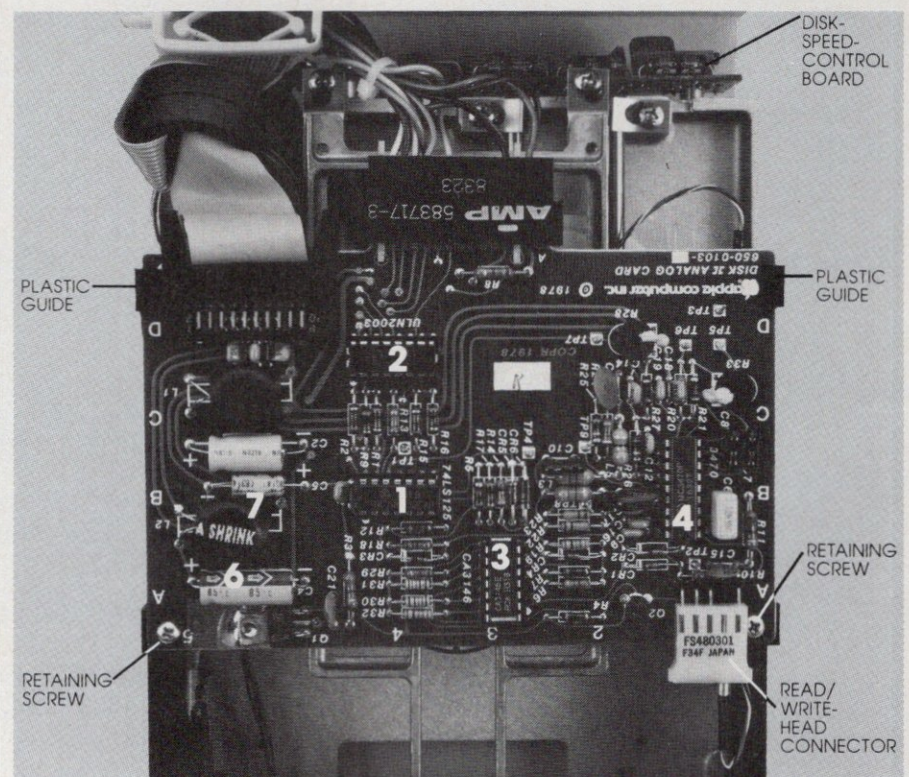
The parts that crack or burn most often are the 74LS125 IC and socket, the 3470 IC and socket, and the electrolytic capacitor that filters the board's voltage supply (see figure 4). If any of these components are burned, you need to replace them and possibly the entire analog card. (Most dealers will not ex-

change boards for you, especially if you have a burned component beyond obvious repair.)

Once you've found the bad components, replace them with parts from any Radio Shack or other electronic-parts store. Make sure you do not bend any IC pins when you replace them and that the orientation is correct (determine which end has pin 1). Replacing damaged sockets or capacitors requires soldering. Refer to the additional sources at the end of this article for soldering techniques and tips. Be careful not to damage the thin metal traces, called "runs," when replacing sockets. You can replace damaged, burned, or missing runs with fine wire, such as the wire you use for wire-wrapping. If the electrolytic capacitor needs replacing, you can use a capacitor with a higher voltage and capacitance value than the original, if you want.

Once you've replaced any burned and cracked components, carefully reconnect the cables and check to make sure that all the pin 1 contacts on the connectors and chips are oriented properly. Now turn the computer's power on and try to boot your system. As long as the lower light is on, you can proceed; otherwise, immediately turn the computer off and double-check everything. After the system has been on for a min-

► CASE STUDY

The following is an example of a common situation involving an inoperative disk drive.

Symptom

After moving and reconnecting his computer system, a user found that his disk drive was completely inoperative. He heard a "pop" just after turning on the computer and noticed a "burned smell."

Analysis

The user isolated the problem by a process of elimination and substitution. He installed the controller card in another computer, and it operated normally with the other computer's disk drive. Next, he removed the drive cover and examined the analog board. The large chip (MC3470) at B1 was blistered and cracked, and there was a smoke stain on the roof of the cover. This chip was the read amplifier, one of the most expensive chips in the disk drive at nearly \$4.95.

Cure

The solution is to replace the MC3470 chip and check if the disk drive works correctly. Although the actual cause of the problem will never be known, a probable factor was incorrect connection of the 20-pin flat cable to the disk-controller card. A careful examination of the cable connection to the disk-controller card might have revealed an improper connection.

The moral is to check carefully before unplugging anything! If the cable is connected just one row of pins off, +12 and -12 volts are applied to circuits in the Disk II Drive that can withstand +5 volts, so chips and other parts get damaged. Rarely will the controller card be damaged; however, be careful when connecting or reconnecting your equipment.

ute or two, you can check the disk-controller board and the analog board for additional burned components by lightly touching the chips. If you find any chips that are too hot to touch, you'll know you have a problem with that chip and must replace it.

Replacing Analog-Card Parts

Although hot, damaged chips usually need replacement, other problems on the analog card can cause chips to overheat. You can correct the most common

problems with the analog card by replacing the following components, in order of their frequency of failure. You can purchase most of these parts from an electronics store such as Radio Shack:

1. 74LS125 (the drive-control circuit)
2. ULN2003 (stepper-motor drivers)
3. CA3146 (write/erase transistor array)
4. MC3470 (read and bias amplifier)
5. IC socket (usually one where an IC has burned out)
6. Filter capacitor C4
7. Filter capacitor C5

Troubleshooting the Disk Drive

The best way to localize a problem quickly is by substituting a good analog board, a drive mechanism, a disk-speed-control board, and/or a write-protect switch. As long as you've replaced the burned components on your controller card and analog board, you can safely substitute assemblies from a good disk drive until you find

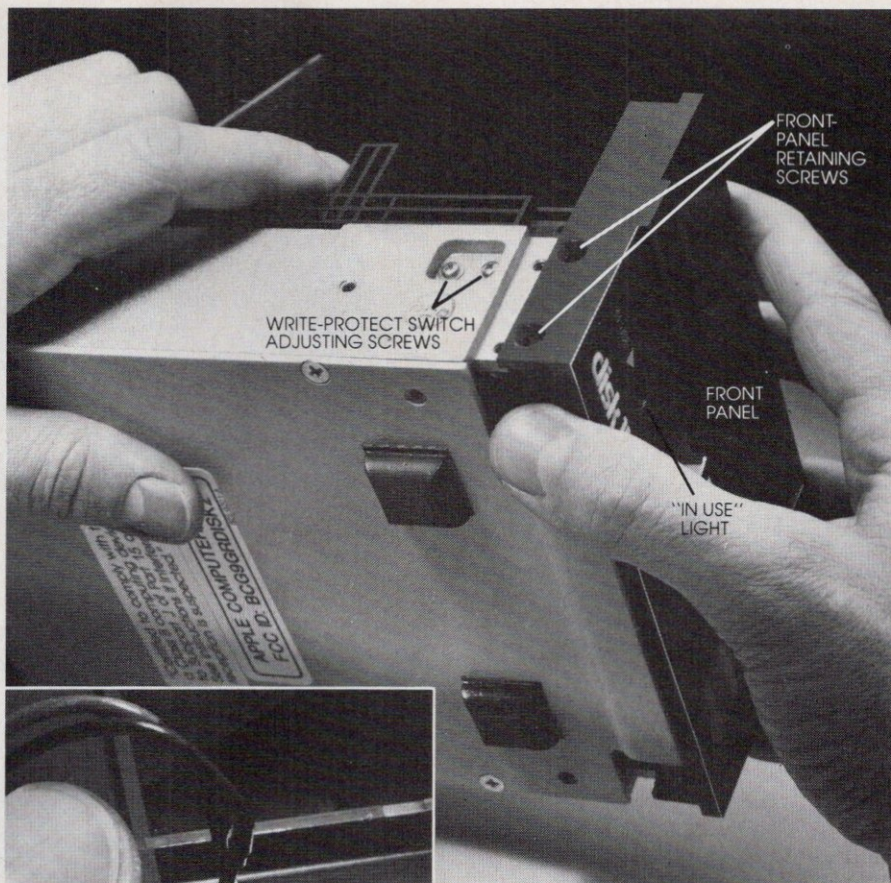


Figure 6: You can correct the position of the write-protect switch by adjusting the screws that hold it in place. When removing the front panel, make sure you disconnect the IN USE light first.

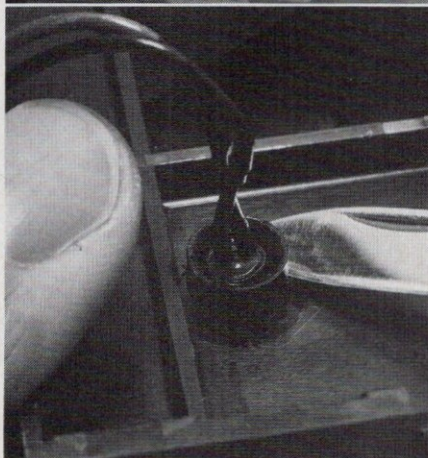


Figure 5: Removing IN USE light: To remove the front panel, you must disconnect the IN USE light by prying off the retaining ring. Then, from the front of the panel, gently push the light through the socket.

the defective assembly.

Exchanging the entire mechanical assembly is often faster and easier than repairing it.

If you decide to replace the mechanical assembly, you will have to remove the front panel of the drive if you want to keep the same faceplate. To remove the front panel, you must disconnect the IN USE light by prying off the retaining ring (see figure 5). Then, from the front of the panel, gently push the light through the socket. Finally, unscrew the retaining screws on each side of the front panel (see figure 6).

Mechanical Adjustments

The most common adjustments the mechanical assembly requires involve the speed control, the write-protect switch, and radial alignment.

To correct the radial alignment, you need a special alignment disk and an oscilloscope, which is beyond the scope of this article. You can determine whether the radical alignment is cor-

rect or not by using a diagnostic program, though.

The write-protect switch must be in the path of a disk inserted into the disk drive. You can correct the position of the switch by adjusting the screws that hold it in place (see figure 6).

Speed Control

Speed control is the most common adjustment your disk drive may require. You will need a speed-diagnostic program, such as Locksmith, AP Test, or Disk II Test, to display your disk-drive speed and assist you in adjusting the speed of your drive. Several other commercial speed-diagnostic programs are available, from such firms as Nikrom, Dymek, and Verbatim. Speed-diagnostic disks may also be available from users' groups. Follow the manufacturers' instructions for their disk-speed diagnostics. For all Apple speed diagnostics, you'll need an extra disk that is not write-protected. Do not use your good DOS backup disk, though. If your disk is not write-protected, but you get a write-protect error when trying the test, you may have a bad analog card.

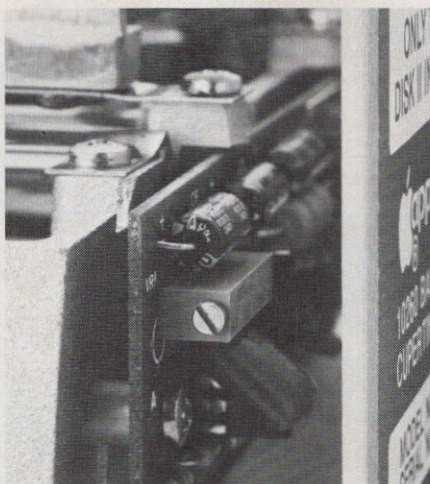


Figure 7: The disk-drive speed-adjustment screw is located inside the disk drive on the right side, in the rear. Using a speed-diagnostic program to display the speed of your drive, adjust the screw until the speed of the drive is within tolerance.

The Apple disk-drive speed-adjustment screw is located inside the disk drive, which means you'll have to remove the drive cover. Use a very small, flat screwdriver to adjust the speed (see figure 7).

Some newer drives such as the Micro-Sci Model A2 have a speed control that you can get at without removing the drive cover.

Common Mechanical Problems

Here are the obvious mechanical problems to look for:

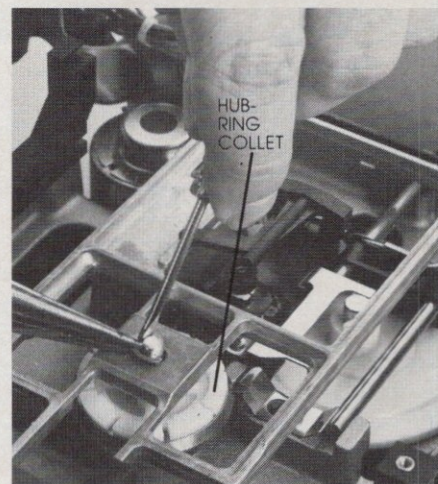


Figure 8: To replace the hub-ring collet or spring, remove the C ring, using a screwdriver and needle-nose pliers.

1. Hub-ring collet—This ring may not clamp down securely on the diskette. Look for a weak clamping action due to a defective spring or door arm. To replace the hub-ring collet or spring, remove the C ring, using a screwdriver and needle-nose pliers (see figures 8 and 9).

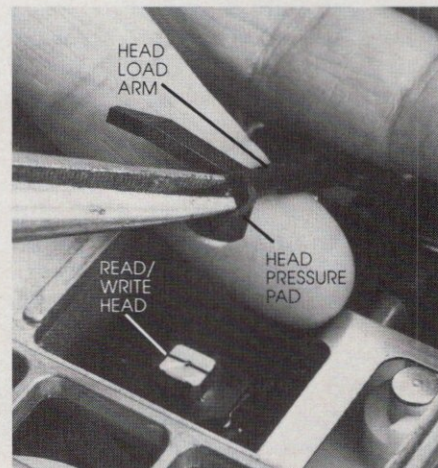


Figure 10: You can easily replace the head-pressure pad by squeezing the clip and pulling the head-load pad out of its holder.

2. Head pressure pad—The pad may be crooked, worn out, or dirty, causing speed variations or scratching of the diskette. Use caution when checking the pressure pad, since you can damage the head load arm if you pull it up and back. The pressure pad is easy to replace by squeezing the clip and pulling the head load pad out of its holder. Then press a new pad into place, making sure it snaps securely into position (see figure 10).

3. Write-protect switch—A bad drive often causes write-protect errors. The write-protect switch is hardly ever the

► PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE

Preventive maintenance for disk drives divides into four main areas: cleaning the controller card and integrated-circuit chip contacts, cleaning the read/write head, checking and possibly replacing the head pressure pad, and checking and possibly adjusting the disk-drive's speed.

Contact Cleaning

The contacts on the disk-drive controller card often become oxidized or build up an insulating layer of film, causing a poor connection and requiring contact cleaning. Contamination may also appear on the thin leads on the integrated-circuit chips.

To clean the controller card, burnish each contact gently, using a soft, non-abrasive eraser, rubbing lengthwise along the contacts or "piano keys." Remove any eraser residue with denatured

alcohol. You can use the same technique for chips, cleaning each lead, one by one.

Cleaning the Read/Write Head

Commercial head-cleaning kits are available. One alternative is simply to use a foam swab (available from Radio Shack) and denatured alcohol. Following the procedures we covered earlier in the article, disassemble the disk drive and lift the analog board to gain access to the read/write head and the pressure pad. Gently swab the head, rubbing from front to back. Make sure the head is dry before the pressure pad touches the head again. Check the load pad and replace it if necessary, as explained earlier (see figure 10).

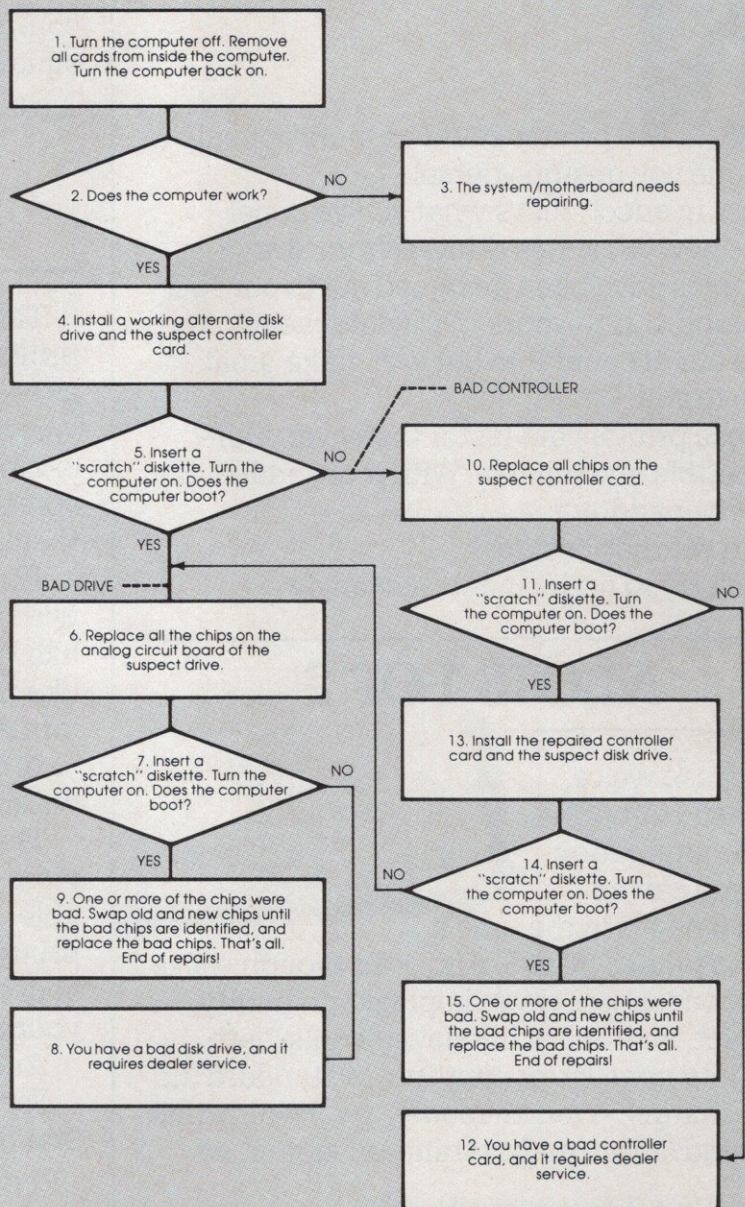

culprit, though. If you suspect the switch, make sure you hear a click when you insert your test diskette. Use an ohmmeter to check whether the switch is working or not.

Do not use lubricants! The drive contains nothing that needs lubricating at all. The motors and spindle shaft are lubricated in the factory, and, unless the drive is completely disassembled, the lubrication points are inaccessible.

Drive Noise

Most drive noise is a result of the mechanical structure of the drive and the action of the motor. It does not necessarily mean that the drive mechanism is bad.

Dive In

Now, gather together all the tools that you will need, roll up your sleeves, and take a deep breath. Good luck in all of your drive-doctoring efforts! **+**

RAPID-FIRE TRIVIA

As 1985 rolls along, it's becoming more and more evident that trivia games are here to stay—at least for another year or so. The second year of the craze has brought heightened competition to the trivia-game marketplace. No longer is it enough merely to have a lot of obscure questions covering a variety of arcane subjects. Now—as what character said in what famous movie musical?—“you’ve gotta have a gimmick.”

PQ: The Party Quiz Game does. Many games have chosen specialization as their gimmick—whole

sets of questions dedicated to America's space effort or ancient Etruscan sports—but PQ's unique feature is its approach to the mechanics of the question-and-answer process.

The package boasts that PQ “frees players from computer keyboard captivity.” The game comes with four four-button, hand-held controllers that you can easily connect to any Apple II system. The number of controllers limits PQ sessions to a maximum of four players. Another option is to have two teams of two players each.

Where the granddaddy of them all, Trivial Pursuit, can often turn into an all-evening affair, with players

mulling over each question for minutes (or even hours), PQ is fast—and I mean *fast*. The game's response-time option lists only four choices: three seconds, four seconds, five seconds, or ten seconds.

Other options are number of rounds: 5, 8, 12, 16, or 20; competitive or social: only the first correct response counts, or all correct responses are worth points; and handicapping, which cuts in half the amount of time a certain player has to answer.

Once you've dealt with these options, the game begins. PQ's questions are posed in a multiple-choice format; for example, What is the commonest sur-



name in the world:

- 1) Smith
- 2) Chang
- 3) Jones
- 4) Rogers

Players quickly press the number of the correct response (2—surely you didn't fall for Jones or Smith) on their controllers and are rewarded with noises, points, and the continuance of the game. The action is fast and furious, and therein lies the game's charm—or flaw, depending on your point of view.

If the excitement of rapid-fire questioning appeals to you, PQ is your game. If one of your favorite aspects of trivia gaming is the leisurely discussion time between questions, however, you may find PQ somewhat daunting—and if you are a slow reader, forget it!

Players with any sort of

vision problem comprise another group that might easily find PQ tough going. The questions' display font is rather broad and can be hard to read, especially quickly. A perfect example of this from play was when I thought I saw the true/false statement "Male horses have no teeth." What a ridiculous question, I thought to myself; *all* horses have teeth. Clearly the answer was *false*. When the computer indicated that my response was wrong, I was incredulous—until I examined the screen a little more closely and realized that the operative phrase was *40 teeth*.

Still, if you or any of your friends spent a significant portion of your youth watching "Jeopardy" and dreaming of actually participating, PQ may be the

closest thing around to fulfillment of that dream.

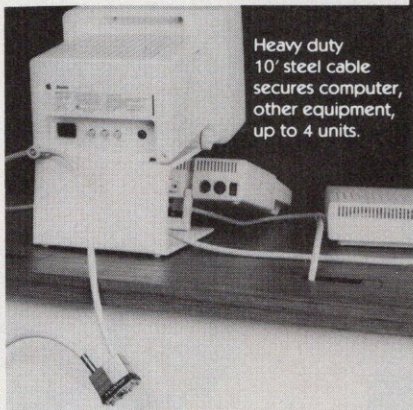

of interest; and more. The manual's text is easy to understand and illustrated with many cartoons to help lay people relax with this not-so-simple topic.

I had fun directing the cursor over the screen, entering a robot's body, fiddling with my toolkit, and forming circuits of greater and greater complexity. One feature allowed me to set up a sample maze to test a robot's function. I found I could debug a wrongheaded robot or enhance and build upon a successful model. In

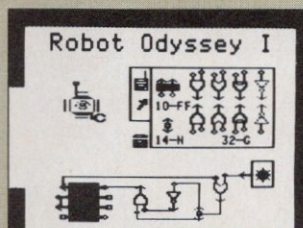
fact, I could experiment to my heart's content! In the course of the game, creativity and flexibility were the most rewarding keys to success.

Nothing's perfect, of course. The size of the screen figures do not conform to scale. For example, the cursor almost matches a robot's size, but once you're inside the mechanism's interior, the dimensions magically expand. Another example: Moving inside a robot's eye produces a "bird's eye" view of the robot and surroundings, which counters reality, since activating a robot's eye from within should not result in seeing one's own mechanical self from above. These distractions are only minor, however.

Younger players may require extra patience and the

ability to follow directions in the initial tutorial stages; you must master the various sequences of robot design to handle the later game. Users who enjoy learning and logic and who can adhere to serious, painstaking detail should benefit the most from Robot Odyssey I.

The mode of play in the game section of the disk is basically in an adventure



format, since you must collect items to aid you in your quest, encounter changing scenery, and solve different dilemmas. 'Tain't easy! Only hearty, alert, and in-

telligent persons need apply.

The graphics are colorful, the sound lively, and the animation fast-paced. You have the option of using a joystick, keyboard, or mouse. You can save and restore a game if you have access to a second disk.

Players 13 years or older who relish exercising their gray matter and who enjoy absorbing, lengthy adventure games should appreciate this software package.

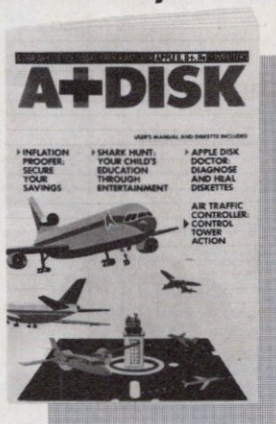

PARLOR PSYCHOLOGY

Mind Prober is a fascinating program that I found enjoyable, as long as my friends and I did not take its conclusions too seriously.

It is fascinating because it claims to reveal the hidden thoughts of friends and associates. It asks simple questions and then draws some complex and far-reaching conclusions about the subject's personality. The Mind Prober report tells you how the subject deals with relationships, stress, sex (if over 18), and school (if under 18) and then sums it all up with a few sentences on what makes the subject tick.

It is ridiculously easy to use. Simply start the program and begin responding to a list of 79 words, such as

conservative, religious, or sincere. Your task is to agree or disagree that each term describes the person in question. You may not be quite sure what *conservative* means in the context of the program, and you'll often wish you could rank your subject on a scale of 1 to 10. The words *agree* or *disagree* don't always give you enough sliding room. If you're confused about the meaning of a word, a helpful appendix to the documentation defines them for you. If you see all sorts of gray areas between *agree* and *disagree*, that's tough. You must choose one or the other.

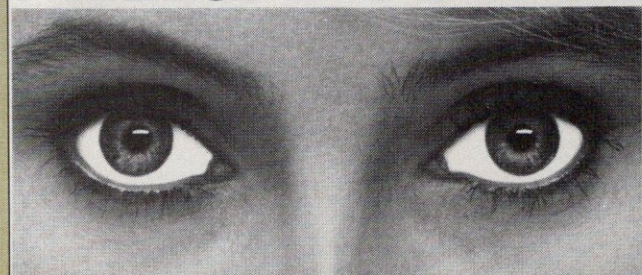
That's it. Once you've reacted to all the words, you get a brief description (usually about 15 to 20 sentences) of the person. The descriptions don't mince

words. I ran the Mind Prober on a dozen friends and associates and then showed them the results. I found that the subjects often felt that most of the conclusions were correct. In fact, sometimes the assess-

could make such sweeping (and accurate) judgments with nothing but a relatively few descriptive adjectives. At other times, however, the assessments seemed so far afield that they were laughable.

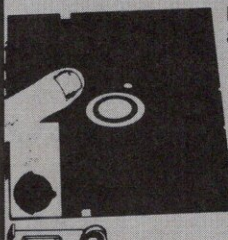

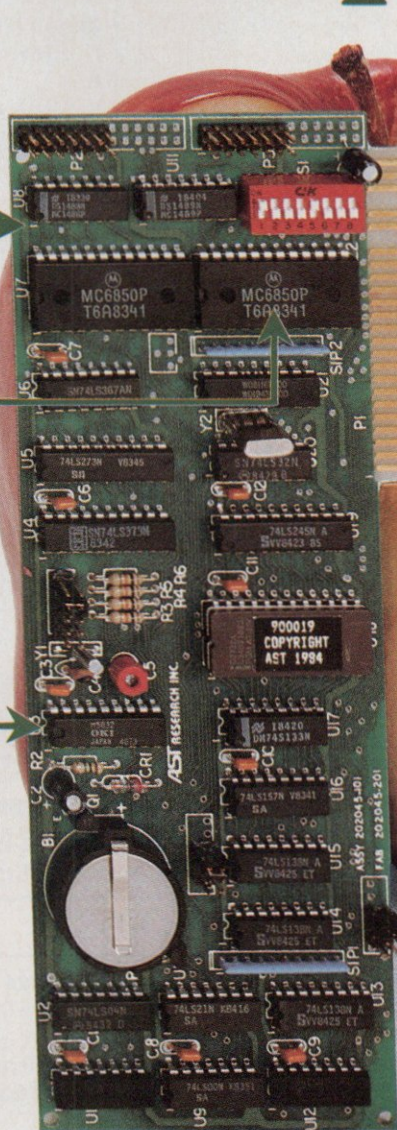

blurb on the back of the Mind Prober manual reads, "In less than 20 minutes you can find out everything about how a particular person thinks... what their strengths and weaknesses are... the kinds of relationships they form... their sensitivity to stress... and their sexual interests. You can scientifically find out who they are and where they're coming from."

The manual suggests that you use Mind Prober to help you "prepare for a sales call or an important interview" and goes on to recommend its use before contract negotiations or other important meetings. In a personal setting, it is supposed to provide insights "into the motives and behaviors of your family and friends." The documenta-

tion claims that "now you can accurately assess someone you've known for only five minutes."

joking, kind, independent, passive, playful, precise, responsible, or sincere—to mention just a few attributes—in five minutes. In fact, I had difficulty mak-

ing those kinds of judgments about people I had known and worked with for five years—but then, maybe I hadn't studied the manual long enough.

Perhaps if I really probed those 88 pages devoted to suggestions on "reading others," I could accurately know all these things about a person I had known for just five minutes.

Mind Prober is subject to the oldest rule of computing: garbage in, garbage out. What you seem to be getting is a generalized reflection on how *you* perceive your subject. 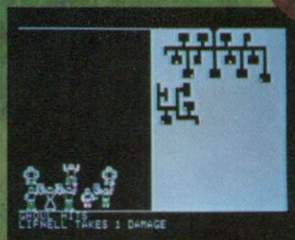

Conclusions can be pretty unflattering.

on years of training and professional experience.

With those cautions in mind, I found myself using Mind Prober—and enjoying it—as a parlor game. Used in the spirit of friendship and fun, it seems reasonably harmless, but its conclusions can be pretty direct and unflattering.

I do wonder how a person with serious problems would react to an unflattering Mind Prober test. Because the test results come from a computer, an aura of unfailing accuracy and

mystery accompanies them. What's more, two of the people associated with the program hold doctoral degrees in psychology, and a third is a medical doctor. The combination of computer "expertise" and the academic credentials behind the development of the program make the Mind Prober reports appear like pronouncements from on high.

I'll leave the evaluation of the program's usefulness to the common sense judgment of its users and the assessments of professional psychologists. As for me, my money stays in my pocket. After all, in three separate assessments of me, the Mind Prober failed to report a key trait. It never once described me as skeptical, but I am.

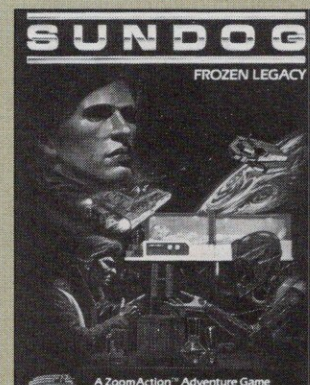

trading—and show a profit, too. You're going to have to learn star-ship maintenance and repair, as well as how to manage finances, weaponry, medical supplies, food stores, fuel supplies, your personal safety, and your health. You will also have to learn how to pilot a star ship, both sublight and warp-drive. (Your uncle forgot to leave you the instructions.) Meanwhile, muggers inhabit the cities, and pirates roam the skies. A word of caution: Try not to get too attached to your character—you'll probably kill him off a few times before you get the hang of surviving.

gin to happen. It seems as though Rama's crew is waking up...

The game comes in a handsome package—as all the Trillium games do—but *Rendezvous with Rama* has the most stunning artwork of them all. The cover of the folder shows Rama approaching the planet Earth. When you open the folder, you see Rama from the bridge of the *Endeavor*. Open the folder again, and you are looking at a panoramic four-panel spread that shows the vast interior of Rama—her cities, her fields, her great circular river, and her gigantic engines. It's breathtaking.

But what about the game...?

The Trillium games are supposed to be adventure games with pictures—except at certain points they

become arcade-style video games. Indeed, that may be their biggest problem. The

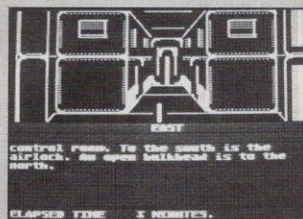

You start out as the captain of the spaceship *Endeavor*. You can find the bridge of your ship in your first three moves, but as soon as you get there, you are told by your technical sergeant that you will have to land the ship on Rama. You therefore type LAND, and the game tells you to insert disk B in the drive.

There is no disk B; there are two disks with sides labeled

1, 2, 3, and 4. Assuming they mean side 2, flip the disk over. It boots up a (rather crude) arcade-style video game. Your ship is at the lower left corner, and Rama is in the upper right. A stream of meteors streaks diagonally across your path. Your job is to play Frogger, and the meteors play the part of traffic.



Unable to get past the meteors, I could go no further in the game. Unfortunately, nobody I know can get past the meteors. My 19-year-old nephew gave up after two hours. I gave up after three days. (I hear the

legendary kid from Jersey who scored three million points on *Asteroids* is still trying.) Even if you can get to the second screen of the docking game, the program doesn't seem to recognize a landing.

There may be a terrific adventure game here, but the arcade game won't let you get to it. That's too bad because it really does look like it could be fun.

If you could just get past the darned meteors.

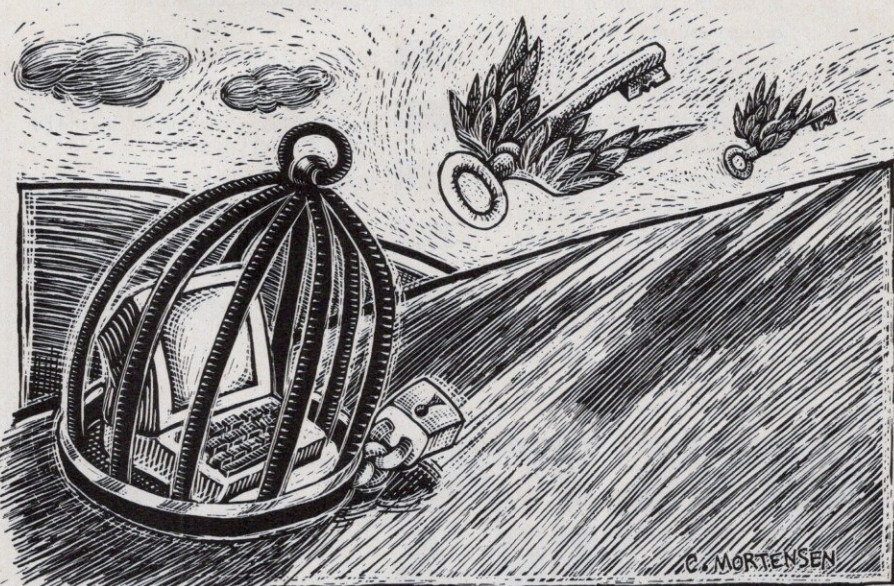
► PRINTING FROM MOUSEPAINT

Q. *I am enjoying my AppleMouse II and MousePaint, but I am having difficulty getting hard copy. The program supports only the Apple Dot-Matrix and Imagewriter printers. How can I get a printout? Can I get a color printout?*

A. The number of Apple-compatible printers and interface cards makes graphics printouts, or “dumps,” a programmer’s nightmare. Apple chose to support only its products, but don’t despair. You *can* print MousePaint graphics by saving the screen to disk, quitting MousePaint, and then using a graphics-dump program. MousePaint uses ProDOS-formatted data disks, so the graphics-dump program must be able to read ProDOS files. Triple Dump from Beagle Bros. is one of the more popular ProDOS graphics-dump programs. Check to be sure that ProDOS, your printer, and your printer-interface card are supported by the graphics-dump program.

Color is another story. The new Apple Scribe printer does print in color—as do several other, more expensive printers. You’ll need a program to convert the screen pixels into printer pixels of the correct color. Currently, we know of no ProDOS color-dump program. To print your MousePaint pictures in color, you must first convert them to DOS 3.3 format, using the utility on the ProDOS User’s Disk or Apple IIc System Utilities Disk. Once in DOS 3.3 format, the program can read the picture and send the correct information to your printer.

If you don’t have a color printer, but you still want color, check out Color Printer from Enhanced Software Products. This program lets you make a col-



or dump on a standard Epson, Gemini, or Apple Dot-Matrix printer. (See “You Can Print a Rainbow,” in the June 1984 issue of *A+*, pages 62–64.)

► EXPAND QUICKFILE WORK SPACE

Q. *I have an Apple IIe with an Extended 80-Column Card. I have been working with QuickFile to set up a filing system for a large number of records (almost 700). When I had entered a little more than 600 records, the program reported that it had run out of room. I ended up splitting the file, A-M and N-Z, to accomplish my goal. Now I have to do everything twice—sort, print reports, and so on. Is there any way I can extend the QuickFile work space to accommodate more records?*

A. Your problem is that QuickFile operates totally within the available RAM. (Ditto, incidentally, for AppleWorks.) Some other database systems, DB Master for example, oper-

ate on disk files and store only small portions of the data in RAM. One solution, then, is to switch to a disk-based database system. Couple a disk-based program with a hard disk and you have a very powerful database-management system. On the other hand, your data will probably need to be reentered into the new program, and a hard disk is not inexpensive. There is a less drastic solution, however: increase your computer’s RAM.

The Apple Extended 80-Column Card contains 64K of memory, bringing your Apple to a total of 128K RAM. Although the 6502 microprocessor can use only 64K of memory at a time, it is possible to use extra memory on the Extended 80-Column Card for data or for program segments. QuickFile and AppleWorks already do this. An 80-column card with 128K should effectively double the capacity of these programs and allow QuickFile to accept all of your data. Although Apple does not market such a card, several

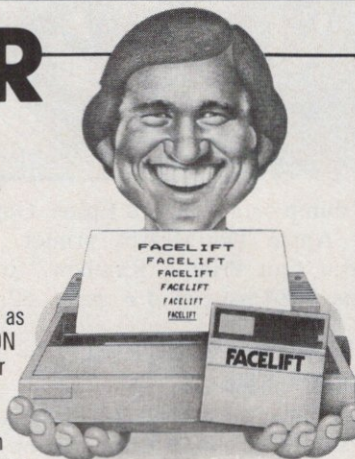

other manufacturers do (see "The Endless Apple," A+, March 1985).

Remember that programs must be written especially to utilize this extra memory; the extra memory will lie idle most of the time. Don't confuse the "extended extended" 80-column cards and disk emulators or print buffers. Disk emulators (such as the Flashcard) and print buffers (such as the MicroFazer) also contain extra memory, but the RAM is not directly accessible to the 6502. On the other hand, with the proper software, the extra RAM on the Extended 80-Column Cards can be used as a disk emulator or a print buffer when it isn't being used with QuickFile or AppleWorks.

▶ TYPEWRITER INTERFACE

Q. I have a typewriter that connects to a computer for use as a printer. How do I connect it, and will it work the way a regular computer printer does?

A. If your typewriter already has communications capabilities, you need only a cable to connect it to the Apple, and an interface card for your Apple. If your typewriter has a parallel interface, you need an Apple Parallel Interface Card or compatible card. Because your typewriter does not have graphics capabilities, you should not buy a Grappler, Pkaso, or other graphics interface. If you have a serial connection on the typewriter, you'll need a serial-interface card.

With an Apple IIc, you can connect serial devices only, unless you have a serial-to-parallel converter. IIc owners also need a serial cable with a round DIN connector on one end. A knowledgeable dealer should be able to get—or build—a cable for you.

You should install the printer card in slot 1 of your Apple; it can be activated with PR#1. Application software will use the typewriter as if it were a computer printer—with one important difference: it will be slow. Most dot-matrix printers operate between 80 and 160 characters per second (CPS). Your typewriter will creep along at less than 15 CPS. Furthermore, the mechanism of a typewriter is not geared to the relentless flow of information from a computer and may not withstand very heavy use. For this reason, we do not recommend adapting IBM Selectric or other standard typewriters for computer use. +

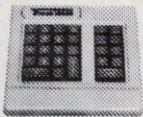

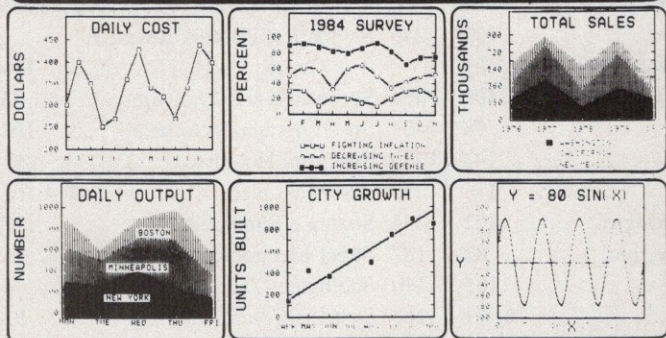

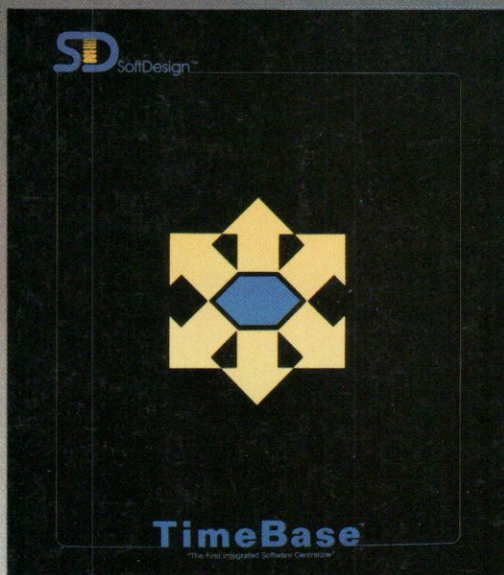
